Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Section 627.668, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

627.668 Optional coverage for mental and nervous disorders required; exception.--

(1) Every insurer, health maintenance organization, and nonprofit hospital and medical service plan corporation transacting group health insurance or providing prepaid health care in this state shall make available to the policyholder as part of the application, for an appropriate additional premium under a group hospital and medical expense-incurred insurance policy, under a group prepaid health care contract, and under a group hospital and medical service plan contract, the benefits or level of benefits specified in subsections (2) and (3) subsection (2) for the necessary care and treatment of mental and nervous disorders, as defined in the standard nomenclature most recent edition of the Diagnostic and Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders published by the American Psychiatric

 respectively.

Association, subject to the right of the applicant for a group policy or contract to select any alternative benefits or level of benefits as may be offered by the insurer, health maintenance organization, or service plan corporation provided that, if alternate inpatient, outpatient, or partial hospitalization benefits are selected, such benefits shall not be less than the level of benefits required under <u>subsections</u> (2) and (3) <u>paragraph</u> (2)(a), <u>paragraph</u> (2)(b), or <u>paragraph</u> (2)(c),

- (2) Under group policies or contracts, inpatient hospital benefits, partial hospitalization benefits, and outpatient benefits consisting of durational limits, dollar amounts, deductibles, and coinsurance factors shall not be less favorable than for physical illness generally for the necessary care and treatment of schizophrenia, schizo-affective disorders, major depression, bipolar disorders, panic disorders, generalized anxiety disorders, posttraumatic stress disorders, substance abuse disorders, eating disorders, delirium, dementia, childhood ADD/ADHD, developmental disorders, borderline personality disorder, and mental disorder due to a medical condition.
- (3) (2) Under group policies or contracts, inpatient hospital benefits, partial hospitalization benefits, and outpatient benefits for mental health disorders not listed in subsection (2) shall not be less favorable than for physical illness generally, except that:
- (a) Inpatient benefits may be limited to not less than $\underline{45}$ $\underline{30}$ days per benefit year as defined in the policy or contract. If inpatient hospital benefits are provided beyond $\underline{45}$ $\underline{30}$ days per benefit year, the durational limits, dollar amounts, and coinsurance factors thereto need not be the same as applicable to physical illness generally.

- (b) Outpatient benefits may be limited to \$5,000 \$1,000 for consultations with a licensed physician, a psychologist licensed pursuant to chapter 490, a mental health counselor licensed pursuant to chapter 491, a marriage and family therapist licensed pursuant to chapter 491, and a clinical social worker licensed pursuant to chapter 491. If benefits are provided beyond the \$5,000 1,000 per benefit year, the durational limits, dollar amounts, and coinsurance factors thereof need not be the same as applicable to physical illness generally.
- (c) Partial hospitalization benefits shall be provided under the direction of a licensed physician. For purposes of this part, the term "partial hospitalization services" is defined as those services offered by a program accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals (JCAH) or in compliance with equivalent standards. Alcohol rehabilitation programs accredited by the Joint Commission on Accreditation of Hospitals or approved by the state and licensed drug abuse rehabilitation programs shall also be qualified providers under this section. In any benefit year, if partial hospitalization services or a combination of inpatient and partial hospitalization are utilized, the total benefits paid for all such services shall not exceed the cost of 30 days of inpatient hospitalization for psychiatric services, including physician fees, which prevail in the community in which the partial hospitalization services are rendered. If partial hospitalization services benefits are provided beyond the limits set forth in this paragraph, the durational limits, dollar amounts, and coinsurance factors thereof need not be the same as those applicable to physical illness generally.

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(4)(3) Insurers must maintain strict confidentiality regarding psychiatric and psychotherapeutic records submitted to an insurer for the purpose of reviewing a claim for benefits payable under this section. These records submitted to an insurer are subject to the limitations of s. 456.057, relating to the furnishing of patient records.

Section 2. <u>Section 627.669</u>, <u>Florida Statutes</u>, <u>is repealed</u>. Section 3. Paragraph (b) of subsection (8) of section 627.6675, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

627.6675 Conversion on termination of eligibility .-- Subject to all of the provisions of this section, a group policy delivered or issued for delivery in this state by an insurer or nonprofit health care services plan that provides, on an expense-incurred basis, hospital, surgical, or major medical expense insurance, or any combination of these coverages, shall provide that an employee or member whose insurance under the group policy has been terminated for any reason, including discontinuance of the group policy in its entirety or with respect to an insured class, and who has been continuously insured under the group policy, and under any group policy providing similar benefits that the terminated group policy replaced, for at least 3 months immediately prior to termination, shall be entitled to have issued to him or her by the insurer a policy or certificate of health insurance, referred to in this section as a "converted policy." A group insurer may meet the requirements of this section by contracting with another insurer, authorized in this state, to issue an individual converted policy, which policy has been approved by the office under s. 627.410. An employee or member shall not be entitled to a converted policy if termination of his or her insurance under the group policy occurred because he or she

- 2. Dental services for each respective procedure shall be reimbursed at a rate equal to the 50th percentile of fees charged in a respective geographical area as reported by the National Dental Advisory Service.

The agency shall include in all managed care contracts a requirement to provide at least such reimbursement for physician and dental services.

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Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Section 627.42395, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

627.42395 Coverage for certain prescription and nonprescription enteral or amino acid formulas .--

- (1)Notwithstanding any other provision of law, any health insurance policy delivered or issued for delivery, to any person in this state or any group, blanket, or franchise health insurance policy delivered or issued for delivery in this state shall make available to the policyholder as part of the application, for an appropriate additional premium, coverage for:
- (a) Prescription and nonprescription enteral formulas for home use which are physician prescribed as medically necessary for the treatment of inherited diseases of amino acid, organic acid, carbohydrate, or fat metabolism as well as malabsorption originating from congenital defects present at birth or acquired during the neonatal period. Such coverage for inherited diseases

of amino acids and organic acids shall include food products
modified to be low protein, in an amount not to exceed \$2,500

annually for any insured individual, through the age of 24.

- (b) Amino-acid-based elemental formulas, regardless of the method of intake, for the medically necessary treatment of medically diagnosed conditions of severe multiple food protein allergies, gastroesophageal reflux, eosinophilic disorders, and short bowel syndrome when ordered by a licensed physician.

 Treatments using amino acid-based elemental formulas must be medically necessary and appropriate treatment that is consistent with the person's symptoms, diagnosis, condition, and follows generally accepted professional medical standards; provided to achieve a level of physical or mental function consistent with prevailing standards for the diagnosis or condition; and it is not furnished primarily for the convenience of the person or provider. Conditions using these formulas for experimental or investigational services shall not be medically necessary.
- (2) This section applies to any person or family notwithstanding the existence of any preexisting condition.
- Section 2. Subsection (41) is added to section 641.31, Florida Statutes, to read:
 - 641.31 Health maintenance contracts.--
- of amino-acid-based elemental formulas, regardless of the method of intake, for the medically necessary treatment of medically diagnosed conditions such as severe multiple food protein allergies, gastroesophageal reflux, eosinophilic disorders, and short bowel syndrome when ordered by a licensed physician.

 Treatments using amino acid-based elemental formulas must be medically necessary and appropriate treatment that is consistent with the person's symptoms, diagnosis, condition, and follows

Nonprofit cooperative hospital laundries. -- Also (ii) exempt from the tax imposed by this chapter are sales or leases to nonprofit organizations that are incorporated under chapter 617 and which are treated, for federal income tax purposes, as cooperatives under subchapter T of the Internal Revenue Code, whose sole purpose is to offer laundry supplies and services to their members who, which members must all be exempt from federal income tax pursuant to s. 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. A member of a nonprofit cooperative hospital laundry whose Internal Revenue Code status changes must, within 90 days after such change, divest all participation in the cooperative. The provision of laundry supplies and services to a nonmember business pursuant to a declaration of an emergency under s. 252.36(2) and a written emergency plan of operation executed by the members of the cooperative does not invalidate or cause the denial of the cooperative's certificate of exemption.
