As of July 2019 more than 23,000 Florida children were in foster care. A 2019 Casey Foundation report highlights the benefits of father involvement for child safety and well-being. Non-residential fathers involvement with their children is associated with a higher likelihood of a reunification outcome and a lower likelihood of an adoption outcome. Children with highly involved non-resident fathers are discharged from foster care more quickly than those whose fathers have less or no involvement.
