**CS/CS/HB 449** by Judiciary Committee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Michael, Bankson, Redondo (Similar CS/SB 1764)

**Motor Vehicle Racing Penalties;** Increases fine for specified offenses; increases criminal penalty & revising applicability of criminal penalty for second offenses of specified violations occurring within specified time period; provides penalties for impeding, obstructing, or interfering with an emergency vehicle while participating in drag race, street takeover, stunt driving, competition, contest, test, or exhibition; increases penalty for third or subsequent offenses of specified violations occurring within specified time period; increases fine for such violations; increases fine for acting as spectator at specified violations. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

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**CS/CS/HB 735** by State Affairs Committee, Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee, Andrade (Similar CS/CS/SB 734)

**Government Accountability;** Prohibits individuals from soliciting or accepting anything of value from foreign country of concern; establishing registration requirements; requiring the commission to make lobbyist registrations available to the public on its website; prohibiting the governing body of a county from renewing or extending the employment contract of the county attorney during a specified timeframe; etc. Effective Date: January 1, 2025

Read second time and amended March 1

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**CS/CS/SB 1456** by Finance and Tax, Community Affairs, Rodriguez (Similar CS/CS/CS/HB 1297, Compare CS/HB 7073)

**Counties Designated as Areas of Critical State Concern;** Adding certain requirements to local comprehensive plans relating to a hurricane evacuation study; revising the powers of the land authority; excluding land designated as an area of critical state concern within a specified timeframe from award requirements made to specified sponsors or persons for the purpose of providing eligible housing as a part of a local housing assistance plan; requiring that the expenditure of certain funds be subject to approval by a majority vote of the board of county commissioners of an eligible county, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/CS/SB 1704** by Rules, Community Affairs, Yarborough (Similar CS/CS/HB 1447)

**Sheriffs in Consolidated Governments;** Authorizing sheriffs in a consolidated government, as well as all other sheriffs, to transfer funds after their budgets are approved by the board of county commissioners, city council, or budget commission, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 474** by Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Grall, Book (Identical CS/HB 529)

**Public Records/Suicide Victims;** Defining the term “suicide of a person”; creating an exemption from public records requirements for a photograph or video or audio recording of the suicide of a person; providing exceptions; requiring that any viewing, copying, listening to, or other handling of such photograph or video or audio recording be under the direct supervision of the custodian of the record or his or her designee; creating an exemption from public records requirements for autopsy reports of suicide victims; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemption; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 7008** by Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Regulated Industries, Hooper (Identical HB 7045)

**OGSR/Department of the Lottery;** Amending a provision relating to an exemption from public records requirements for certain information held by the Department of the Lottery, information about lottery games, personal identifying information of retailers and vendors for purposes of background checks, and certain financial information held by the department; providing for future legislative review and repeal of an exemption from public records requirements for information relating to the security of certain technologies, processes, and practices; removing the scheduled repeal of an exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 7006 by Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Regulated Industries, Hooper** (Identical HB 7047)

**OGSR/Utility Owned or Operated by a Unit of Local Government;** Amending a provision which provides exemptions from public record requirements for information related to the security of certain technology, processes, practices, information technology systems, industrial control technology systems, and customer meter-derived data and billing information held by a utility owned or operated by a unit of local government; extending the date of scheduled repeal of public record exemptions relating to the security of certain technology, processes, practices, information technology systems, and industrial control technology systems; amending a provision which provides an exemption from public meeting requirements for meetings held by a utility owned or operated by a unit of local government which would reveal certain information; extending the date of scheduled repeal of the exemption, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**SB 522 by Simon** (Identical HB 501)

**Tallahassee Community College;** Renaming the college as “Tallahassee State College”, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/CS/SB 494 by Military and Veterans Affairs, Space, and Domestic Security, Education Postsecondary, Avila, Perry, Collins** (Similar CS/CS/HB 511)

**Graduate Program Admissions;** Requiring an institution of higher education to waive certain examination requirements for a servicemember or a person who served in the United States Armed Forces, the Florida National Guard, or the United States Reserve Forces and was discharged or released under any condition other than dishonorable and who applies for admission to a graduate program that requires such examination, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time and amended March 4

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**SB 832 by Calatayud** (Identical HB 1137)

**Employment of Individuals with Disabilities;** Requiring the collection and sharing of data between multiple agencies for the interagency cooperative agreement under the Employment First Act; requiring the Office of Reimagining Education and Career Help to issue an annual statewide report by a specified date each year, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**SB 1688 by Osgood, Yarborough, Hutson, Simon, Book** (Identical HB 553)

**Career-themed Courses;** Revising the requirements for a specified school district strategic plan to include certain information; requiring the Department of Education to include specified data in an annual review of K-12 and postsecondary career and technical education offerings, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 998 by Fiscal Policy, Collins** (Identical CS/HB 815)

**Sale of Liquefied Petroleum Gas;** Requiring certain remote bulk storage locations to comply with specified requirements; providing a condition under which the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services may deny, refuse to renew, suspend, or revoke a qualifier or master qualifier registration; authorizing the department to condemn unsafe equipment and issue certain orders requiring the immediate removal of liquefied petroleum gas from certain storage; requiring persons servicing, testing, repairing, maintaining, or installing liquefied petroleum gas equipment and systems to include specified information on all work orders, invoices, and similar documents, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 1082 by Rules, Collins** (Similar CS/CS/HB 1051)

**Housing for Legally Verified Agricultural Workers;** Defining the terms “legally verified agricultural worker” and “housing site”; prohibiting a governmental entity from adopting or enforcing any legislation to inhibit the construction of housing for legally verified agricultural workers on agricultural land operated as a bona fide farm; authorizing governmental entities to adopt local land use regulations that are less restrictive; authorizing the continued use of housing sites constructed before the effective date of the act if certain conditions are met, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 1532 by Rules, Community Affairs, Environment and Natural Resources, Brodeur** (Similar CS/CS/HB 1073)

**Mitigation;** Defining the term “applicant”; revising the entities to whom and purposes for which water quality enhancement credits may be sold; requiring the Department of Environmental Protection or water management districts to authorize the sale and use of such credits to applicants, rather than to governmental entities, to address adverse water quality impacts of certain activities; authorizing local governments with land in credit-deficient basins to consider bids from private-sector applicants to establish mitigation banks on such lands, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/CS/SB 1136 by Rules, Community Affairs, Trumbull** (Similar CS/CS/HB 1163)

**Regulation of Water Resources;** Revising the qualification requirements a person must meet in order to take the water well contractor license examination; authorizing certain authorities who have been delegated enforcement powers by water management districts to apply disciplinary guidelines adopted by the districts; prohibiting a person or business entity from advertising water well drilling or construction services in specified circumstances; providing that the Department of Environmental Protection’s variance review and advisory committee is not responsible for reviewing water well permitting, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 1638 by Fiscal Policy, Hutson** (Similar CS/CS/HB 1417, Compare HB 7083)

**Funding for Environmental Resource Management;** Requiring the Department of Revenue to deposit into the Indian Gaming Revenue Trust Fund within the Department of Financial Services a specified percentage of the revenue share payments received under the gaming compact between the Seminole Tribe of Florida and the State of Florida; creating the Local Trail Management Grant Program within the Department of Environmental Protection for a specified purpose; authorizing the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission to enter into voluntary agreements with private landowners for environmental services within the Florida wildlife corridor, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law if SB 7080 or similar legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

Read second time March 4

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**SB 7080 by Appropriations** (Identical HB 7083, Compare CS/CS/HB 1417)

**Trust Funds/Indian Gaming Revenue Clearing Trust Fund/Department of Financial Services;** Creating the Indian Gaming Revenue Clearing Trust Fund within the Department of Financial Services; providing that the trust fund is exempt from a certain service charge; exempting the trust fund from certain termination provisions, etc. Effective Date: On the same date that SB 1638 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes a law

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 7040 by Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, Environment and Natural Resources, Harrell, Mayfield** (Similar CS/HB 7053)

**Ratification of the Department of Environmental Protection’s Rules Relating to Stormwater;** Ratifying a specified rule relating to environmental resource permitting for the sole and exclusive purpose of satisfying any condition on effectiveness pursuant to s. 120.541(3), F.S., which requires ratification of any rule exceeding the specified thresholds for likely adverse impact or increase in regulatory costs; ratifying rule 62-330.010, Florida Administrative Code, with specified changes; requiring that specified future amendments to such rule be submitted in bill form to, and approved by, the Legislature, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 168 by Health Policy, Polsky** (Identical CS/HB 499)

**Congenital Cytomegalovirus Screenings;** Requiring certain hospitals to administer congenital cytomegalovirus screenings on newborns admitted to the hospital under specified circumstances; providing coverage under the Medicaid program for the screenings and any medically necessary follow-up reevaluations; requiring that newborns diagnosed with congenital cytomegalovirus be referred to a primary care physician for medical management, treatment, and follow-up services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**SB 938 by Yarborough** (Identical HB 547)

**Dentistry;** Deleting the role of the Board of Dentistry in the administration of the licensure examination for dentists; deleting the requirement for the board to establish an examination fee; revising requirements for licensure as a dentist; deleting a time limitation on the validity of certain licensure examination results; deleting a board-imposed reexamination fee, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 544 by Health Policy, Hutson, Berman, Book** (Similar CS/HB 581)

**Swimming Lesson Voucher Program;** Creating the program within the Department of Health for a specified purpose; requiring the department to establish a network of swimming lesson vendors to participate in the program; requiring the department or a contracted nonprofit organization to attempt to secure a vendor in each county; specifying eligibility criteria for the program, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 536 by Fiscal Policy, Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services, Children, Families, and Elder Affairs, Garcia** (Similar CS/CS/CS/HB 1061)

**Community-based Child Welfare Agencies;** Revising requirements for contracts the Department of Children and Families has with community-based care lead agencies; requiring the lead agency's board of directors to disclose to the department any known actual or potential conflicts of interest; prohibiting a lead agency from entering into a contract or being a party to any transaction with related parties if a conflict of interest is not properly disclosed; requiring the contract with the department and the lead agency to specify the administrative functions that the lead agency may subcontract, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time and amended March 4

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**CS/SB 758 by Judiciary, Martin** (Similar CS/HB 401)

**Tracking Devices and Applications;** Prohibiting the placement or use of a tracking device or tracking application to determine the location or movement of another person or another person's property without that person's consent; revising exceptions; providing criminal penalties, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 678 by Criminal Justice, Bradley** (Similar CS/HB 453)

**Forensic Investigative Genetic Genealogy Grant Program;** Defining the term "investigative genetic genealogy"; requiring that certain methods be in accordance with Department of Law Enforcement rules and compatible with certain databases; specifying the intent for certain funding; creating the Forensic Investigative Genetic Genealogy Grant Program within the Department of Law Enforcement, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 1286 by Criminal Justice, Collins** (Identical CS/HB 485)

**Return of Weapons and Arms Following an Arrest;** Requiring that weapons, electric weapons or devices, or arms taken from a person pursuant to an arrest that are not either seized as evidence or seized and subject to forfeiture be returned to the person within a certain timeframe if specified conditions are met; authorizing a sheriff or chief of police to develop procedures to ensure the timely return of such weapons, electric weapons or devices, or arms; deleting a requirement for an order of a trial court judge to return a pistol or firearm taken by an officer for a breach of the peace, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4



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**SB 7020 by Judiciary** (Similar CS/HB 513)

**Delivery of Notices;** Revising the definition of the term “registered mail” for purposes of construction of the Florida Statutes, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read second time March 4

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**CS/CS/SB 592 by Fiscal Policy, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Burgess** (Similar HB 1679)

**Historical Preservation Programs;** Requiring the Department of State to partner with the Florida African American Heritage Preservation Network for a specified purpose; specifying preservation efforts that may be undertaken through the partnership; requiring the network to submit a list of member museums to the department, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 764 by Fiscal Policy, Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, Criminal Justice, Stewart** (Similar CS/CS/HB 607)

**Retention of Sexual Offense Evidence;** Requiring that specified sexual offense evidence be retained by specified entities for a minimum number of years after the collection date; requiring that such evidence be stored anonymously in a secure, environmentally safe manner, and with a documented chain of custody; providing requirements for the transferring, storing, and destruction of such sexual offense evidence, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 1616 by Judiciary, Calatayud** (Identical CS/HB 1443)

**Electronic Access to Official Records;** Requiring the county recorder or clerk of the court to make certain information publicly available through a searchable database on the county recorder’s or clerk of the court’s official website; authorizing such requirement to be satisfied by providing a stand-alone link to the official records index, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 86 by Fiscal Policy, Appropriations Committee on Criminal and Civil Justice, Judiciary, Book, Polsky, Yarborough** (Similar CS/CS/HB 45)

**Hope Cards for Persons Issued Orders of Protection;** Requiring the clerks of the circuit court, in consultation with the Office of the Attorney General, to develop and implement the Hope Card Program; requiring clerks’ offices to create a Hope Card and provide such card to petitioners within a specified time frame; providing criminal penalties for the fraudulent use of a Hope Card, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**SB 158 by Polsky** (Identical HB 29)

**Value of Motor Vehicles Exempt from Legal Process;** Increasing the value of a motor vehicle owned by a natural person which is exempt from legal process, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 366 by Appropriations Committee on Agriculture, Environment, and General Government, Yarborough** (Similar CS/HB 81)

**Civil Penalties Under the Gas Safety Law of 1967;** Increasing, until a specified date, the civil penalty amount for violating the Gas Safety Law of 1967; increasing the maximum authorized civil penalty for any related series of violations during such timeframe; requiring the Florida Public Service Commission, after a date certain and at least annually thereafter, to establish and, if necessary, revise maximum penalties by rule based on specified factors, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/CS/SB 532 by Fiscal Policy, Banking and Insurance, Brodeur** (Similar CS/CS/HB 311)

**Securities;** Revising the list of securities that are exempt from registration requirements under certain provisions; revising provisions relating to a certain registration exemption for certain securities transactions; updating the federal laws or regulations with which the offer or sale of securities must be in compliance; requiring that offers and sales of securities be in accordance with certain federal laws and rules; providing that registration exemptions under certain provisions are not available to issuers for certain transactions under specified circumstances; specifying criteria for determining integration of offerings for the purpose of registration or qualifying for a registration exemption; specifying the purpose of the Securities Guaranty Fund, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 478 by Regulated Industries, Rodriguez** (Identical CS/CS/HB 551)

**Designation of Eligible Telecommunications Carriers;** Revising the definition of the term “eligible telecommunications carrier”; authorizing the Public Service Commission to designate certain entities as eligible telecommunications carriers for a specified purpose, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read second time March 4

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**CS/CS/CS/SB 382 by Rules, Governmental Oversight and Accountability, Regulated Industries, Hooper** (Similar CS/HB 497)

**Continuing Education Requirements;** Requiring, rather than authorizing, a board, or the Department of Business and Professional Regulation when there is no board, to allow by rule that distance learning may be used to satisfy continuing education requirements; revising the requirements that such continuing education must satisfy; requiring a board, or the department when there is no board, to exempt certain individuals from completing their continuing education requirements, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**SB 304 by Hooper** (Similar CS/HB 367)

**Household Moving Services;** Revising requirements for mover and moving broker estimates, contracts, and advertisements; prohibiting certain persons from operating as or holding themselves out to be a mover or moving broker without first registering with the department; revising alternative insurance coverage requirements for movers; requiring moving brokers to make a specified disclosure to shippers before providing any services, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 968 by Rules, Calatayud, Trumbull** (Similar CS/HB 577)

**Spaceport Territory;** Revising the definition of “spaceport discretionary capacity improvement projects”; revising spaceport territory to include certain property; authorizing the Department of Transportation to fund spaceport discretionary capacity improvement projects if important access and on-spaceport-territory space transportation capacity improvements are provided, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/CS/SB 902 by Commerce and Tourism, Banking and Insurance, Boyd** (Similar CS/CS/HB 605)

**Motor Vehicle Retail Financial Agreements;** Revising the definition of the term “guaranteed asset protection product”; requiring entities to refund the portions of the purchase price of the contract for a guaranteed asset protection product under certain circumstances; creating the "Florida Vehicle Value Protection Agreements Act"; authorizing the offer, sale, or gift of vehicle value protection agreements in compliance with a certain act, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/CS/SB 808 by Appropriations, Criminal Justice, DiCeglie, Stewart, Osgood, Powell, Polsky, Hooper** (Identical CS/CS/HB 637)

**Treatment by a Medical Specialist;** Authorizing firefighters, law enforcement officers, correctional officers, and correctional probation officers to receive medical treatment by a medical specialist for certain conditions under certain circumstances; requiring firefighters, law enforcement officers, correctional officers, and correctional probation officers to notify certain entities of their selection of a medical specialist, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**SB 1078 by DiCeglie** (Similar CS/HB 991)

**Public Records/Cellular Telephone Numbers Held by the Department of Financial Services;** Providing an exemption from public records requirements for cellular telephone numbers relating to records of certain insurance-related licensures held by the Department of Financial Services; providing for future legislative review and repeal of the exemptions; providing a statement of public necessity, etc. Effective Date: Upon becoming a law

Read second time March 4

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**SB 92 by Hooper** (Similar CS/HB 95)

**Yacht and Ship Brokers' Act;** Revising the definition of the term "yacht"; exempting a person who conducts business as a broker or salesperson in another state from licensure in this state for specified transactions; requiring, rather than authorizing, the Division of Florida Condominiums, Timeshares, and Mobile Homes of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation to deny licenses for applicants who fail to meet certain requirements, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2024

Read second time and amended March 4

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**CS/CS/SB 1198 by Rules, Commerce and Tourism, Martin** (Similar CS/HB 1189)

**Corporate Actions;** Providing that a defective corporate action is not void or voidable in certain circumstances; requiring the board of directors to take certain action to ratify a defective corporate action; providing quorum and voting requirements for the ratification of certain defective corporate actions; requiring that notice be given to shareholders of certain corporate action taken by the board of directors; providing that notice is not required for holders of certain shares whose identities or addresses for notice cannot be determined, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

Read second time March 4

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**CS/SB 1142 by Fiscal Policy, Hooper** (Similar CS/HB 1579)

**Occupational Licensing;** Extending the date on which certain local government occupational licensing requirements expire; extending the date by which the Construction Industry Licensing Board within the Department of Business and Professional Regulation is required to establish by rule specified certified specialty contractor categories for voluntary licensure; requiring the board to issue registrations to eligible persons under certain circumstances; providing that the board is responsible for disciplining such licensees, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

**CS/SB 186** by Health Policy, Brodeur, Pizzo, Wright, Boyd, Burgess, Rouson, Hutson, Davis, Ingolia, Garcia, Book, Stewart (Similar CS/HB 115)

**Progressive Supranuclear Palsy and Other Neurodegenerative Diseases Policy Committee**; Citing this act as the “Justo R. Cortes Progressive Supranuclear Palsy Act”; requiring the State Surgeon General to establish a progressive supranuclear palsy and other neurodegenerative diseases policy committee; requiring the Department of Health to provide staff and administrative support to the committee; providing for duties, membership, and meetings of the committee; requiring the State Surgeon General to submit a progress report and a final report by a specified date to the Governor and the Legislature, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2024

**B. PROCEDURES:**

Time allocations apply to all bills listed in Section A and any bill substituted for or taken up in lieu of a listed bill. Amendment sponsors shall have 2 minutes to open and 2 minutes to close, except as outlined below.

Except for the bills listed in Section C, the House shall spend no more than the following times:

- For each bill:
  - Questions and answers - 10 minutes
  - Debate - 5 minutes
- For each amendment:
  - Questions and answers - 5 minutes
  - Debate - 5 minutes

For all bills, along with their associated amendments, the time for questions and answers includes both the question and the answer and shall be no more than the times listed. Neither the question nor the answer shall be protracted in an attempt to use up the time.

Once more than 10 non-bill sponsor amendments are filed, the allocation of time spent on each non-bill sponsor amendment shall be determined as follows:

- 90 minutes divided by the total number of non-sponsor amendments filed.
- The time allocated for each non-bill sponsor amendment shall be divided equally between the open, questions, debate, and close.
- Amendments withdrawn prior to consideration of the bill don't count toward the total.

For the bills listed in Section C, time spent on debate shall be allocated as specified, with the time equally divided. In addition to the allotted time, the sponsor will explain and close the bill, closing not to exceed 10 minutes. After opening, the debate managers identified below (or their designee) shall be alternately recognized until their time runs out. Time not utilized is lost.

- Debate managers may speak in debate and yield time to other Members to debate; no Member may be recognized for debate unless a debate manager yields time to that Member. Recognitions of debate managers must go through the Speaker. A Member may not be recognized more than once in debate on the bill or amendment.
