**HB 11 by Rudman**

**Invalid Restrictive Covenants with Physicians;** Provides restrictive covenants which prohibit physician from practicing medicine within specified area for certain period of time are void & unenforceable. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Healthcare Regulation Subcommittee; Civil Justice Subcommittee; Health & Human Services Committee

**HB 13 by Edmonds (Identical SB 136)**

**Minimum Base Salary for Full-time Teachers;** Increases minimum base salary for certain teachers. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

PreK-12 Appropriations Subcommittee; Education & Employment Committee; Appropriations Committee

**HB 15 by Rudman**

**Contracts for Live Entertainment;** Prohibits entertainment venue from canceling or terminating executed contract with certain persons engaged in live entertainment. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Regulatory Reform & Economic Development Subcommittee; Civil Justice Subcommittee; Commerce Committee

**HB 17 by Rudman**

**Expiration of the Mandatory Waiting Period for Firearms Purchases;** Revises when mandatory waiting period expires. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Criminal Justice Subcommittee; Judiciary Committee

**HB 21 by Salzman (Identical SB 24, Compare SB 26)**

**Victims of Reform School Abuse;** Requires person seeking certification as victim of Florida reform school abuse to apply to DOS by specified date; authorizes specified persons to apply on behalf of decedent; requires DOS to review & process application within certain timeframe; prohibits DOS from denying an application for specified reasons; requires DOS to submit list of certified victims to Legislature; provides exceptions from specified requirements for crime victim compensation eligibility for victims. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**HB 23 by Salzman (Similar SB 26, Compare SB 24)**

**Pub. Rec./Reform School Abuse Victims;** Provides an exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information in applications submitted to DOS by persons seeking certification as victims of Florida reform school abuse; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: on the same date that HB 21 or similar legislation takes effect

**HB 25 by Edmonds (Identical SB 262)**

**Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program;** Revises student eligibility criteria for specified awards within Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Postsecondary Education & Workforce Subcommittee; Higher Education Appropriations Subcommittee; Education & Employment Committee

**HB 27 by Benjamin**

**Citizen's Arrest;** Abrogates common law & prohibits citizen's arrests; provides exceptions. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Criminal Justice Subcommittee; Judiciary Committee

**HB 29 by Benjamin (Identical SB 158)**

**Value of Motor Vehicles Exempt from Legal Process;** Revises upward value of motor vehicle owned by natural person that is exempt from legal process. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Civil Justice Subcommittee; Insurance & Banking Subcommittee; Judiciary Committee

**HB 31 by Edmonds (Identical SB 64)**

**Landlords and Tenants;** Limits rent increases of certain residential tenancies to specified amount; requires certain landlords to provide functioning facilities for air-conditioning; revises required notice to tenant before landlord can terminate rental agreement; authorizes landlord to terminate rental agreement or bring action for noncompliance even if tenant provides partial payment of past due rent. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 35 by Rudman (Identical SB 106)**

**Acceptance of Cash Payments by Businesses;** Requires certain businesses to accept cash payments for certain transactions; prohibits fees or conditions for such transactions; provides applicability & civil penalties; requires DACS to adopt rules. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Insurance & Banking Subcommittee; Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee; Commerce Committee

**HB 37 by Koster, Waldron (Identical SB 284)**

**Compensation for Wrongfully Incarcerated Persons;** Revises requirements for filing petition seeking compensation; provides that deceased person's heirs, successors, or assigns do not have standing to file such petition; revises requirements for eligibility for compensation, awarding compensation, & continuing appropriations. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 39 by Koster** (Identical SB 260)

**Refusal to Submit to Breath, Urine, or Blood Test;** Requires person arrested for DUI who refuses to submit to lawful test of his or her breath to be subject to mandatory placement of ignition interlock device at his or her own expense for specified period; requires certain information to be contained in notice of suspension; decreases period during which person whose driver license is suspended for failure to submit to breath, urine, or blood test is not eligible to receive license for business or employment purposes only; waives requirement for ignition interlock device under certain circumstances; directs DHSMV to require placement of ignition interlock device before issuing permanent or restricted driver license to person who refused to submit to lawful test of his or her breath. Effective Date: October 1, 2024

**HB 41 by Edmonds**

**Mortgage Loans and Insurance Payments Grant Program;** Creates within Department of Commerce grant program for mortgage loans & homeowners & motor vehicle insurance payments for Florida residents; provides funds allocation for program; requires program to be administered by department; provides eligibility amounts; provides duties of department in administering program. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 43 by Silvers, Waldron**

**Medicaid Behavioral Health Provider Performance;** Revises provider network requirements for behavioral health providers in Medicaid program; specifies network testing requirements; requires AHCA to establish certain performance measures; requires managed care plan contract amendments by specified date; requires agency to submit annual report to Legislature. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Select Committee on Health Innovation; Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee; Health & Human Services Committee

**HB 45 by Gottlieb, Arrington** (Identical SB 86)

**Hope Cards for Persons Issued Orders of Protection;** Requires OSCA, in consultation with others, to develop Hope Card Program; requires state courts to implement program; authorizes certain persons to apply for Hope Card after specified date; requires applications for Hope Card to be available online & in clerks' offices; requires clerks' offices to mail, by certified mail, Hope Card to petitioners within specified time frame; prohibits assessment of fee; provides requirements for Hope Card; authorizes person protected by injunction for protection issued by court of foreign state to apply for & receive Hope Card even if person does not register order for protection in this state. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 47 by Robinson, F.** (Similar SB 104)

**Municipal Water and Sewer Utility Rates;** Requires municipality to charge customers receiving its utility services in another municipality same rates, fees, & charges as it charges consumers within its own municipal boundaries. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 49 by Chaney**

**Employment and Curfew of Minors;** Removes certain employment restrictions for minors 16 & 17 years of age; revises age at which employment restrictions apply; prohibits counties & municipalities from adopting or enforcing certain ordinances that are more stringent than state law. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Regulatory Reform & Economic Development Subcommittee; Local Administration, Federal Affairs & Special Districts Subcommittee; Commerce Committee

**HB 51 by Tant, Eskamani**

**Art Therapy;** Requires DOH to license professional art therapists & register art therapist interns if they meet specified requirements; requires art therapist intern to practice under supervision until licensed; provides for licensure by endorsement; requires board & DOH to adopt rules establishing requirements for annual renewal of professional art therapist licenses & art therapist intern registrations; provides for inactive licenses & license reactivation; provides for license denial & disciplinary action; prohibits practice of professional art therapy for compensation & use of certain titles, letters, abbreviations, & insignia without valid, active license; provides criminal penalties; exempts certain persons from licensure & registration requirements. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HJR 53 by Tant**

**Ad Valorem Property Tax Exemption for the Surviving Spouse of Quadriplegics;** Proposes amendment to State Constitution to authorize Legislature to provide for property tax exemption for surviving spouse of quadriplegic who was receiving property tax exemption on real estate used & owned as homestead at time of their death.

**HB 55 by Tant**

**Tax Exemptions for Surviving Spouses of Quadriplegics;** Authorizes surviving spouses of certain quadriplegics to carry over certain tax exemption in certain circumstances. Effective Date: on the effective date of the amendment to the State Constitution proposed by HJR 53, or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose

**HB 57 by Salzman** (Compare HJR 19)

**County Commissioner Term Limits;** Establishes term limits for county commissioners. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 59 by Arrington** (Identical SB 50)

**Provision Of Homeowners' Association Rules and Covenants;** Requires association to provide copies of association's rules & covenants to every member before specified date, & every new member thereafter; requires association to provide members with copy of updated rules & covenants; authorizes association to adopt rules relating to standards & manner in which such copies are distributed; authorizes association to post complete copy of association's rules & covenants, or direct link thereto, on homepage of association's website; requires association to provide specified notice to its members. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 61 by Hinson**

**Transportation Facility Designations;** Designates Dylan Roberts Memorial Crosswalk in Alachua County; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Transportation & Modals Subcommittee; Infrastructure & Tourism Appropriations Subcommittee; Infrastructure Strategies Committee

**HB 63 by Woodson, Garcia**

**Protection from Surgical Smoke;** Requiring hospitals & ambulatory surgical centers to adopt & implement policies requiring use of smoke evacuation systems during certain surgical procedures. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Select Committee on Health Innovation; Health Care Appropriations Subcommittee; Health & Human Services Committee

**HB 65 by Harris, Eskamani, Joseph, Rayner** (Identical SB 52)

**Anaphylaxis in Public Schools;** Requires DOE to publish on its website each district school board's anaphylaxis policy; requires each district school board to adopt anaphylaxis policy; provides requirements for such policy & specified training. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Education Quality Subcommittee; PreK-12 Appropriations Subcommittee; Education & Employment Committee

**HB 67 by Gottlieb, Harris, Hinson, Skidmore, Valdés** (Identical SB 236)

**Agreement Among the States to Elect the President by National Popular Vote;** Provides for enactment of Agreement Among States to Elect President by National Popular Vote; provides method by which state may become member state; requires statewide popular election for President & Vice President of U.S.; establishes procedure for appointing presidential electors in member states; provides that agreement becomes effective upon occurrence of specified actions; provides for withdrawal of member state; requires notification of member states when agreement takes effect in nonmember state or when member state withdraws from agreement. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 73 by Tant, Koster**

**Supported Decisionmaking Authority;** Requires court to consider needs & abilities of person with developmental disability when determining whether to appoint guardian advocate; provides requirements for petition to appoint guardian advocate; authorizes agent acting for principal to grant supported decisionmaking agreement; prohibits such agreement from acting as durable power of attorney; provides certain communications shall be recognized as communication of principal; provides requirements for examining committee member when determining incapacitated person's ability to exercise his or her rights. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 75 by Rizo** (Similar SB 184)

**Impeding, Threatening, or Harassing First Responders;** Prohibits approaching first responder or remaining within specified distance of such person with intent to impede, threaten, or harass or physically prevent person from performing lawful duties after receiving warning not to approach; specifies peaceful recording or observation is not harassment; provides criminal penalties. Effective Date: October 1, 2024

**HB 77 by Roach** (Compare SB 248)

**Recovery of Damages in Claims for Medical Negligence;** Removes provision that prohibits parents of adult child from recovering certain damages in medical negligence suits. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Civil Justice Subcommittee; Judiciary Committee

**HB 79 by Amesty, Killebrew** (Similar SB 116, Compare SB 118)

**Child Maintenance Restitution;** Authorizes court to order defendant to pay child maintenance restitution to surviving parent or guardian of minor under certain conditions; provides for collection, disbursement, & enforcement of child maintenance restitution; prohibits person from discharging, refusing to employ, or taking disciplinary action against employee subject to child maintenance restitution; provides civil penalties; provides for payments after defendant's incarceration; provides that court may modify order of child maintenance restitution. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

## HB 81 by Brackett

**Civil Penalties Under The Gas Safety Law of 1967;** Increases civil penalty amount for violating The Gas Safety Law of 1967. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

## HB 83 by Lopez, V.

**Trust Funds/Re-creation/State-Operated Institutions Inmate Welfare Trust Fund/DOC;** Re-creates State-Operated Institutions Inmate Welfare Trust Fund within DOC; abrogates provisions relating to termination. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

## HB 85 by Barnaby

**Pub. Rec./State Banks and State Trust Companies;** Provides exemption from public records requirements for certain information received by OFR in specified applications for authority to organize new state banks and state trust companies; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Insurance & Banking Subcommittee; Ethics, Elections & Open Government Subcommittee; Commerce Committee

## HB 87 by Shoaf

**Taking of Bears;** Authorizes taking of bears without permit or authorization; provides exemption from penalties; requires taking to be reported to FWCC; prohibits person from possessing, selling, or disposing of taken bears or their parts; requires FWCC to dispose of taken bears. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

Agriculture, Conservation & Resiliency Subcommittee; Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee; Infrastructure Strategies Committee

**Public Service Commission Rules;** Removes expiration & revises scope of exemption from certain provisions relating to statements of estimated regulatory costs for certain rules adopted by Public Service Commission. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 231 by Baker**

**Exposures of First Responders to Fentanyl and Fentanyl Analogs;** Provides criminal penalties for persons who unlawfully & intentionally possess specified controlled substances or mixtures & who expose law enforcement officers & others who are acting in their official capacity to such substances or mixtures & causing serious injury. Effective Date: October 1, 2024

**HB 233 by Hart**

**Treatment of Inmates;** Specifies rights of inmates in state correctional system; requires written copy of rights to be provided to each inmate; authorizes relief for deprivation of rights; revises definition of "permanently incapacitated inmate" for purposes of conditional medical release. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 235 by Hart**

**Criminal Rehabilitation;** Specifies to rehabilitate offender to transition back to community successfully is one of primary purposes of sentencing; reduces minimum sentence that must be served by defendant from 85 percent of sentence to 65 percent; revises provisions concerning gain-time to provide for outstanding deed gain-time, good behavior time, & rehabilitation credits; revises limits on awards. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 237 by Hart** (Similar SB 100)

**Pregnant Women in Custody;** Requires every female who is arrested & not released within 72 hours after arrest be administered pregnancy test upon request; requires each municipal or county detention facility notify each arrested female of right to request pregnancy test; authorizes sentencing court to stay beginning of incarceration; authorizes court to order pregnant woman to comply with specified terms & conditions during stay; requires that woman be offered specified assessment & services; requires detention facilities to collect & report specified information. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 239 by Killebrew** (Identical SB 218)

**Property Tax Exemption for Surviving Spouses of Veterans;** Authorizes production of certain letter by surviving spouses of veterans to property appraisers. Effective Date: January 1, 2025

**HB 241 by Massullo, Payne** (Identical SB 56)

**Coverage for Skin Cancer Screenings;** Requires individual health insurance policies; group, blanket, & franchise health insurance policies; & HMOs to provide coverage & payment for annual skin cancer screenings performed by licensed dermatologist without imposing any cost-sharing requirement; specifies requirement for & restriction on payments for such screenings. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 245 by Fabricio** (Identical SB 198)

**Construction Materials Mining Activities;** Specifies ground vibration limit for construction materials mining activities within 1 mile of certain areas; authorizes State Fire Marshal to modify standards, limits, & regulations for use of explosives in connection with such construction materials mining activities. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 247 by Maney**

**Services Provided by the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles or Its Agents;** Provides that certain affidavit constitutes proof of ownership & right of possession to motor vehicle or mobile home previous owner of which died testate; prohibits DHSMV or tax collector from charging fee for reissuance of certain certificates of title; authorizes DHSMV to deem license plate with reduced dimensions to be necessary to accommodate trailers; authorizes certain disabled veterans to be issued military license plate or specialty license plate in lieu of "DV" license plate; specifies applicable fees & nonapplicability of certain provisions; removes provisions requiring written, notarized request for purchase of temporary tag; authorizes DHSMV or its agents to renew initial temporary tag, subject to certain provisions. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 249 by Bracy Davis, Eskamani**

**1920 Ocoee Election Day Riots Loans and Scholarships;** Requires Department of Commerce to prioritize certain applications for Black Business Loan Program; creates Ocoee Scholarship Program for specified recipients; provides requirements for such program & for funding. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 251 by Waldron**

**Wireless Services Provider Automatic Location Identification Information;** Requires wireless services provider to provide automatic location identification information of certain cellular telephones through emergency number created by provider; requires calls to such number to be answered by live representative; specifies format of receipt of such information; authorizes certain persons to confidentially request temporary suspension on person's ability to access automatic location identification information; authorizes provider to charge specified fee. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 253 by Caruso**

**Medicaid Coverage for Prescribed Foods for Disease Treatment and Prevention;** Requires AHCA, in conjunction with DOH, to establish Food Is Medicine Pilot Program to provide Medicaid coverage for purchases & deliveries of prescribed health-promoting foods; requires AHCA, in conjunction with DOH, to seek federal approval & waivers for pilot program; requires federal waiver application to seek matching funds; requires referrals of pilot program patients to certain federal & federally funded programs; requires allocation of portion of pilot program implementation budgets to specified organization for establishment of specified

center; provides operation requirements for center. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 255 by Amesty, Garcia, Lopez, V.** (Identical SB 252)

**Psychiatric Treatments;** Defines "electroconvulsive treatment" & "psychosurgical procedure"; provides only physician may perform such treatment & procedures; prohibits performance of such treatment & procedures on minors. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 257 by Giallombardo**

**Autonomous Practice by a Certified Registered Nurse Anesthetist;** Revises staff membership & clinical privileges for certified registered nurse anesthetists; authorizes certified registered nurse anesthetists to perform specified acts; revises practice requirements for an autonomous advanced practice registered nurse & for certified nurse midwives; authorizes autonomous advanced practice registered nurse to perform certain acts; provides for expiration of Council on Advanced Practice Registered Nurse Autonomous Practice; authorizes certain advanced practice registered nurses to participate in Medical Education Reimbursement & Loan Repayment Program. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 259 by Waldron** (Identical SB 270)

**Discharging a Firearm in Residential Areas;** Revises prohibitions on discharge of firearms in residential areas; removes exceptions. Effective Date: October 1, 2024

**HB 261 by Chaney**

**Practice of Veterinary Medicine;** Provides for licensure of veterinary technicians; provides requirements for such veterinary technicians; revises membership of Board of Veterinary Medicine; provides criminal penalties for specified actions; provides scope of practice for licensed veterinary technicians. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 263 by Chaney**

**Pub Rec./Practice of Veterinary Medicine;** Provides exemption from public records requirements for records relating to licensed veterinary technicians until specified criteria are met; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: on the same date that HB 261 or similar legislation takes effect

**HB 267 by Esposito**

**Residential Building Permits;** Requires governing bodies to create program to expedite process for issuing residential building permits; provides requirements for governing bodies & applicants; authorizes applicants to use private provider for certain reviews; authorizes governing body to issue temporary parcel identification numbers; revises provisions relating to acquiring building permits for residential dwellings; revises timeframes for approving or denying building permits; reduces permit fees; provides certain permits are valid indefinitely. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 269 by Overdorf** (Identical SB 264, Compare SB 230)

**Aircraft Taxes;** Provides maximum tax that may be collected on each sale & use of aircraft; expands tax exemption on aircraft sales & leases. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 271 by Lopez, V.**

**Motor Vehicle Parking on Private Property;** Providing requirements for private property used for motor vehicle parking including legibility & visibility for rules & rates; invoices; appeals; late fees; county or municipal ordinances or regulations; grace periods; & mobile payment applications. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 273 by Holcomb**

**Pub. Rec./Animal Foster or Adoption;** Provides exemption from public records requirements for records containing information pertaining to persons with legal custody of animal from animal shelter or animal control agency operated by local government; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 275 by Canady**

**Intentional Damage to Critical Infrastructure;** Provides criminal penalties for causing intentional harm or damage to critical infrastructure; provides for civil liability for violations. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 277 by Cassel (Identical SB 140)**

**Medicaid Eligibility for Young Adults;** Requires AHCA, in consultation with Commission on Mental Health & Substance Use Disorder, to conduct study for specified purpose; provides requirements for study; provides duties of agency upon completion of study; requires agency to submit report of its findings & recommendations to Governor & Legislature by specified date. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**HB 279 by Eskamani (Similar SB 150)**

**Assault Weapons and Large-capacity Magazines;** Prohibits sale, transfer, or possession of assault weapon or large-capacity magazine; requires certificates of possession for assault weapons or large-capacity magazines lawfully possessed before specified date; limits sales or transfers of assault weapons or large-capacity magazines documented by such certificates; provides enhanced penalties for offenses committed with assault weapon or large-capacity magazine. Effective Date: October 1, 2024

**HB 281 by Arrington**

**Candidate Qualifying;** Provides eligibility requirements for persons seeking to qualify for nomination as candidates of political party or as candidates with no party affiliation; provides that certain entities may bring action for declaratory & injunctive relief based on certain claim; prohibits person from qualifying as candidate for election & prohibits his or her name from appearing on ballot under certain circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 283 by Borrero (Compare HB 179)**

**Self-service Storage Facility Liens;** Revises written notice requirements relating to satisfaction of owner's lien; revises publication requirements relating to advertising sale or other disposition of self-service storage facilities; requires rental agreements authorize tenants to designate optional alternate contact for purposes of providing specified notice; specifies designating alternate contact does not give such person interest in contents stored at self-service storage facility. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 285 by Hunschofsky**

**Pub. Rec./Recording Notification Service;** Provides certain information submitted by recording notification service registrant to clerk or property appraiser is confidential & exempt from public records requirements; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**HB 287 by Esposito (Similar SB 266)**

**Transportation;** Limits revenues DOT may commit to public transit projects; authorizes DOT to enter into comprehensive agreements with private entities; requires DOT to pay interest to contractor; authorizes DOT to determine whether to reduce bonding requirements; revises time periods during which certain actions must be instituted by claimant; provides presumption regarding death, injury, or damage resulting from motor vehicle crash involving driver of vehicle who is under influence of marijuana; revises contractor's immunity from liability; creates Local Agency Program; provides purposes, prioritization, & eligibility & contract requirements; requires oversight by DOT. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 289 by Woodson (Similar HB 243)**

**Title Fraud Prevention;** Creates a pilot program in specified county; requires parties provide specified information to property appraiser; requires property appraiser to make certain notifications; requires participating property appraiser to make report. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 291 by Hunschofsky (Compare SB 176)**

**Weapons and Firearms;** Requires background checks on persons involved in firearm sales or transfers; requires firearm sales or transfers to be conducted through licensed dealer; revises requirements for safe storage of firearms; revises criminal penalties; requires firearms be sold by dealers with trigger locks or gun cases; revises warnings to be posted in gun dealerships; requires certain materials to be given to gun purchasers; prohibits specified acts involving unfinished firearm frames or receivers; prohibits certain activities involving three-dimensional printer or CNC milling machine. Effective Date: October 1, 2024

**HB 293 by Sirois**

**Hurricane Protections for Homeowners' Associations;** Requires board or committee of homeowners' association to adopt hurricane protection specifications; requires such specifications conform to applicable building codes; prohibits board or committee of association from denying application for installation, enhancement, or replacement of certain hurricane protection; authorizes requirement to adhere to certain guidelines regarding external appearance of structure or improvement on parcel. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**HB 295 by Anderson**

**Disclosure of Estimated Ad Valorem Taxes;** Requires certain listings to include estimated ad valorem taxes; prohibits current owner's ad valorem taxes from being displayed or used for certain purposes; provides that certain listing platforms use specified formula; provides requirements for listing platforms, DOR, & property appraisers. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 297 by Cross, Jacques** (Identical SB 272)

**Appointment of Courtroom Animal Advocates;** Authorizes court to order separate advocate be appointed in interests of justice for certain criminal proceedings regarding cat or dog's welfare or custody; provides judge's decision denying appointment is not subject to appeal; authorizes appointed advocate to take certain actions involving proceedings; provides requirements for advocate. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 299 by Woodson** (Compare HB 243)

**Pub. Rec./Title Fraud Prevention;** Provides public records exemption for certain information provided as part of the Title Fraud Prevention Through Sales Contract Notification Pilot Program. Effective Date: on the same date that HB 289 or other similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session or an extension thereof and becomes law

**HB 301 by Casello** (Identical SB 22)

**Animal Cremation;** Requires provider of companion animal cremation services to provide written description of services & include certification with cremated remains; requires referring persons or entities to provide copies of such written descriptions; provides for collection & deposit of civil penalties; provides circumstances under which person commits unfair or deceptive act or engages in unfair method of competition; provides for private right of action; authorizes DACS to take certain actions. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 303 by Killebrew**

**Rabies Vaccinations;** Authorizes certain persons to administer rabies vaccinations to certain animals under indirect supervision of veterinarian; defines "indirect supervision." Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 305 by Baker**

**Offenses Involving Children;** Increases maximum age of child victim of specified acts whose out of court statements may be admissible in certain circumstances; provides that first offense of specified sex trafficking offenses involving minors requires designation of defendant as sexual predator. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 307 by Rizo**

**Continuing Chiropractic Education;** Deletes requirement that chiropractic continuing education be completed in classroom setting; prohibits Board of Chiropractic Medicine from limiting number of continuing education hours that may be completed through distance learning; authorizes board to provide exceptions to continuing education requirements during declared state of emergency; provides requirements for continuing education instructors. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

**HB 6001 by Massullo** (Identical SB 12)

**Relief/Mark Lagatta/Department of Transportation;** Provides appropriation to compensate Mark LaGatta for injuries & damages sustained as result of negligence of DOT; provides limitation on compensation & payment of attorney fees. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Civil Justice Subcommittee; Appropriations Committee; Judiciary Committee

**HB 6003 by Gottlieb** (Identical SB 6)

**Relief/Sidney Holmes/State of Florida;** Provides appropriation to compensate Mr. Holmes for being wrongfully incarcerated; directs CFO to draw warrant payable directly to Mr. Holmes without requiring Mr. Holmes to sign liability release; provides for waiver of certain tuition & fees; prohibits funds awarded under act to Mr. Holmes from being used or paid for attorney or lobbying fees. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Civil Justice Subcommittee; Appropriations Committee; Judiciary Committee

**HB 6005 by Rizo, Basabe, Gottlieb, Hinson** (Identical SB 14)

**Relief/Maury Hernandez/Department of Corrections;** Provides appropriation to compensate Maury Hernandez for injuries & damages sustained as consequence of DOC's failures to enforce probation laws, regulations, & policies; provides limitation on payment of compensation & attorney fees. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Civil Justice Subcommittee; Appropriations Committee; Judiciary Committee

**HB 6007 by Yarkosky** (Identical SB 10)

**Relief/Julia Perez/St. Johns County Sheriff's Office;** Provides for appropriation to compensate Julia Perez for personal injuries & damages sustained as result of negligence of employee of St. Johns County Sheriff's Office; provides legislative intent for waiver of certain lien interests; provides limitation on compensation & payment of attorney fees. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Civil Justice Subcommittee; Judiciary Committee

**HB 6009 by Hart** (Identical SB 2)

**Relief/Patricia Ermini/Lee County Sheriff's Office;** Provides appropriation to compensate Patricia Ermini for injuries sustained as result of negligence of Lee County Sheriff's Office; provides limitation on payment of attorney fees. Effective Date: upon becoming a law
