Program Responsibilities



- Florida Facilities Pool (Pool)
 - Bonded building pool established in 1985-86
 - 103 facilities
 - 12.3 million square feet, 8.3 million square feet of office space
- Lease Administration 1,171 total leases
 - 294 agency leases for Pool space
 - 877 private and other government leases
- Operations and Maintenance
 - Maintains 12.3 million square feet of Pool space
- Building Construction
 - Project Management and Budget Oversight on state-administered construction
- Florida State Owned Lands and Records Information System (FL-SOLARIS)



Program Statistics

- Division Staff: 291 Full-Time positions
- Division Budget: \$105.7 million

 - Warehouse Space

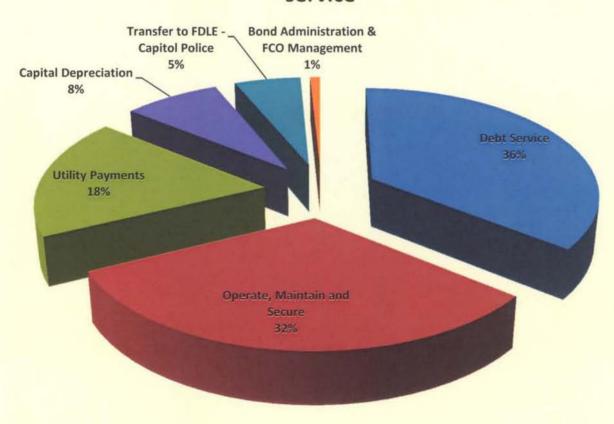




Pool Uniform Rental Rate

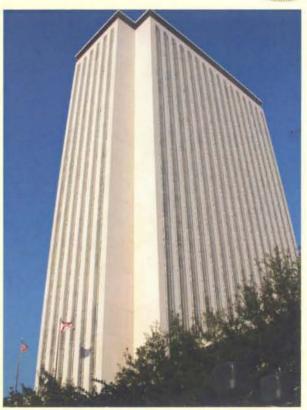

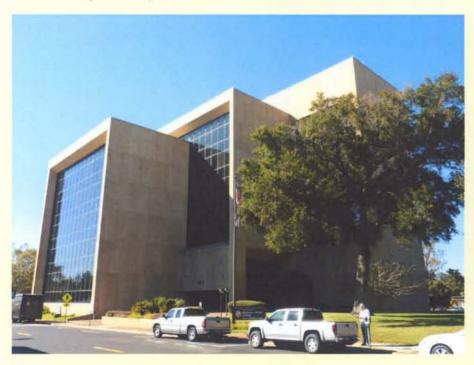

Capital Improvement Process



- DMS maintains a database of all deficiency correction projects for Pool facilities
 - \$118 million in deficiencies
- Projects are evaluated annually and prioritized for inclusion in the Five Year Capital Improvements Plan
 - Life safety
 - Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
 - Building Integrity
 - Maintenance and Repairs
- DMS' Annual Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) request for FY 2013-14 was \$8 million

DMS Review of Agencies' FCO Requests



- Section 216.044, F.S., directs DMS to annually review state agencies' and judicial branch Fixed Capital Outlay (FCO) requests and makes recommendations regarding:
 - Construction requirements
 - Cost of the projects
 - Project alternatives
- For FY 2013-14, state agencies submitted 171 total project requests totaling \$8.9 billion



LBR - Fixed Capital Outlay Request



- Annual Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) request for FY 2013-14 is \$8,047,781
- Request includes 19 Priority 1 projects, including:
 - Fire alarm system replacements
 - ADA upgrades
 - Roof replacements

LBR - Building Commissioning

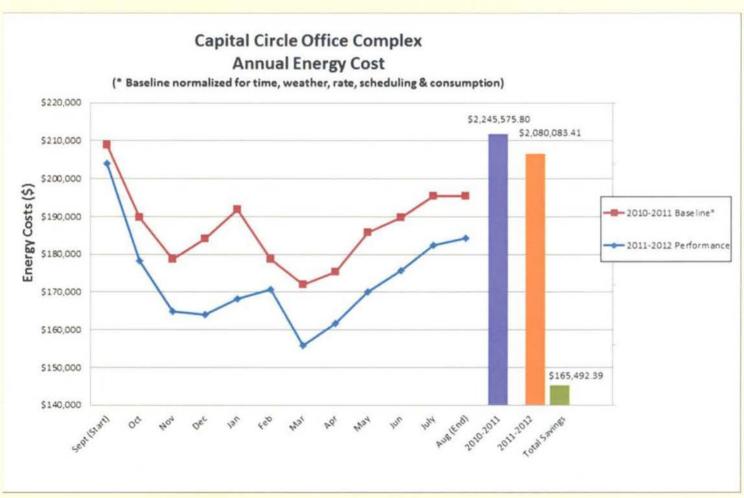


- DMS is requesting \$1.73 million to perform building commissioning of 4.33 million square feet of state-owned space
 - Expected cost savings of over \$500,000 annually
- Building commissioning is:
 - Recalibrating the performance of mechanical and electrical systems for optimal efficiency
 - A proven way to achieve recurring cost savings, increase the life of buildings and prevent future repairs

LBR - Pool Reconfiguration



- DMS is requesting \$4.37 million to reconfigure tenant space in three Pool facilities:
 - Park Trammel Building, Tampa
 - Zora Neale Hurston Building, Orlando
 - Joseph D'Alessandro Building, Ft. Myers
- These reconfigurations will:
 - Fully utilize state-owned space by reconfiguring vacant space to better meet agency operational needs
 - Allow for agency moves from private leased space (projected annual rental savings of \$541,541)
 - Increase Pool rental revenues (projected annual increased revenue of \$1,504,642)



Lease Renegotiation Effort



- DMS, working with state agencies and tenant brokers, is renegotiating and re-procuring all private leases that expire before June 30, 2015
- Renegotiations since July 1, 2011, have achieved:
 - Over \$25 million in cost savings for FY 2011-12,
 2012-13
 - Reduction of 708,987 gross square feet

FL-SOLARIS



- Passed in November 2010, Senate Bill 1516 (Chapter 2010-280, Laws of Florida)
- DEP and DMS are required to develop a database to record and maintain the inventory of real estate properties that are "owned, leased, rented, or otherwise occupied" by any state government entity
- FL-SOLARIS
 - Facility Information Tracking System (FITS)
 - Lands Inventory Tracking System (LITS)

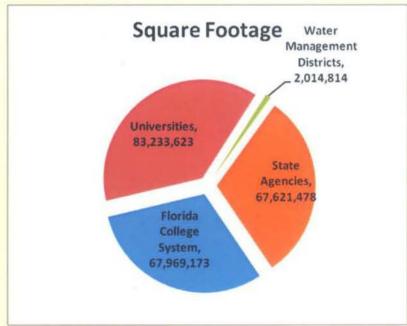


State-Owned Facility Portfolio



- The State of Florida owns 20,368 facilities, totaling over 220 million square feet.
 - 65 different entities own and manage these facilities.







FL-SOLARIS - Data Elements



- FITS includes, but is not limited to, the following data elements:
 - Facility Address and GIS coordinates
 - Facility square footage
 - Facility deficiencies
 - Operating costs
 - Leasing information, including start and end date, lease options, and rate per square foot

FL-SOLARIS Benefits



Agencies

- · Access, enter, and validate their own data
- See owned and leased data for all agencies
- Better assess owned building performance

DMS uses FL-SOLARIS data for:

- Annual reporting, including the State Facility Inventory, Five-Year Strategic Leasing Plan, Master Leasing Report, and the Disposition Report developed with DEP
- Identification of disposition candidates
- Understanding occupancy
 - Identify opportunities to backfill state-owned assets
 - · Identify opportunities for co-location and consolidation
- Understanding operating costs, energy cost and facility condition

 Required DSL to maintain an inventory of land owned by all agencies including land purchased under the Florida Preservation 2000 Act pursuant to s. 259.101 or the Florida Forever Act pursuant to s. 259.10520

2010 Senate Bill 1516

Expanded the scope of the original Senate Bill to include
 FACILITIES that are owned, leased, rented or otherwise occupied by any agency, judicial branch, or water management district and expanded LAND inventory to include all land that is owned, disposed, leased, or otherwise occupied or managed by agency, judicial branch, or water management district.



FL-SOLARIS Timeline



- Apr 2012 Facilities Inventory Tracking System (FITS) went live.
- **Jun 2012** FITS data input complete. 20,368 State-owned facilities successfully integrated into FL-SOLARIS.
- Oct 2012 DEP and DMS submitted first annual Disposition Report utilizing FL-SOLARIS provided data.
- Jan 2013 Land Inventory Tracking System (LITS) goes live, satisfying legislative intent and completes the initial program development of FL-SOLARIS covering 114,232 parcels.



FL-SOLARIS High-Level Project Objectives



1. Land Inventory:

 A populated and reconciled current state land inventory that enables DSL to produce reports and maps on <u>all</u> state lands that are owned.

2. Facilities Inventory:

 A populated current facility inventory on all state facilities that are owned, rented, leased, or otherwise occupied or maintained.

3. Public Land Inventory:

 A populated current public land inventory that can be used to reconcile the land inventory.

4. Data Warehouse:

 Agencies need to have a complete inventory of what the state owns, leases, or rents to improve efficiency in occupancy and use and to avoid building or buying in areas where there may be space or land available.

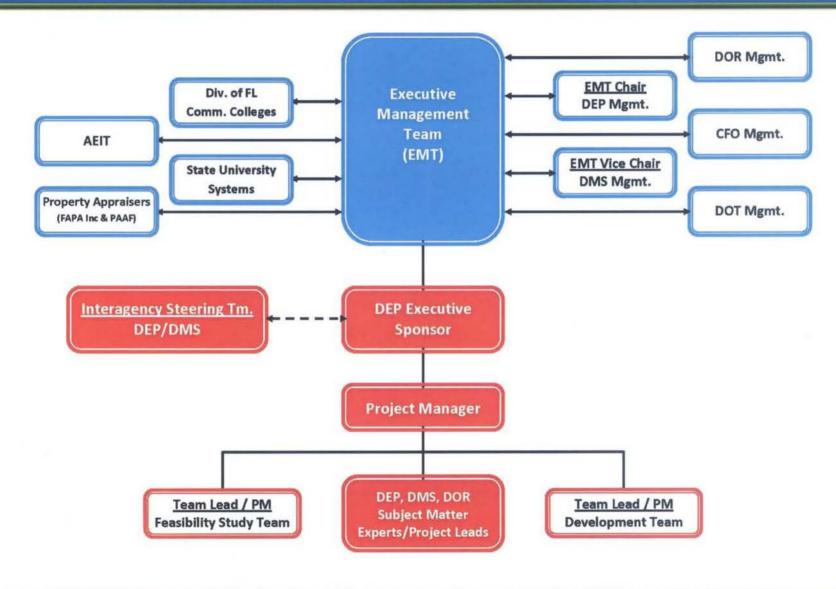
5. Access / Data Extraction:

 Each agency should be able to log into the FL-SOLARIS system and extract land / facility information only pertaining to them.



FL-SOLARIS Project High Level Structure

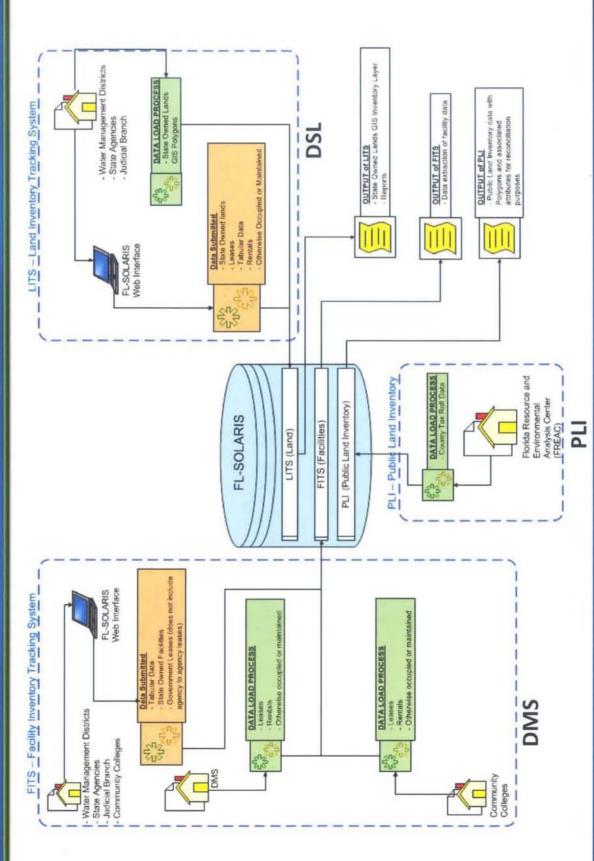






FL-SOLARIS High Level Process Overview

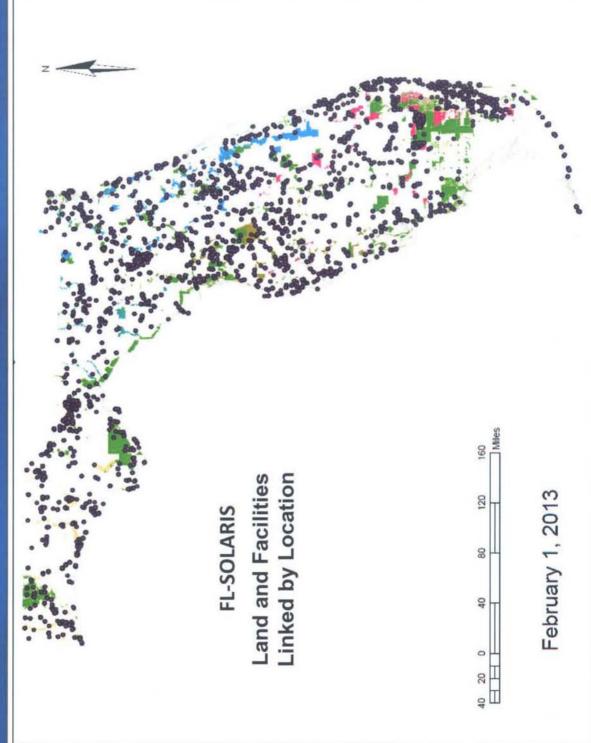

- For the first time, an inventory of all state-owned lands and facilities is available in one place.
- State-owned land records are compared and reconciled with DOR and tax assessor records information.

- Allows agencies to identify lands and facilities that are candidates for disposition.
- Provides users the ability to download reports based on selected criteria.

- Facilities lease management capabilities.
- Enhanced business management tools.

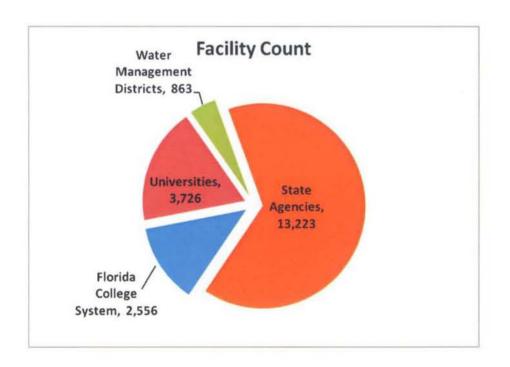

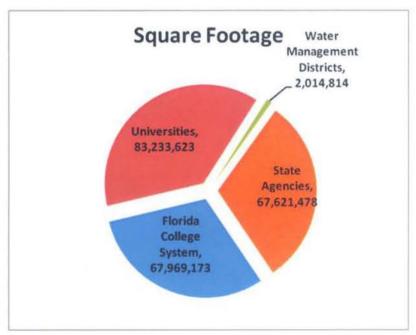


FITS – Data Analysis



- The State of Florida owns 20,368 facilities, totaling over 220 million square feet.
 - 65 different entities own and manage these facilities.







FITS - Data Elements



- FITS has been fully functional since April 2012
- FITS includes, but is not limited to, the following data elements:
 - Facility Address and GIS coordinates
 - Facility square footage
 - Facility deficiencies
 - Operating costs
 - Leasing information, including start and end date, lease options, and rate per square foot



FITS - Data Usage and Advantages

DMS uses FL-SOLARIS data for:

History of Data Center Consolidation

- Data center facility that houses computer systems and associated hardware and has redundant power supplies, data communications connections, environmentals (e.g., air conditioning & fire suppression) & security devices.
- Almost every state agency had its own data center facility.
- In 2008 Gartner completed a feasibility study designed to answer the question "Would consolidation of the state's agency data centers be a good cost & operational option for Florida?"

History of Data Center Consolidation

Gartner Findings:

- About 42% of all agency data center floor space was unoccupied.
- 3 of the top 20 agency data centers were less than 60% occupied.
- State would realize sufficient cost savings or cost avoidance to warrant consolidating all agency data centers into three statewide data centers.
- Gartner's Recommendation Florida's entire agency data center workload could be accommodated by DMS' Shared Resource Center, DCF's Northwood Data Center and the Northwest Regional Data Center located at Innovation Park/Tallahassee.

Legislation

- 2008 Legislature established state data center system law:
 - Created two primary data centers:
 - Southwood Shared Resource Center (former Shared Resource Center managed by DMS)
 - Northwood Shared Resource Center (former Northwood Data Center managed by DCF).
 - Established governing boards for both primary data centers & defined board duties; boards comprised of customer agencies.
 - Authorized the Agency for Enterprise Information Technology to designate another primary data center; if warranted.
 - Required all agency computing facilities and data centers to be consolidated into a primary data center by 2019.

Legislation

- 2011 Legislature amended state center data system law:
 - Established Northwest Regional Data Center as primary data center for its state agency customers.
 - Established agency data center consolidation schedule in law & defined consolidation planning and transition process.
- 2012 Legislature amended state center data system law:
 - Modified agency data center consolidation schedule & authorized certain agencies to be exempt from consolidation.
 - Modified certain duties of a primary data center & aligned the centers' cost projection schedule with state budget process and schedule.

Southwood Shared Resource Center (SSRC)

- Located at Capital Circle Office Complex; state owned facility and managed by its board of trustees.
- Certified as a Tier III facility by the Uptime Institute (professional data center research, consultant, and certification organization).
 - Tier III data center facility means facility provides 99.982% availability.
- Total number of state agency customers = 24
- High availability area (primary systems + 2 backup systems
 - Current remaining capacity = 38% floor space & 29% power
 - Remaining capacity 7/1/13 = 50% space & 44% power
- Fault tolerant area (primary systems + 1 backup system)
 - Current remaining capacity = 62% floor space & 40% power
 - Remaining capacity 7/1/13 = 77% floor space & 54% power

Northwood Shared Resource Center (NSRC)

- Located at the Northwood Center; leased facility and operated by its board of trustees.
- Tier II data center facility.
 - Tier II data center facility means facility provides 99.741% availability.
- Total number of state agency customers = 12.
- Fault tolerant area (primary systems + 1 backup system)
 - Current remaining capacity = 71% floor space & 20% power
 - DCF is largest customer; 72% total revenue.

Northwest Regional Data Center (NWRDC)

- Located at Innovation Park; facility owned by FSU and operated by its policy board.
- Tier II data center facility.
 - Tier II data center facility means facility provides 99.741% availability.
- ▶ Total number of state agency customers = 8.
 - DOE largest customer; 5 of 8 customers under \$32,000 annually
- High availability area (primary systems + 2 backup system)
 - Current remaining capacity = 17% floor space & 10% power
 - Remaining capacity after FY 2013-14 = 11% floor space

Consolidations Thru FY 2012-13

Since FY 2009-1010:

- 16 agency data centers have been consolidated into a primary data center.
- 7 agencies are scheduled for consolidation in FY 2013-14.

• For FY 2009-10:

- Full service transfer transfer the resources (primarily staff) for those agencies that already had data center equipment located at a primary data center.
- Cost savings = (\$1,673,000)
 - (\$300,000) decrease number of SUNCOM lines @ SSRC
 - (\$1,373,000) decrease in direct & indirect costs @ SSRC

Initial Lessons Learned

- Primary data centers must receive accurate and complete agency data center inventory information.
- Agencies scheduled for consolidation should work with their planned primary data center and only purchase hardware and software that complies with that primary data center's standards.
- Full cost savings can <u>only</u> be realized once primary data centers have standardized and consolidated within their facilities.

Data Center Consolidation Issues for Consideration

- It may be difficult for the State to utilize all available unused floor space at NSRC & SSRC.
 - NSRC has a total of 32,300 square feet with only 9,300 square feet currently being used.
 - "Server virtualization" and "cloud computing" are trends that will continue to decrease the amount of data center floor space that is needed.
 - Server virtualization = partitioning of a physical server into smaller virtual servers to help maximize your server resources.
 - Cloud computing = simply a way to describe how organizations can take some or all of their existing data center infrastructure and operations and hand it over to someone else.

Data Center Consolidation Issues for Consideration.

- Alignment of mission-critical services and applications with "high availability" area at the SSRC.
 - Identify the services and applications that cannot tolerate any downtime.
 - Research suggests that only about 15% of a state's total services and applications are mission-critical.
 - These services and applications should be housed at the SSRC.
 - Any non-mission critical services and applications in SSRC's "high availability" area should be in their fault tolerant area or moved to the NSRC.
- Disaster recovery is required by law to be provided by a primary data center; however, no current standard defining its statewide provision.
 - Agency responsible for establishing the standard failed to do so.
 - NSRC some agencies have not transferred their disaster recovery service upon their consolidation.
 - SSRC majority of agencies have transferred their disaster recovery service; however, SSRC must manage/implement over 30 different disaster recovery plans.
