Provides for retroactive application. Provides a statement of public necessity. Effective Date: contingent

Supreme Court; Proposes amendments to ss. 2, 3, 4, 7, 11, 12, & 14, Art. V, s. 17, Art. III, & ss. 3 & 10, Art. IV, & creation of s. 21, Art. V, of State Constitution to divide current Supreme Court into two divisions, one hearing civil cases & other hearing criminal cases; provides for administration of divisions; defines jurisdiction of divisions; provides for transition from present Supreme Court; revises provisions relating to repeal of court rules; limits readoption of repealed court rule; provides for Senate confirmation of Supreme Court justices; expands jurisdiction of Supreme Court; requires JQC to make all of its files available to House Speaker; requires that specified minimum percentage of general revenue funds be appropriated to courts; makes other conforming & modernizing changes.

CS/HB 7199 by Judiciary Committee, Civil Justice Subcommittee, Eisnaugle (Compare HB 4137, CS/HB 7023, HB 7113, CS/CS/SB 170, SB 962, SB 1398)

**Courts:** Provides for divisions of Supreme Court & jurisdiction; authorizes collaboration with other courts; repeals provisions relating to collaboration by Supreme Court with other courts, terms of Supreme Court, practice of law by retired justices of Supreme Court, clerk of Supreme Court, appointment of deputy clerk, location of clerk's office, custody of books, papers, records, files, & seal, & duties of clerk; provides duties of clerk of Supreme Court; revises provisions relating to marshal of Supreme Court; repeals provisions relating to Supreme Court marshal's power to execute process; provides for location of Supreme Court Building; repeals provisions relating to compensation of marshal of Supreme Court, deposit of fines for contempt of Supreme Court, library of Supreme Court, acquisition of books for library of Supreme Court, & effect of court rules: exempts State Courts Revenue Trust Fund from provisions relating to transfer of unappropriated cash balances; revises provisions relating to allocation of space in Supreme

Court Building; provides contingent appropriation. Effective Date: on the effective date of House Joint Resolution 7111, or a similar joint resolution having substantially the same specific intent and purpose, if that joint resolution is approved by the electors at the general election to be held in November 2012

Effective Date: July 1, 2011

CS/HB 7023 by Judiciary Committee, Civil Justice Subcommittee, Steube (Compare CS/HB 7199, SB 1398)

**Judiciary**; Repeals provisions relating to regular terms of Supreme Court; repeals provisions relating to terms of circuit courts; allows Supreme Court to set terms of court for Supreme Court, district courts of appeal, & circuit courts; provides that appellate courts may withdraw mandate within 120 days after issuance; conforms provisions. Effective Date: January 1, 2012

Judiciary Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

#### HB 7119 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Passidomo

**District Courts of Appeal;** Repeals provisions relating to requirement that district court sit in three judge panels & have majority for decision & requirement that clerk of district court perform duties prescribed by rule of court. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Judiciary Committee: Favorable

**HB 7115** by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Bernard (Compare SB 1398)

**Judicial Census Commissions;** Repeals provisions relating to judicial census commissions. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Judiciary Committee: Favorable
