7 Section 1. Paragraph (c) of subsection (1) of section 316.075,  
 8 Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

9 316.075 Traffic control signal devices.--

10 (1) Except for automatic warning signal lights installed  
 11 or to be installed at railroad crossings, whenever traffic,  
 12 including municipal traffic, is controlled by traffic control  
 13 signals exhibiting different colored lights, or colored lighted  
 14 arrows, successively one at a time or in combination, only the  
 15 colors green, red, and yellow shall be used, except for special  
 16 pedestrian signals carrying a word legend, and the lights shall  
 17 indicate and apply to drivers of vehicles and pedestrians as  
 18 follows:

19 (c) Steady red indication.--

20 1. Vehicular traffic facing a steady red signal shall stop  
 21 before entering the crosswalk on the near side of the  
 22 intersection or, if none, then before entering the intersection

29 approaching traffic on the intersecting roadway before entering

34 prohibit any such right turn against a steady red signal at any  
35 intersection, which prohibition shall be effective when a sign

45 as described, which prohibition shall be effective when a sign  
46 giving notice thereof is attached to the traffic control signal  
47 device at the intersection.

49 shall stop before entering the crosswalk and remain stopped to  
50 allow a pedestrian, with a permitted signal, to cross a roadway  
51 when the pedestrian is in the crosswalk or steps into the  
52 crosswalk and is upon the half of the roadway upon which the  
53 vehicle is traveling or when the pedestrian is approaching so

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54 closely from the opposite half of the roadway as to be in  
55 danger.

56 b. Unless otherwise directed by a pedestrian control

58 red signal shall not enter the roadway.

80 only on the shoulder on the left side of the roadway in relation

96 pedestrian is approaching so closely from the opposite half of  
97 the roadway as to be in danger.

98 (b) The driver of a vehicle at any crosswalk where signage  
99 so indicates shall stop and remain stopped to allow a pedestrian  
100 to cross a roadway when the pedestrian is in the crosswalk or  
101 steps into the crosswalk and is upon the half of the roadway  
102 upon which the vehicle is traveling or when the pedestrian is  
103 approaching so closely from the opposite half of the roadway as  
104 to be in danger.

105 (c) When traffic control signals are not in place or in  
106 operation and there is no signage indicating otherwise, the  
107 driver of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way, slowing down  
108 or stopping if need be to so yield, to a pedestrian crossing the  
109 roadway within a crosswalk when the pedestrian is upon the half  
110 of the roadway upon which the vehicle is traveling or when the  
111 pedestrian is approaching so closely from the opposite half of  
112 the roadway as to be in danger. Any pedestrian crossing a  
113 roadway at a point where a pedestrian tunnel or overhead

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114 pedestrian crossing has been provided shall yield the right-of-  
115 way to all vehicles upon the roadway.

116 (8) No pedestrian shall suddenly leave a curb or other  
117 place of safety and walk or run into the path of a vehicle which  
118 is so close that it is impossible for the driver to yield.

119 (9) Whenever any vehicle is stopped at a marked crosswalk  
120 or at any unmarked crosswalk at an intersection to permit a  
121 pedestrian to cross the roadway, the driver of any other vehicle  
122 approaching from the rear shall not overtake and pass such  
123 stopped vehicle.

124 (10) Every pedestrian crossing a roadway at any point  
125 other than within a marked crosswalk or within an unmarked  
126 crosswalk at an intersection shall yield the right-of-way to all  
127 vehicles upon the roadway.

128 (11) Between adjacent intersections at which traffic  
129 control signals are in operation, pedestrians shall not cross at  
130 any place except in a marked crosswalk.

131 (12) No pedestrian shall, except in a marked crosswalk,  
132 cross a roadway at any other place than by a route at right  
133 angles to the curb or by the shortest route to the opposite  
134 curb.

135 (13) Pedestrians shall move, whenever practicable, upon  
136 the right half of crosswalks.

137 (14) No pedestrian shall cross a roadway intersection  
138 diagonally unless authorized by official traffic control  
139 devices, and, when authorized to cross diagonally, pedestrians  
140 shall cross only in accordance with the official traffic control  
141 devices pertaining to such crossing movements.

142 (15) Notwithstanding other provisions of this chapter,  
143 every driver of a vehicle shall exercise due care to avoid  
144 colliding with any pedestrian or any person propelling a human-
