Through Volunteer Florida's Americorps program half of our Florida programs have dedicated mentors who are hosting mentoring sessions. Major partners include Publix, UPS, Starbucks, Caspers McDonalds, Canteen Vending, Nielson Media Group, Lennar, Enterprise Tampa, US Department of Labor, and YouthBuild USA.

The Justice Research Center (JRC) independently measures standard outputs and outcomes of each AMIkids program and each of their services. The JRC advances quality program performance and informs continual quality improvement.

Students will engage in learning opportunities that teach workplace readiness, which may include understanding personal qualities and employable traits, self-management skills, team work, professionalism, job-seeking skills, and personal finance. Students will participate in career fairs, mock interviews, job shadowing, as well as engage in mentoring and apprenticeship placements. As appropriate, students will visit vocational schools, community colleges and universities.

Students will receive guidance, instruction, and support that leads to their preparation for successfully securing and maintaining a job in their local community.
