We are now in week eight of the 2022 Legislative Session. It is with great honor that I announce that my bills <u>HB 1215</u> Abandoned & Historic Cemeteries and <u>HB 649</u> Transfers in Divorce have passed through all of their committee stops as of last week. They are now headed to the House floor.

This past week was challenging as two controversial bills that, in my opinion, will severely limit the freedoms of Floridians passed the House floor. I believe HB 7 and HB 1557 both restrict teachers from educating children on history of African-American communities accurately and discussing LGBTQ+ communities. I am proud to announce that two of my bills unanimously passed through all of their committees and will be moving on to the House floor.

HB 1215 creates a dedicated Office of Historic Cemeteries to identify and promote the preservation of abandoned African-American cemeteries and directs the Department of Education to develop meaningful curriculum relating to instructional education about abandoned and historic cemeteries in Florida. It passed through its third committee last week, the State Affairs Committee.

**HB 649** specifies that certain interests received by transferees after divorce are exempt from claims of creditors upon being awarded or received. It passed through its third committee,

Along with other controversial bills this session, we primarily discussed HB 1557 — what is referred to as the "Don't Say Gay Bill" and the detrimental effects I believe it will have on LGBTQ+ Floridians, especially LGBTQ+ youth.
