OGSR/DJJ Employees and Family Members; Removes scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act of exemption from public records requirements for identification & location information of certain current & former employees of DJJ & their family members; revises job classifications specified in exemption to reflect those classifications used by DJJ. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

HB 7077 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Logan (Identical SB 602)

OGSR/Biometric Identification Information; Removes scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act of exemption from public records requirements for biometric identification information held by agency. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

HB 7079 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Bileca (Similar SB 420)

OGSR/Florida Center for Brain Tumor Research; Provides exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information of donor to central repository for brain tumor biopsies or brain tumor registry of Florida Center for Brain Tumor Research; provides for retroactive application of exemption; provides exception to exemption; provides for future review & repeal; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 7081 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Bileca (Identical CS/SB 572)

OGSR/Statewide Public Guardianship Office; Removes scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act of exemption from public records requirements for information that identifies certain donors or prospective donors to direct-support organization for Statewide Public Guardianship Office; removes superfluous & duplicative language. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

HB 7083 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Young (Identical SB 570)

OGSR/Interference with Custody; Removes scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act of public records exemption for information submitted to sheriff or state attorney for purpose of obtaining immunity from prosecution for offense of interference with custody. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

State Affairs Committee: Favorable

HB 7085 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Young (Identical SB 568)

OGSR/Court Monitors in Guardianship Proceedings;

Removes scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act of exemption from public records requirements for court records relating to court monitors in guardianship proceedings; consolidates provisions; provides that orders appointing nonemergency court monitors are exempt rather than confidential & exempt; provides that only court orders finding no probable cause are confidential & exempt. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

HB 7159 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Patronis (Similar SB 2056)

OGSR/Commission on Ethics Audits & Investigations;

Removes from scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act exemption from public records & public meetings requirements for certain audits & investigations conducted by Commission on Ethics; reorganizes exemptions & makes editorial changes. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

HB 7161 by Government Operations Subcommittee, **Patronis** (Similar SB 604)

OGSR/Concealed Weapons or Firearms; Removes from scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act an exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information of an applicant for or recipient of a license to carry a concealed weapon or firearm. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

State Affairs Committee: Favorable

CS/HB 7223 by State Affairs Committee, Government Operations Subcommittee, Patronis (Similar CS/SB 2090)

OGSR/Competitive Solicitations; Provides exemption from public records requirements for bids, proposals, or replies submitted to an agency in response to competitive solicitation; expands exemption by extending its duration; provides for future review & repeal; revises provisions that provide exemption from public meetings requirements for meetings at which negotiation with vendor is conducted & which provides exemption from public records requirements for recordings of exempt meetings; expands public meetings exemption to include specified meetings; expands public records exemption to include any records presented at exempt meeting; provides for future review & repeal of exemptions; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 7225 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Patronis, Williams, T. (Similar SB 2174)

OGSR/SBA Alternative Investments; Removes from scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act an exemption from public records requirements for SBA; specifies information that does not constitute proprietary confidential business information held by SBA; requires SBA to maintain written list of records covered under verified, written declaration. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

Ad Valorem Taxation; Reduces amount that any change in value of nonhomestead residential property resulting from annual reassessment may exceed assessed value of property for prior year; reduces amount that any change in value of certain residential & nonresidential real property resulting from annual reassessment may exceed assessed value of property for prior

year; provides first-time Florida homesteader with additional homestead exemption; provides for calculation of exemption; provides for applicability period of exemption; provides for annual reduction in exemption during applicability period; provides application procedures; provides for applicability of specified provisions; provides for contingent effect of provisions & varying dates of application depending on adoption & adoption date of specified joint resolutions; authorizes DOR to adopt emergency rules; provides for application & renewal of emergency rules; requires Legislature to consider appropriating funds to fiscally constrained counties to offset reductions in ad valorem tax revenue as result of implementation of certain revisions to State Constitution; requires application to DOR to participate in distribution of such appropriation; provides for certain contingent effect & retroactive application. Additional Homestead Exemption; Property Value Decline; Reduction for Nonhomestead Assessment Increases; Abrogation of Scheduled Repeal; Proposes amendments to State Constitution to allow Legislature by general law to prohibit increases in assessed value of homestead & specified nonhomestead property if just value of property decreases, reduce limitation on annual assessment increases applicable to nonhomestead real property, provide additional homestead exemption for owners of homestead property who have not owned homestead property for specified time before purchase of current homestead property, & application & limitations with respect thereto, delete future repeal of provisions limiting annual assessment increases for specified nonhomestead real property, & provide effective dates.

Ad Valorem Tax Exemption for Deployed Servicemembers; Provides for servicemembers who receive homestead exemption & who are deployed in military operation to receive additional ad valorem tax exemption; designates military operations to receive additional ad valorem tax exemption; requires DOR to

notify property appraisers & tax collectors of designated military operations; requires Department of Military Affairs to submit report annually of military operations to Legislature & tax committees of Legislature; specifies calculation to be used in determining exemption amount; requires that servicemember apply to property appraiser to receive exemption in year following year of qualifying deployment; provides for application forms to be prescribed by DOR & furnished to applicant by property appraiser; authorizes certain persons to apply to property appraiser to receive exemption on behalf of servicemember; requires consideration of applications within certain time; requires person appealing denial of deployed service member exemption to value adjustment board to file appeal within certain time; provides requirements for forms used for exemption for deployed servicemembers; authorizes DOR to adopt emergency rules; provides for application of act to qualifying deployments in 2010; provides for act to apply to tax rolls beginning 2011. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Value Adjustment Boards; Requires petitioner challenging assessed value of property before value adjustment board to pay specified percentage of taxes by certain date; requires petitioner challenging denial of classification or exemption, or assessment on specified grounds, before value adjustment board to pay amount of tax which taxpayer admits in good faith to be owing by certain date; provides for penalty if good faith payment is grossly disproportionate to amount of tax found to be due & taxpayer's admission was not made in good faith; requires board to deny petition in writing by certain date if required amount of taxes is not timely paid; requires payment of interest on certain unpaid taxes; requires payment of interest on certain overpayments of taxes; provides for discount for ad valorem taxes paid within 30 days after mailing of corrected tax notice resulting from action of value adjustment board when corrected tax notice is issued before taxes become delinquent. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, and shall apply to petitions filed with value adjustment boards on or after July 1, 2011

CS/CS/CS/HB 311 by Economic Affairs Committee, Finance & Tax Committee, Business & Consumer Affairs Subcommittee, Roberson, K., Caldwell, Gaetz, Kreegel, Van Zant (Similar CS/CS/SB 582)

Local Business Taxes; Defines term "independent contractor"; exempts individual engaging in or managing business as employee from local business tax requirements; specifies that individual licensed & operating as broker associate or sales associate is employee; specifies that independent contractor is

not employee; prohibits local authorities from holding exempt employee liable for failure of principal or employer to comply with local business tax obligations or requiring exempt employee to take certain actions; prohibits local authorities from requiring principal or employer to provide personal or contact information for exempt individuals; provides exemption does not apply to business taxes imposed by municipalities or counties on individual employees pursuant to resolution or ordinance adopted before October 13, 2010; requires person applying for or renewing local business tax receipt to engage in or manage business or occupation regulated by Florida Supreme Court or state agency to exhibit certain documentation; authorizes online renewals as means of providing electronic certifications that meet such requirement; deletes requirement that DBPR provide certain professional regulation information to local officials issuing receipts; deletes provision prohibiting official issuing business tax receipts from renewing license. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Tax on Sales, Use, & Other Transactions; Provides definitions relating to tourist development tax & tourist impact tax, transient rentals tax & convention development tax, & municipal resort tax; provides separate statement of tax requirements on various documents; revises requirements for charging, collecting, & remitting such taxes; authorizes DOR to compensate county governments for providing specified information; specifies payment amount; provides definitions relating to municipal resort tax; provides separate statement of tax requirements; provides exception; provides construction. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Finance & Tax Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

CS/CS/CS/HB 887 by State Affairs Committee, Finance & Tax Committee, Energy & Utilities Subcommittee, Dorworth, Van Zant, Williams, T. (Identical CS/CS/SB 1198)

Communications Services Tax; Requires that dealer compute communications services tax based on rounding algorithm; provides criteria; provides for application of tax; provides options to dealer for applying rounding algorithm; authorizes dealer to apply rounding algorithm to aggregate tax amount under certain conditions; provides that dealer is not required to collect tax based on bracket system; removes provision requiring DOR to make available tax amounts & applicable brackets; provides that provisions of act are remedial in nature & apply retroactively; provides that act does not provide basis for assessment of tax not paid or create right to certain refunds or credits. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

CS/HB 243 by Finance & Tax Committee, Workman (Similar CS/SB 384)

Tangible Personal Property Taxation; Authorizes collection of tangible personal property tax recovery fee by person engaging in business of renting or leasing heavy equipment; provides requirements for collection & retention; prohibits additional recoupment of recovery fee in current year under certain circumstances; requires reduction in amount of recoupment of recovery fee for following year under certain circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Finance & Tax Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

HB 469 by Stargel, Ford (Identical SB 978)

Individual Retirement Accounts; Clarifies exemption of inherited individual retirement accounts from legal processes; provides intent; provides for retroactive application. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

CS/CS/CS/HB 599 by Economic Affairs Committee, Civil Justice Subcommittee, Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Passidomo (Similar CS/CS/SB 952)
