Section 3. Section 383.3362, Florida Statutes, is amended 25 26 to read: 383.3362 Sudden Unexpected Infant Death Syndrome.-27 FINDINGS AND INTENT. - The Legislature recognizes that 28 (1)29 more than 4,500 infants in the United States die suddenly and unexpectedly of no immediate or obvious cause. According to 30 statistics from the Department of Health, more than 200 infants 31 in this state experienced Sudden Unexpected Infant Death in 2010 32 33 sudden Infant death Syndrome, or SIDS, is a leading cause of death among children under the age of 1 year, both nationally 34 and in this state. The Legislature further recognizes that first 35 responders to emergency calls relating to such a death need 36 access to special training to better enable them to recognize 37 that such deaths may result from natural and accidental causes 38 or may be caused distinguish SIDS from death caused by criminal 39 acts and to appropriately interact with the deceased infant's 40 parents or caretakers. At the same time, the Legislature, 41 recognizing that the primary focus of first responders is to 42 carry out their assigned duties, intends to increase the 43 awareness of the possible causes of Sudden Unexpected Infant 44 Death SIDS by first responders, but in no way expand or take 45 away from their duties. Further, the Legislature recognizes the 46 importance of a multidisciplinary investigation and standardized 47

investigative protocols in cases of Sudden Unexpected Infant 48 Death standard protocol for review of SIDS deaths by medical 49 examiners and the importance of appropriate followup in cases of 50 certified or suspected SIDS deaths. Finally, the Legislature 51 52 finds that it is desirable to analyze existing data- and to conduct further research on, the possible causes of Sudden 53 Unexpected Infant Death SIDS and on how to reduce its incidence 54 lower the number of sudden infant deaths. 55

DEFINITION.-As used in this section, the term "Sudden 56 (2)Unexpected Infant Death Syndrome, " or "SUID, " "SIDS," means the 57 sudden unexpected death of an infant under 1 year of age while 58 in apparent good health whose death may have been a result of 59 natural or unnatural causes which remains unexplained after a 60 complete autopsy, death-scene investigation, and review of the 61 case history. The term includes only those deaths for which. 62 currently, there is no known cause or cure. 63

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(3) TRAINING.-

(a) The Legislature finds that an emergency medical
technician, a paramedic, a firefighter, or a law enforcement
officer is likely to be the first responder to a request for
assistance which is made immediately after the sudden unexpected
death of an infant. The Legislature further finds that these
first responders should be trained in appropriate responses to
sudden infant death.

(b) After January 1, 1995, The basic training programs
required for certification as an emergency medical technician, a
paramedic, a firefighter, or a law enforcement officer as
defined in s. 943.10, other than a correctional officer or a

Amendment No. 1 correctional probation officer, must include curriculum that 76 77 contains instruction on SUID Sudden Infant Death Syndrome. The Department of Health, in consultation with the (C) 78 79 Emergency Medical Services Advisory Council, the Firefighters Employment, Standards, and Training Council, the child 80 protection teams established in the Division of Children's 81 82 Medical Services, and the Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission, shall develop and adopt, by rule, 83 curriculum that is as part of the Centers for Disease Control 84 SUID Initiative which must that, at a minimum, includes training 85 in the nature of SIDS, standard procedures to be followed by law 86 enforcement agencies in investigating cases involving sudden 87 88 deaths of infants, and training in responding appropriately to the parents or caretakers who have requested assistance. 89 (4) AUTOPSIES.-90 The death of any infant younger than 1 year of age who (a) 91 92 dies suddenly and unexpectedly while in apparent good health falls under the jurisdiction of the medical examiner as provided 93 94 in s. 406.11 The medical examiner must perform an autopsy upon any infant under the age of 1 year who is suspected to have died 95 of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome. If an autopsy is performed, it 96 The autopsy must be performed within 48 24 hours after the death 97 or as soon thereafter as is feasible. When the medical 98 99 examiner's findings are consistent with the definition of sudden infant death syndrome in subsection (2), the medical examiner 100 must state on the death certificate that sudden infant death 101 102 syndrome was the cause of death. The Medical Examiners Commission shall provide for the 103 (b)

development and implementation of develop and implement a 104 protocol for the medicolegal investigation of SUID dealing with 105 suspected sudden infant death syndrome. The protocol must be 106 followed by all medical examiners when conducting the autopsies 107 required under this subsection. The protocol may include 108 requirements and standards for scene investigations, 109 110 requirements for specific data, criteria for any specific tissue sampling, and any other requirements that are deemed 111 ascertaining cause of death based on the autopsy, criteria for 112 any specific tissue sampling, and any other requirements that 113 the commission considers necessary. 114

(c) A medical examiner is not liable for damages in a civil action for any act or omission done in compliance with this subsection.

(d) An autopsy must be performed under the authority of a medical examiner under s. 406.11.

(5) DEPARTMENT DUTIES RELATING TO SUDDEN <u>UNEXPECTED</u> INFANT DEATH <u>(SUID)</u> <del>SYNDROME (SIDS)</del>.—The Department of Health, in consultation with the child protection teams established in the Division of Children's Medical Services, shall:

(a) Collaborate with other agencies in the development and
presentation of the <u>SUID</u> Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS)
training programs for first responders, including those for
emergency medical technicians and paramedics, firefighters, and
law enforcement officers.

(b) Maintain a database of statistics on reported <u>SUID</u> 130 SIDS deaths, and analyze the data as funds allow.
