- (6) "Surgery" means a procedure using an instrument, including a laser, needle or scalpel, to cut, burn, vaporize, remove, or otherwise alter human tissue by incision, injection, ultrasound, radiation, infusion, cryotherapy, or scraping. The term also includes a procedure requiring closure by suture, clamp, adhesive or any other such method.
- (7)(5) "Optometry" means the diagnosis of conditions of the human eye and its appendages; the employment of any objective or subjective means or methods, including the administration of topical ocular pharmaceutical agents, for the purpose of determining the refractive powers of the human eyes, or any visual, muscular, neurological, or anatomic anomalies of the human eyes and their appendages; and the prescribing and employment of lenses, prisms, frames, mountings, contact lenses, orthoptic exercises, light frequencies, and any other means or methods, including topical ocular pharmaceutical agents, for the correction, remedy, or relief of any insufficiencies or abnormal conditions of the human eyes and their appendages.

- (g) Administration and prescription of topical ocular pharmaceutical agents.

- (b) Before a certified optometrist may administer or prescribe oral ocular pharmaceutical agents, the certified optometrist must send proof to the department of successful completion of a course and subsequent examination on general and ocular pharmaceutical agents and the side effects of those agents. 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licensed pursuant to chapter 458, chapter 459, or this chapter, appointed by the State Surgeon General. The committee shall review requests for additions to, deletions from, or modifications of a formulary of topical ocular pharmaceutical agents for administration and prescription by certified optometrists and shall provide to the board advisory opinions and recommendations on such requests. The advisory opinions and recommendations must state specific findings of fact and grounds for its recommendation, and are not subject to review pursuant to ss. 120.569 and 120.57. The formulary shall consist of those topical ocular pharmaceutical agents that which are appropriate to treat and diagnose ocular diseases and disorders and which the certified optometrist is qualified to use in the practice of optometry. The board shall establish, add to, delete from, or modify the formulary by rule. The board is bound by the committee's advisory opinions and recommendations on oral ocular pharmaceutical agents unless competent substantial evidence is presented to the board sufficient to rebut the committee's advisory opinion and recommendation. Notwithstanding any provision of chapter 120 to the contrary, the formulary rule becomes shall become effective 60 days from the date it is filed with the Secretary of State.

(b) The formulary may be added to, deleted from, or modified according to the procedure described in paragraph (a). Any person who requests an addition, deletion, or modification of an authorized topical ocular pharmaceutical agent shall have the burden of proof to show cause why such addition, deletion, or modification should be made.



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- (c) The State Surgeon General shall have standing to challenge any rule or proposed rule of the board pursuant to s. 120.56. In addition to challenges for any invalid exercise of delegated legislative authority, the administrative law judge, upon such a challenge by the State Surgeon General, may declare all or part of a rule or proposed rule invalid if it:
- 1. Does not protect the public from any significant and discernible harm or damages;
- 2. Unreasonably restricts competition or the availability of professional services in the state or in a significant part of the state; or
- 3. Unnecessarily increases the cost of professional services without a corresponding or equivalent public benefit.

However, there shall not be created a presumption of the existence of any of the conditions cited in this subsection in the event that the rule or proposed rule is challenged.

- (d) Upon adoption of the formulary required by this section, and upon each addition, deletion, or modification to the formulary, the board shall mail a copy of the amended formulary to each certified optometrist and to each pharmacy licensed by the state.
- (3) A certified optometrist shall be issued a prescriber number by the board. Any prescription written by a certified optometrist for <u>an</u> a topical ocular pharmaceutical agent pursuant to this section shall have the prescriber number printed thereon.

The transfer of care letter shall confirm that it is not medically necessary for the physician who performed the surgery to provide such postoperative care to the patient, and that it is clinically appropriate for the licensed practitioner to provide such postoperative care. Before comanagement of post-operative care commences, the patient shall be informed in writing that he or she has the right to be seen by the physician who performed the surgery during the entire postoperative period. In addition, the patient must be informed of the fees, if any, to be charged by the licensed practitioner and the physician performing the surgery, and must be provided with an accurate and comprehensive itemized statement of the specific postoperative-care services that the physician performing the surgery and the licensed practitioner render, along with the charge for each service.
