HB 11 by Rudman

Invalid Restrictive Covenants with Physicians; Provides restrictive covenants which prohibit physician from practicing medicine within specified area for certain period of time are void & unenforceable. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 13 by Edmonds (Identical SB 136)

Minimum Base Salary for Full-time Teachers; Increases minimum base salary for certain teachers. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

PreK-12 Appropriations Subcommittee; Education & Employment Committee; Appropriations Committee

HB 15 by Rudman

Contracts for Live Entertainment; Prohibits entertainment venue from canceling or terminating executed contract with certain persons engaged in live entertainment. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 17 by Rudman

Expiration of the Mandatory Waiting Period for Firearms Purchases; Revises when mandatory waiting period expires. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 21 by Salzman (Identical SB 24, Compare SB 26)

Victims of Reform School Abuse; Requires person seeking certification as victim of Florida reform school abuse to apply to DOS by specified date; authorizes specified persons to apply on behalf of decedent; requires DOS to review & process application within certain timeframe; prohibits DOS from denying an application for specified reasons; requires DOS to submit list of certified victims to Legislature; provides exceptions from specified requirements for crime victim compensation eligibility for victims. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 23 by Salzman (Similar SB 26, Compare SB 24)

Pub. Rec./Reform School Abuse Victims; Provides an exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information in applications submitted to DOS by persons seeking certification as victims of Florida reform school abuse; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: on the same date that HB 21 or similar legislation takes effect

HB 25 by Edmonds

Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program; Revises student eligibility criteria for specified awards within Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 27 by Benjamin

Citizen's Arrest; Abrogates common law & prohibits citizen's arrests; provides exceptions. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 29 by Benjamin (Identical SB 158)

Value of Motor Vehicles Exempt from Legal Process; Revises upward value of motor vehicle owned by natural person that is exempt from legal process. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 31 by Edmonds (Identical SB 64)

Landlords and Tenants; Limits rent increases of certain residential tenancies to specified amount; requires certain landlords to provide functioning facilities for air-conditioning; revises required notice to tenant before landlord can terminate rental agreement; authorizes landlord to terminate rental agreement or bring action for noncompliance even if tenant provides partial payment of past due rent. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 35 by Rudman (Identical SB 106)

Acceptance of Cash Payments by Businesses; Requires certain businesses to accept cash payments for certain transactions; prohibits fees or conditions for such transactions; provides applicability & civil penalties; requires DACS to adopt rules. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 37 by Koster, Waldron

Compensation for Wrongfully Incarcerated Persons; Revises requirements for filing petition seeking compensation; provides that deceased person's heirs, successors, or assigns do not have standing to file such petition; revises requirements for eligibility for compensation, awarding compensation, & continuing appropriations. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 39 by Koster

Refusal to Submit to Breath, Urine, or Blood Test; Requires person arrested for DUI who refuses to submit to lawful test of his or her breath to be subject to mandatory placement of ignition interlock device at his or her own expense for specified period; requires certain information to be contained in notice of suspension; decreases period during which person whose driver license is suspended for failure to submit to breath, urine, or blood test is not eligible to receive license for business or employment purposes only; waives requirement for ignition interlock device under certain circumstances; directs DHSMV to require placement of ignition interlock device before issuing permanent or restricted driver license to person who refused to submit to lawful test of his or her breath. Effective Date: October 1, 2024

HB 41 by Edmonds

Mortgage Loans and Insurance Payments Grant Program; Creates within Department of Commerce grant program for mortgage loans & homeowners & motor vehicle insurance payments for Florida residents; provides funds allocation for program; requires program to be administered by department; provides eligibility amounts; provides duties of department in administering program. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 43 by Silvers, Waldron

Medicaid Behavioral Health Provider Performance; Revises provider network requirements for behavioral health providers in Medicaid program; specifies network testing requirements; requires AHCA to establish certain performance measures; requires managed care plan contract amendments by specified date; requires agency to submit annual report to Legislature. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 45 by Gottlieb (Identical SB 86)

Hope Cards for Persons Issued Orders of Protection; Requires OSCA, in consultation with others, to develop Hope Card Program; requires state courts to implement program; authorizes certain persons to apply for Hope Card after specified date; requires applications for Hope Card to be available online & in clerks' offices; requires clerks' offices to mail, by certified mail, Hope Card to petitioners within specified time frame; prohibits assessment of fee; provides requirements for Hope Card; authorizes person protected by injunction for protection issued by court of foreign state to apply for & receive Hope Card even if person does not register order for protection in this state. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 47 by Robinson, F. (Similar SB 104)

Municipal Water and Sewer Utility Rates; Requires municipality to charge customers receiving its utility services in another municipality same rates, fees, & charges as it charges consumers within its own municipal boundaries. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 49 by Chaney

Employment and Curfew of Minors; Removes certain employment restrictions for minors 16 & 17 years of age; revises age at which employment restrictions apply; prohibits counties & municipalities from adopting or enforcing certain ordinances that are more stringent than state law. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 51 by Tant, Eskamani

Art Therapy; Requires DOH to license professional art therapists & register art therapist interns if they meet specified requirements; requires art therapist intern to practice under supervision until licensed; provides for licensure by endorsement; requires board & DOH to adopt rules establishing requirements for annual renewal of professional art therapist licenses & art therapist intern registrations; provides for inactive licenses & license reactivation; provides for license denial & disciplinary action; prohibits practice of professional art therapy for compensation & use of certain titles, letters, abbreviations, & insignia without valid, active license; provides criminal penalties; exempts certain persons from licensure & registration requirements. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Ad Valorem Property Tax Exemption for the Surviving Spouse of Quadriplegics; Proposes amendment to State Constitution to authorize Legislature to provide for property tax exemption for surviving spouse of quadriplegic who was receiving property tax exemption on real estate used & owned as homestead at time of their death.

HB 55 by Tant

Tax Exemptions for Surviving Spouses of Quadriplegics; Authorizes surviving spouses of certain quadriplegics to carry over certain tax exemption in certain circumstances. Effective Date: on the effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by HJR 53, or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose

County Commissioner Term Limits; Establishes term limits for county commissioners. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 59 by Arrington (Identical SB 50)

Provision Of Homeowners' Association Rules and Covenants; Requires association to provide copies of association's rules & covenants to every member before specified date, & every new member thereafter; requires association to provide members with copy of updated rules & covenants; authorizes association to adopt rules relating to standards & manner in which such copies are distributed; authorizes association to post complete copy of association's rules & covenants, or direct link thereto, on homepage of association's website; requires association to provide specified notice to its members. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 61 by Hinson

Transportation Facility Designations; Designates Dylan Roberts Memorial Crosswalk in Alachua County; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 63 by Woodson

Protection from Surgical Smoke; Requiring hospitals & ambulatory surgical centers to adopt & implement policies requiring use of smoke evacuation systems during certain surgical procedures. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 65 by Harris, Joseph (Identical SB 52)

Anaphylaxis in Public Schools; Requires DOE to publish on its website each district school board's anaphylaxis policy; requires each district school board to adopt anaphylaxis policy; provides requirements for such policy & specified training. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Education Quality Subcommittee; PreK-12 Appropriations Subcommittee; Education & Employment Committee

HB 67 by Gottlieb

Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote; Provides for enactment of Agreement Among States to Elect President by National Popular Vote; provides method by which state may become member state; requires statewide popular election for President & Vice President of U.S.; establishes procedure for appointing presidential electors in member states; provides that agreement becomes effective upon occurrence of specified actions; provides for withdrawal of member state; requires notification of member states when agreement takes effect in nonmember state or when member state withdraws from agreement. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HJR 69 by Garcia
