1	Transfer Agency for Enterprise Information Technology (AEIT) to DMS	Not in House Bill	Transfers establishment of AEIT from Executive Office of Governor to Department of Management Services and requires AEIT to review all IT purchases in excess of \$10,000 and recommend areas suitable for aggregation & standardization to the LBC.	House Position
2	Technical Correction	Technical correction that changes Justice Data Center to the Office of Information Technology in the Department of Corrections.	Not in Senate Bill.	House Position
3	Delete Definition	Deletes definition for agency CIO.	Not in Senate Bill.	House Position
4	Recommend Standards for Data Center Energy Efficiency	Not in House Bill	Requires AEIT to submit every 3 years, instead of every year, recommendations for reducing energy consumption and deletes obsolete reference.	Senate Position
5	Implement Statewide Email Service	Not in House Bill	Requires all state agencies to be migrated to enterprise email service by 12/31/12; changes implementation schedule from 4 phases to 2 phases and identifies agencies in each phase; requires AEIT to submit implementation plan to Legislature by 7/1/11 or 120 calendar days after contract is signed, whichever is later; clarifies agency limitations; adds additional components to the email rule AEIT is required to adopt. 7	Modify Agency Use of State Term Contracts & Purchasing Agreements	Not in House Bill	Requires DMS to adopt rules establishing the conditions under which an agency may be exempt from using a state term contract or purchasing agreement; deletes provision that provides agencies the option to use state term contracts. 8	Transfer Northwood Shared Resource Center (NSRC) To DMS	Not in House Bill	Transfers establishment of NSRC to DMS.	Senate Position
