Please Describe: <u>Studies show that healthy coral reefs provide buffering from tropical storms and erosion that impacts property values and the safety of human life.</u> They also provide a habitat for fish, lobsters, and other species that are harvested for food. Sea turtle and manatee conservation efforts contribute to healthy oceans and drive ecotourism, which has critical economic impact to the state's citizens.

The water treatment will remove calcium and other minerals in support of operations at Florida Conservation and Technology to care for coral, sea turtles, marine mammals, and at FWC's fish hatchery. FWC will use the water to maintain its fish hatchery on site.
