(7) IMPLEMENTATION.—The department shall implement this section within available resources. In expectation of statewide implementation of this section, the department, in consultation with the agency, may identify geographic areas of the state for initial implementation of up to three pilot program sites.

Future expansion must have legislative approval and shall be based on findings of community readiness and the potential for affecting the greatest number of individuals entering the forensic mental health and criminal justice systems. The plans may be limited to services for a select number of eligible individuals who have incomes up to 150 percent of the federal poverty level.
