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HB 11 by Rudman

Invalid Restrictive Covenants with Physicians; Provides restrictive covenants which prohibit physician from practicing medicine within specified area for certain period of time are void & unenforceable. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 13 by Edmonds

Minimum Base Salary for Full-time Teachers; Increases minimum base salary for certain teachers. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 15 by Rudman

Contracts for Live Entertainment; Prohibits entertainment venue from canceling or terminating executed contract with certain persons engaged in live entertainment. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 17 by Rudman

Expiration of the Mandatory Waiting Period for Firearms Purchases; Revises when mandatory waiting period expires. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HJR 19 by Salzman

County Commissioner Term Limits; Proposes amendment to State Constitution to limit terms of office for county commissioners by prohibiting incumbent members who have held office for preceding 8 years from appearing on ballot for reelection; such term limits only apply to terms of office beginning on or after November 5, 2024.

HB 21 by Salzman (Identical SB 24, Compare SB 26)

Victims of Reform School Abuse; Requires person seeking certification as victim of Florida reform school abuse to apply to DOS by specified date; authorizes specified persons to apply on behalf of decedent; requires DOS to review & process application within certain timeframe; prohibits DOS from denying an application for specified reasons; requires DOS to submit list of certified victims to Legislature; provides exceptions from specified requirements for crime victim compensation eligibility for victims. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 23 by Salzman (Similar SB 26, Compare SB 24)

Pub. Rec./Reform School Abuse Victims; Provides an exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information in applications submitted to DOS by persons seeking certification as victims of Florida reform school abuse; provides for future legislative review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: on the same date that HB 21 or similar legislation takes effect

HB 25 by Edmonds

Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program; Revises student eligibility criteria for specified awards within Florida Bright Futures Scholarship Program. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 27 by Benjamin

Citizen's Arrest; Abrogates common law & prohibits citizen's arrests; provides exceptions. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 29 by Benjamin

Value of Motor Vehicles Exempt from Legal Process; Revises upward value of motor vehicle owned by natural person that is exempt from legal process. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 31 by Edmonds

Landlords and Tenants; Limits rent increases of certain residential tenancies to specified amount; requires certain landlords to provide functioning facilities for air-conditioning; revises required notice to tenant before landlord can terminate rental agreement; authorizes landlord to terminate rental agreement or bring action for noncompliance even if tenant provides partial payment of past due rent. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 35 by Rudman

Acceptance of Cash Payments by Businesses; Requires certain businesses to accept cash payments for certain transactions; prohibits fees or conditions for such transactions; provides applicability & civil penalties; requires DACS to adopt rules. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 37 by Koster

Compensation for Wrongfully Incarcerated Persons; Revises requirements for filing petition seeking compensation; provides that deceased person's heirs, successors, or assigns do not have standing to file such petition; revises requirements for eligibility for compensation, awarding compensation, & continuing appropriations. Effective Date: July 1, 2024

HB 39 by Koster

Refusal to Submit to Breath, Urine, or Blood Test; Requires person arrested for DUI who refuses to submit to lawful test of his or her breath to be subject to mandatory placement of ignition interlock device at his or her own expense for specified period; requires certain information to be contained in notice of suspension; decreases period during which person whose driver license is suspended for failure to submit to breath, urine, or blood test is not eligible to receive license for business or employment purposes only; waives requirement for ignition interlock device under certain circumstances; directs DHSMV to require placement of ignition interlock device before issuing permanent or restricted driver license to person who refused to submit to lawful test of his or her breath. Effective Date: October 1, 2024

HB 6001 by Massullo (Identical SB 12)

Relief/Mark Lagatta/Department of Transportation; Provides appropriation to compensate Mark LaGatta for injuries & damages sustained as result of negligence of DOT; provides limitation on compensation & payment of attorney fees. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

January 9	<u>Final Member Bill Filing Deadline:</u> No general bill, local bill, joint resolution, concurrent resolution (except one relating to extension of a session or legislative organization or procedures), substantive House resolution, or memorial shall be given first reading unless approved for filing with the Clerk no later than noon of the first day of the regular session. January 9	<u>Filing Deadlines for Floor Amendments:</u> During the first 55 days of a regular session: Main floor amendments must be submitted to the House Bill Drafting Service by 3 p.m. and approved for filing with the Clerk by 4 p.m. of the first day a bill appears on the Special Order Calendar in the Calendar of the House; and amendments to main floor amendments and substitute amendments for main floor amendments must be submitted to the House Bill Drafting Service by 6:30 p.m. and approved for filing by 7 p.m. of the same day.	<i>Day 1-55</i> <i>[Rule 12.2(a)(1&2)]</i> <i>January 9-March 3</i>

February 22	<u>Ceremonial Resolution Filing Deadline:</u> No ceremonial resolution shall be given first reading unless approved for filing with the Clerk before the 46th day (February 23) of the regular session. February 24	<u>Immediate Certification of Bills:</u> Unless otherwise directed by the Speaker, during the last 14 days of a regular session, all measures acted on by the House shall be transmitted to the Senate without delay.	<i>Last 14 Days [Rule 11.7(k)] February 24-March 8</i>
March 4	After the 55th day (March 3) of a regular session, the Special Order Calendar shall be published in one Calendar of the House and may be taken up on the day the Calendar is published.	<i>Day 56 [Rule 10.11(a)(3)] March 4-March 8</i>
