Trust Funds/State Economic Enhancement and Development Trust Fund; Creates State Economic Enhancement and Development Trust Fund within OTTED of EOG; provides for purpose & sources of trust fund; provides for future review & termination or re-creation of trust fund. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, but this act shall not take effect unless it is enacted by a three-fifths vote of the membership of each house of the Legislature
