# **Updated and New Proviso:**

#### **Department of Business and Professional Regulation**

#### Specific Appropriation 2076

#### Specific Appropriation 2113

From the funds provided in Specific Appropriation XXXX, the Department of Business and Professional Regulation may purchase one or more vehicles for replacement when the mileage of a vehicle is in excess of <u>150,000</u> <del>200,000</del> miles, or based on an emergency or unforeseen circumstances as provided for in section 287.14(3), Florida Statutes.

#### **Department of Financial Services**

#### Specific Appropriation 2324

From the funds provided in Specific Appropriation 2374, the Department of Financial Services may purchase one or more vehicles for replacement when the mileage of a vehicle is in excess of <u>150,000</u> <del>200,000</del> miles, or based on an emergency or unforeseen circumstances as provided for in section 287.14(3), Florida Statutes.

#### **Specific Appropriation 2333**

Funds <del>provided</del> in Specific Appropriation 2333, from the Insurance Regulatory Trust Funds are provided for transfer to the Justice Administrative Commission for the specific purpose of funding attorneys and paralegals dedicated solely to the prosecution of insurance fraud cases in Duval, Orange, Miami-Dade, Hillsborough, Palm Beach, and Broward counties. These funds may not be used for any purpose other than the funding of <u>attorney and paralegal</u> positions <del>and activities</del> that prosecute crimes of insurance fraud.

#### Specific Appropriation 2341A

From the funds in Specific Appropriation 2341A, \$250,000 is provided to complete the study authorized in chapter 2004-390, Laws of Florida, regarding the factors affecting premium levels and availability of personal lines property and casualty insurance.

From the funds in Specific Appropriation 2341A, \$700,000 is provided to meet the requirements set forth in section 1004.647, Florida Statutes.

#### **Specific Appropriation 2357**

The funds <del>provided</del> in Specific Appropriation 2357, from the Workers' Compensation Administration Trust Fund are provided for transfer to the Justice Administrative Commission for the specific purpose of funding attorneys and paralegals in the Eleventh <u>and Thirteenth</u> Judicial Circuits for the prosecution of workers' compensation insurance fraud. These funds may not be used for any purpose of other than the funding of <u>attorney and paralegal</u> positions <del>and activities that</del> prosecute crimes of workers' compensation fraud.

#### **Department of the Lottery**

#### Specific Appropriation 2560A

From the funds provided in Specific Appropriation 2560A, the Department of the Lottery may purchase one or more vehicles for replacement when the mileage of a vehicle is in excess of <u>150,000</u> <del>200,000</del> miles, or based on an emergency or unforeseen circumstances as provided for in section 287.14(3), Florida Statutes.

#### **Department of Management Services**

#### **Specific Appropriation 2704**

From the funds provided in Specific Appropriation 2704, the Division of Telecommunications shall submit a business case plan that addresses, at a minimum, the requirements set forth in section 287.0571, Florida Statutes, for the competitive solicitation of a vendor to provide services such as, but not limited to, equipment usage and maintenance, system management, and technical support for the Statewide Law Enforcement Radio System. The plan shall also include contracting alternatives for the implementation of new technology. The plan shall be provided to the chair of the Senate Budget Subcommittee on General Government Appropriations and the chair of the House government Operations Appropriations Subcommittee by March 1, 2011.

#### **Specific Appropriation 2690**

From the funds provided in Specific Appropriation 2690, the department shall prepare a benchmark comparison of the current rates for the MyFloridaNet services with rates for comparable services available in the telecommunications market, and recommendations for improving the effectiveness and efficiency of services. The department shall submit the benchmark report to the chairs Senate Budget Subcommittee on General Government Appropriations and the House Government Operations Appropriations Subcommittee by January 1, 2012.

#### Insurance Benefits Administration – post payment claims services

The department is authorized to submit budget amendments in accordance with chapter 216, Florida Statutes, to increase Specific Appropriation XXXX in the event the contractor identifies claim overpayments that result in compensation that exceeds the amount appropriated.

# New Back of the Bill:

The unexpended balance of fixed capital outlay funds appropriated to the Department of Management Services in Specific Appropriation 2814A of chapter 2008-152, Laws of Florida, for construction of the First District Court of Appeal Courthouse shall immediately revert and be transferred to the Workers' Compensation Administration Trust Fund within the Department of Financial Services. This section shall take effect upon this act becoming law.

There is hereby appropriated \$1,375,000 in nonrecurring funds from the Operating Trust Fund in the Department of the Lottery for Fiscal Year 2010-2011. The department shall use the funds for the online games contract. This section shall take effect upon this act becoming law.

The Division of Risk Management shall use the funds for the purchase of excess insurance related to state buildings and facilities. This section shall take effect upon this act becoming law.
