Onsite Sewage Treatment and Disposal Systems; Revises legislative intent; eliminates provisions directing DOH to create & administer statewide septic tank evaluation program; eliminates procedures & criteria for evaluation program; terminates grant program for repair of onsite sewage treatment disposal systems identified pursuant to evaluation program, to conform; eliminates provisions authorizing DOH to collect evaluation report fee & provisions relating to disposition of fee proceeds & revenue-neutral fee schedule. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Violations of Injunctions for Protection; Adds circumstances that violate injunction for protection against repeat violence, sexual violence, or dating violence. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

CS/HB 105 by Judiciary Committee, Goodson, Baxley, Van Zant (Similar SB 746)

Open House Parties; Provides that person who violates open house party statute second or subsequent time commits misdemeanor of first degree; provides that person commits misdemeanor of first degree if violation of open house party statute causes serious bodily injury or death. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Judiciary Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

CS/HB 253 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Stargel, McBurney (Identical SB 1152)

Limited Liability Companies; Provides that charging order against member's limited liability interest is sole & exclusive remedy available to enforce judgment creditor's unsatisfied judgment against member or member's assignee with respect to limited liability company; provides exception for enforcing judgment creditor's unsatisfied judgment against judgment debtor or assignee of judgment debtor of single-member limited liability company under certain circumstances; provides legislative intent; provides for retroactive application. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Judiciary Committee: Favorable

HB 469 by Stargel, Ford (Identical SB 978)

Individual Retirement Accounts; Clarifies exemption of inherited individual retirement accounts from legal processes; provides intent; provides for retroactive application. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 4001 by Diaz, Campbell (Identical SB 1792)

Growth Policy; Repeals Urban Infill & Redevelopment Assistance Grant Program. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

HB 4007 by Workman (Identical SB 1684, Compare HB 1353, CS/SB 1150)

Driver Licenses; Repeals provisions relating to effect of classified licensure on persons holding chauffeur's license; repeals provisions for licensure of such persons under appropriate license classification. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

HB 4009 by Workman (Identical SB 1624, Compare HB 5005)

Outdoor Theaters; Repeals provisions relating to access to public roads from outdoor theaters; removes provisions for entrances, exits, enclosures, vehicle storage, screen orientation, tower location, & driveway lighting; removes requirements for issuance of occupational license by tax collector. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

CS/HB 4013 by Business & Consumer Affairs Subcommittee, Eisnaugle (Compare HB 5005, SB 1626)

Television Picture Tubes; Repeals provisions relating to television picture tube labeling requirements & misrepresentations of television picture tubes. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

HB 4019 by Workman (Identical SB 1630)

Traffic Offenses; Repeals provision that prohibits motor vehicle coasting on downgrade. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 4021 by Workman (Similar SB 1634, Compare HB 5005)

Water Vending Machines; Repeals provisions relating to regulation of water vending machines & permitting of water vending machine operators; deletes provisions for deposit of operator permitting fees, enforcement of state's water vending machine regulations, penalties, & preemption of county & municipal water vending machine regulations, to conform. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 4023 by Plakon (Identical SB 474, Compare HB 5005)

Sales Representative Contracts Involving Commissions; Repeals provisions relating to sales representative contracts involving commissions. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

HB 4029 by Horner (Identical SB 552)

Transportation Corporations; Repeals Florida Transportation Corporation Act to remove provisions that provide for nonprofit corporations to act on behalf of DOT to secure & obtain rights-of-way for transportation systems & to assist in planning & design of such systems; removes provision for audits of such corporations by Auditor General to conform. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 4031 by Dorworth, Campbell (Identical SB 1942)

Local Government Services; Repeals statute relating to efficiency & accountability in local government services. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Florida Industrial Development Corporation; Repeals provisions relating to Florida Industrial Development Corporation. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 4067 by McBurney (Identical SB 1100, Compare SB 1398)

Residence of Clerk of the Circuit Court; Repeals provisions relating to clerk of circuit court's place of residence. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 4077 by Dorworth (Identical SB 1774)

Transportation Corridors; Removes provisions that specify certain transportation facilities as statewide transportation corridors. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 4081 by Horner (Similar CS/HB 4099, Identical SB 636, Compare HB 1187, SB 1592)

Repeal of Obsolete Insurance Provisions; Deletes specified obsolete provisions of insurance law relating to transfer of funds from SBA to Citizens Property Insurance Corporation, Florida Automobile Joint Underwriting Association presuit notice, reporting of activities relating to sinkhole database, feasibility & cost-benefit study of Florida Sinkhole Insurance Facility & other matters related to affordability & availability of sinkhole insurance, & effective date for exclusion of windstorm & contents coverage. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 4083 by Albritton (Identical SB 1826, Compare HB 4073)

Workers' Compensation; Repeals provision relating to Workers' Compensation Administrator, to abolish position; deletes obsolete transitional requirement for certain policies of Florida Workers' Compensation Joint Underwriting Association. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

CS/HB 4099 by Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Nelson (Similar HB 4081, SB 636, Compare HB 1187, SB 1592)

Repeal of Property and Casualty Insurance Provisions; Deletes specified provisions of property & casualty insurance law relating to transfer of funds from SBA to Citizens Property Insurance Corporation; Florida Automobile Joint Underwriting Association presuit notice; aggregate net probable maximum losses, financing options, & potential assessments of Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund & Citizens Property Insurance Corporation; reporting of activities relating to sinkhole database, feasibility & cost-benefit study of Florida Sinkhole Insurance Facility & other matters related to affordability & availability of sinkhole insurance; & effective date for exclusion of windstorm & contents coverage. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 4129 by Crisafulli (Identical SB 638)

Residential Property Structural Soundness Evaluation Grant Program; Deletes obsolete Citizens Property Insurance Corporation residential property structural soundness evaluation grant program. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 4135 by McBurney (Identical SB 974, Compare SB 1398)

District Court Marshals; Repeals provisions relating to compensation of marshal. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 4137 by McBurney (Identical SB 962, Compare SB 1398)

Marshal of the Supreme Court; Repeals provisions relating to compensation of marshal. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 4147 by Porter

Recreation and Parks; Repeals provisions relating to recreation centers; use & acquisition of land, & equipment & maintenance; supervision; playground & recreation board; cooperation with other units & boards; gifts, grants, devises, & bequests; issuance of bonds; petition for referendum; resolution or ordinance providing for recreation system; tax levy; payment of expenses & custody of funds; & duties & functions of Division of Recreation & Parks of DEP. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 4149 by Porter (Compare HB 1231, SB 1524)

Regulation of Electronic Communications; Repeals provisions relating to regulation of telegraph companies; removes provisions relating to transmission & delivery of messages & liability & recovery of damages; removes procedures for petition to PSC to stay implementation of price changes due to local exchange telecommunications company electing to have its basic local telecommunications services treated same as its nonbasic services.
