Amendment (with title amendment)

Remove lines 187-260 and insert:

Section 3. Paragraph (k) is added to subsection (1) of section 30.15, Florida Statutes, to read:

30.15 Powers, duties, and obligations.—

(1) Sheriffs, in their respective counties, in person or by deputy, shall:

(k) Establish a school marshal program to aid in the prevention or abatement of active assailant incidents on school premises. The sheriff shall appoint as school marshals, without the power of arrest, school employees who:

1. Hold a valid license issued under s. 790.06.

2. Complete 132 total hours of comprehensive firearm

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17 safety and proficiency training, which must include:

18 a. Eighty hours of firearms instruction based on the CJSTC
19 Law Enforcement Academy training model, which must include at
20 least 10 percent but no more than 20 percent more rounds fired
21 than associated with academy training. Program participants must
22 achieve an 85 percent pass rate on the firearms training.

23 b. Sixteen hours of instruction in precision pistol.

24 c. Eight hours of discretionary shooting instruction using
25 state-of-the-art simulator exercises.

26 d. Eight hours of instruction in active shooter or
27 assailant.

28 e. Eight hours of instruction in defensive tactics.

29 f. Twelve hours of instruction in legal issues.

30 3. Pass a psychological evaluation administered by a
31 psychologist licensed under chapter 490 and designated by the
32 Department of Law Enforcement and submit the results of the
33 evaluation to the sheriff's office. The Department of Law
34 Enforcement is authorized to provide the sheriff's office with
35 mental health and substance abuse data for compliance with this
36 subsection.

37 4. Submit to a drug test in accordance with the
38 requirements of s. 112.0455 and the sheriff's office.

40 The sheriff shall issue a school marshal certificate to
41 individuals who meet the requirements of subparagraph 2. The

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42 sheriff shall maintain documentation of weapon and equipment
43 inspections, as well as the training, certification, inspection,
44 and qualification records of each school marshal appointed by
45 the sheriff.

46 Section 2. Section 166.0495, Florida Statutes, is amended
47 to read:

48 166.0495 ~~Interlocal~~ Agreements to provide law enforcement
49 services.—

50 (1) A municipality may enter into an interlocal agreement
51 pursuant to s. 163.01 with an adjoining municipality or
52 municipalities within the same county to provide law enforcement
53 services within the territorial boundaries of the other
54 adjoining municipality or municipalities. Any such agreement
55 shall specify the duration of the agreement and shall comply
56 with s. 112.0515, if applicable. The authority granted a
57 municipality under this section is in addition to and not in
58 limitation of any other authority granted a municipality to
59 enter into agreements for law enforcement services or to conduct
60 law enforcement activities outside the territorial boundaries of
61 the municipality.

62 (2) If a sheriff fails to establish a school marshal
63 program as required by s. 30.15(1)(k), a municipality shall
64 establish a school marshal program to aid in the prevention or
65 abatement of active assailant incidents on school premises. The
66 chief of police of a municipal law enforcement agency shall

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67 appoint as school marshals, without the power of arrest, school
68 employees who:

69 (a) Hold a valid license issued under s. 790.06.

70 (b) Complete 132 total hours of comprehensive firearm
71 safety and proficiency training, which must include:

72 1. Eighty hours of firearms instruction based on the CJSTC
73 Law Enforcement Academy training model, which must include at
74 least 10 percent but no more than 20 percent more rounds fired
75 than associated with academy training. Program participants must

77 2. Sixteen hours of instruction in precision pistol.

85 licensed under chapter 490 and designated by the Department of
86 Law Enforcement and submit the results of the evaluation to the
87 sheriff's office. The Department of Law Enforcement is
88 authorized to provide the sheriff's office with mental health
89 and substance abuse data for compliance with this subsection.

90 (d) Submit to a drug test in accordance with the
91 requirements of s. 112.0455 and the sheriff's office.

93 The chief of police shall issue a school marshal certificate to
94 individuals who meet the requirements of paragraph (b). The
95 chief of police shall maintain documentation of weapon and
96 equipment inspections, as well as the training, certification,
97 inspection, and qualification records of each school marshal
