

Legislature further finds that impact fees are an outgrowth of the home rule power of a local government to provide certain services within its jurisdiction. Due to the growth of impact fee collections and local governments' reliance on impact fees, it is the intent of the Legislature to ensure that, when a county or municipality adopts an impact fee by ordinance or a special district adopts an impact fee by resolution, the governing authority complies with this section.

- At a minimum, impact fees An impact fee adopted by ordinance of a county or municipality or by resolution of a special district must, at minimum satisfy the following conditions:
- Require that The calculation of the impact fees must fee be based on the most recent and localized data.
- The local government must provide for accounting and reporting of impact fee collections and expenditures. If a local governmental entity imposes an impact fee to address its infrastructure needs, the entity shall account for the revenues and expenditures of such impact fee in a separate accounting fund.
- Limit Administrative charges for the collection of impact fees must be limited to actual costs.
- Require that Notice must be provided no less than 90 days before the effective date of an ordinance or resolution imposing a new or increased impact fees fee. A county or

municipality is not required to wait 90 days to decrease, suspend, or eliminate an impact fees fee.

- (e) Collection of the impact fees may not occur earlier than the issuance of the building permit for the property that is subject to the fee.
- (f) The impact fee must be reasonably connected to, or have a rational nexus with, the need for additional capital facilities and the increased impact generated by the new residential or commercial construction.
- (g) The impact fee must be reasonably connected to, or have a rational nexus with, the expenditures of the funds collected and the benefits accruing to the new residential or commercial construction.
- (h) The local government must specifically earmark funds collected by the impact fees for use in acquiring capital facilities to benefit the new residents.



STUDY OVERVIEW

To provide a consistent comparison of Florida's defense industry over time, this 2017 update utilizes the same econometric forecasting models and defense-related spending flows as previous studies. However, in order to bring higher fidelity to our estimates, this update incorporates distribution data from the U.S. Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) for National Guard personnel compensation estimates. Over time, these data are more stable than the U.S. Census data utilized in previous updates. The use of these data do not affect the total statewide impact estimates - only how the impacts associated with the National Guard are distributed across the state: otherwise, this update utilizes the same methodologies, data, and econometric models as in previous updates. This includes using the REMI PI+ 70 sector model to estimate total economic impacts at the state and county levels. As in previous years, the study relies primarily on data from the REMI model, U.S. Department of Treasury (USASpending), Department of Defense, Department of Veterans Affairs, Department of Homeland Security, Florida National Guard, DoD Base Structures Report, DoD Green Book, Census Bureau, Bureau of Economic Analysis, and Bureau of Labor Statistics.

The figure below outlines the major differences in direct inputs between the 2011, 2014, and 2016 updates. As the figure shows, procurement (contracts) flows to the state have increased by over 36.5%. Salaries to military personnel remained relatively stable, decreasing overall by 2.5%. And, transfer payments through military retirement checks and Veterans Affairs benefits, increased by 7.6%. Thus, given these overall changes, the impacts presented here are higher than those offered in previous updates.




IMPACTS BY THE NUMBERS


Florida hosts a variety of missions that are critical to our Nation's defense. Air, land, and sea training areas and ranges associated with the Joint Gulf Range Complex host large, complex joint exercises that allow the services to train like they will fight, thus bringing tremendous advantages to our military.

Florida is home to three of ten unified combatant commands, hosts two of only four Navy deep water ports in the U.S. with adjacent airfields, the military's only east coast space launch facility, the Marine Corps's only maritime prepositioning force facility, and one of only three Navy Fleet Readiness Centers, as well as several critical research, development, training, and evaluation (RDT&E) centers. The DoD's strategy emphasizes rapidly deployable joint forces, joint training, access to space, special operations, precision strike, and research & development.

Additionally, the Joint Gulf Range Complex connects test and training ranges that extend from Key West to Northwest Florida and across the eastern Gulf of Mexico. It includes 180,000 square miles of DoD controlled airspace, as well as 724 sq. miles of adjacent land ranges, 3,200 sq. miles of airspace over adjacent land, 17 miles of shoreline access, interconnected radars and 2 launch areas for missiles. The training area contains multiple live-fire bombing ranges, including Pinecastle Range, Avon Park Air Force Range and the Eglin Bombing Range, that allow for simultaneous maritime, air, and land training exercises. Due to its tremendous capabilities and Florida's commitment to partnership, the Complex is an integral part of DoD's Training Resources Strategy.

Total Employment Impacts of Defense Activities



was responsible for \$84.9 Billion, or 9.2 percent, of Florida's gross state product. Total defense spending also accounted for just over 800,000 jobs across the state - many of which are associated with a wage premium. For example, over \$4.4 Billion was directly spent in Aerospace Product and Parts Manufacturing. This accounts for over 10,000 direct jobs, which pay an average salary of over \$89,000. This industry pays approximately 85% higher than the state average of \$47,055. Defense spending creates jobs in every county in Florida. 




he Southwest Region is composed of three counties and is home to no major military installations. Regardless, the region benefits from military personnel (active, civilian, Guard, or Reserve), veterans, and military retirees who reside in the area. Close proximity to both the Tampa Bay and Southeast regions generated economic spill-over effects which led to the region receiving \$965 Million in total dense spending during 2016. These revenues, in turn, generated more than 23,600 jobs and accounted for \$1.9 Billion in Gross Regional Product, which is roughly 3.9% of the region's total.

With over 1.5 million veterans and nearly 200,000 military retirees, Florida maintains the 3rd and 2nd largest veteran and retiree population in the U.S., respectively. In addition to the \$18 Billion in transfer payments these special populations attract to the state annually, veterans and military retirees provide a competitive advantage to Florida's workforce. Due to their knowledge, skills, and leadership abilities, many national firms, such as Amazon, focus on hiring former military. High concentrations of veterans and military retirees can act as business recruitment tools for states and local economic development organizations.

Florida maintains a veteran population 20% more concentrated than the U.S. and a military retiree population that is 50% more concentrated – thus making Florida a highly desirable state for businesses to expand and/or relocate due to its workforce competitiveness.
