**HB 101** by Cruz, Bernard, Berman, Campbell, Julien, Pilon, Schwartz, Watson (Identical SB 240)

**Violations of Injunctions for Protection;** Adds circumstances that violate injunction for protection against repeat violence, sexual violence, or dating violence. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**CS/SJR 2** by Budget, Haridopolos, Lynn, Wise, Gaetz, Dean, Benacquisto, Hays, Fasano, Bennett, Diaz de la Portilla, Oelrich, Negron, Storms, Evers, Flores, Simmons, Jones, Gardiner, Garcia, Alexander, Latvala, Altman, Thrasher, Detert, Norman, Richter, Dockery, Bogdanoff (Identical CS/CS/HJR 1)

**Health Care Services;** Proposes an amendment to the State Constitution to prohibit laws or rules from compelling any person or employer to purchase, obtain, or otherwise provide for health care coverage; permits a person or an employer to purchase lawful health care services directly from a health care provider; permits a health care provider to accept direct payment from a person or an employer for lawful health care services; etc.

**Ad Valorem Taxation;** Reduces amount by which any change in value of nonhomestead residential property resulting from annual reassessment may exceed assessed value of property for prior year; reduces amount by which any change in value of certain residential & nonresidential real property resulting from annual reassessment may exceed assessed value of property for prior year; provides first-time Florida homesteader with additional homestead exemption; provides for calculation of exemption; provides for applicability period of exemption; provides for annual reduction in exemption during applicability period; provides application procedures; provides for applicability of specified provisions; provides for contingent effect of provisions & varying dates of application depending on adoption & adoption date of specified joint resolutions; authorizes DOR to adopt emergency rules; provides for application & renewal of emergency rules; requires Legislature

to consider appropriating funds to fiscally constrained counties to offset reductions in ad valorem tax revenue as result of implementation of certain revisions to State Constitution; requires application to DOR to participate in distribution of such appropriation; provides for certain contingent effect & retroactive application. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**Additional Homestead Exemption; Property Value Decline; Reduction for Nonhomestead Assessment Increases; Abrogation of Scheduled Repeal;** Proposes amendments to State Constitution to allow Legislature by general law to prohibit increases in assessed value of homestead & specified nonhomestead property if just value of property decreases, reduce limitation on annual assessment increases applicable to nonhomestead real property, provide additional homestead exemption for owners of homestead property who have not owned homestead property for specified time before purchase of current homestead property, & application & limitations with respect thereto, delete future repeal of provisions limiting annual assessment increases for specified nonhomestead real property, & provide effective dates.

**Tax on Sales, Use, & Other Transactions;** Provides definitions relating to tourist development tax & tourist impact tax, transient rentals tax & convention development tax, & municipal resort tax; provides separate statement of tax requirements on various documents; revises requirements for charging, collecting, & remitting such taxes; authorizes DOR to compensate county governments for providing specified information; specifies payment amount; provides definitions relating to municipal resort tax; provides separate statement of tax requirements; provides exception; provides construction. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**CS/CS/HB 287 by Economic Affairs Committee, Finance & Tax Committee, Eisnagle** (Compare CS/SB 506)

**Economic Development;** Revises definitions of terms "new business" & "expansion of an existing business"; provides for

average wage of new job; provides eligibility for target industry businesses; authorizes board of county commissioners of charter county to call & hold referendum to determine whether to grant economic development ad valorem tax exemptions if in receipt of petition or initiative signed by percentage of electors as required by county charter; revises language of ballot questions relating to authority to grant economic development tax exemptions; specifies additional information that must be included in written application requesting adoption of ordinance granting economic development ad valorem tax exemption; specifies factors for board of county commissioners or governing authority of municipality to consider when deciding whether to approve or reject applications for economic development tax exemptions; limits allowable duration of economic development tax exemption granted by county or municipal ordinance; authorizes written tax exemption agreements consistent with act upon approval of tax exemption; specifies reporting requirements; authorizes revocation of agreement; limits application of act to certain exemptions granted pursuant to referenda held on or after act's effective date. Effective Date: July 1, 2011, and shall apply only to exemptions from ad valorem taxation granted pursuant to referenda held on or after July 1, 2011, under the provisions of s. 196.1995(1), Florida Statutes

**Digital Learning;** Creates Digital Learning Now Act; requires school districts to establish virtual instruction options; authorizes establishment of virtual charter schools & provides requirements; authorizes blended learning courses; provides additional requirements for Florida Virtual School; requires full-time & part-time school district virtual instruction program options; provides funding & accountability requirements; requires online learning course for high school graduation; redefines FTE student for purposes of virtual instruction. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**School Choice;** Revises requirements for eligibility to participate in Opportunity Scholarship Program; deletes provisions that authorize opportunity scholarship for attendance at private school; revises school district obligations & deletes provisions to conform; deletes obsolete provision relating to John M. McKay Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program;** Authorizes DOR to disclose certain information relating to taxpayers to eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding organization; provides for application to specified taxes; provides requirements & restrictions; revises provisions relating to amount of tax credit allowed for contribution made to eligible nonprofit scholarship-funding organization; revises provisions relating to carryforward of unused amount of tax credit & rescindment of all or part of tax credit under Florida Tax Credit Scholarship Program. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**Education Accountability;** Revises numerous provisions relating to K-12 public education system; revises provisions relating to virtual instruction courses, school board member acceptance of gifts, Opportunity Scholarship Program, McKay Scholarships, Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program, special education services, requirements for middle grades promotion & high school graduation, digital curriculum, career & professional academies, use of restraint & seclusion on students with disabilities, assistive technology, statewide assessments, college readiness, school improvement, designation of school grades, education budgets, funding for exceptional student education, & teacher qualifications. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**District School Board Membership;** Requires that district school boards consist of nine members in counties where population exceeds certain number; provides for single-member & at-large districts; requires nonpartisan elections; provides for election of chair & vice chair of school board; provides for 4-year terms of office & staggered terms of members; permits changes in boundaries of school board member residence areas & provides procedure for publication of those changes. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**CS/CS/HB 7219 by Appropriations Committee, Education Committee, State Affairs Committee, McKeel, Stargel** (Similar CS/CS/SB 1312)

**School Food Service and Nutrition Programs;** Cites act as "Healthy Schools for Healthy Lives Act"; transfers Food & Nutrition Services Trust Fund from DOE to DACS; transfers & reassigns functions & responsibilities for administration of school food service & nutrition programs from DOE to DACS; requires DACS to conduct & administer programs & cooperate with governmental agencies; conforms provisions; provides for contingent effect based upon federal approval of request for waiver. Effective Date: January 1, 2012

**Postsecondary Education;** Revises various provisions relating to postsecondary education, including disposal of personal property lost or abandoned on public postsecondary institution campuses, duties of Florida College System institution boards of trustees, Higher Education Coordinating Council, use of test scores & procedures for assessment of certain skills, articulation policies, requirements for postsecondary degrees, approval process for baccalaureate degrees, & requirements relating to common placement testing; repeals provisions relating to University Concurrency Trust Fund. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services;** Deletes provision establishing Division of Dairy within department; redefines term "agricultural purposes" as it relates to assessment of land classified as agricultural by property appraiser; exempts certain direct-support organizations & citizen support organizations for department from obtaining independent audit; requires department to establish accounting & financial management guidelines for such organizations & annually review operations & finances of selected number of such organizations, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**Land Application of Septage;** Terminates future imposition of prohibition of land application of septage from onsite sewage treatment & disposal systems. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**CS/CS/HB 421 by State Affairs Committee, Agriculture & Natural Resources Appropriations Subcommittee, Bembry, Nelson, Perry, Van Zant, Williams, T., Wood (Similar CS/CS/SB 1174)**

**Agricultural-related Exemptions to Water Management Requirements;** Revises exemption for agricultural-related activities to include certain impacts to surface waters & wetlands, clarifies purpose of such activities, & limits applicability of exemption; provides exclusive authority to DACS to determine whether certain activities qualify for agricultural-related exemption under specified conditions; requires memorandum of agreement between DACS & water management districts; provides exemption from mitigation requirements for converted agricultural lands under certain conditions; revises definition of term "agricultural activities" to include cultivating, fallowing, leveling, & specified practices & standards & to provide for certain impacts to surface waters & wetlands. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**Building Construction and Inspection;** Exempts rules that adopt federal standards & certain updates of or amendments to Florida Building Code or Florida Fire Prevention Code from requirement that Legislature ratify any rule that has adverse impact or regulatory costs which exceed certain criteria; specifies national codes to form foundation for state building standards & codes; revises provisions for amendment or modification of foundation code; revises criteria for approval of technical amendments to code, etc. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**Public Lodging Establishments and Public Food Service Establishments;** Excludes nonprofit organizations providing certain housing from definition of "public lodging establishment"; prohibits local governments from regulating,

restricting, or prohibiting vacation rentals based solely on classification or use; revises authority preempted to state with regard to regulation of public lodging establishments & public food service establishments; provides that establishments formerly classified as resort condominiums & resort dwellings are classified as vacation rentals; revises penalties for establishments operating without valid license; provides additional penalties for offense of unlawfully distributing handbills in public lodging establishment; specifies that certain items used in committing offense are subject to seizure & forfeiture; authorizes law enforcement officer to give notice to appear to person without warrant in certain circumstances; provides that specified provisions do not affect or impede certain protections or rights. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**Seat Requirements;** Repeals provisions that require employers who require employees to stand or walk during their duties to provide seats for such employees when not engaged in their active work; repeals provisions that require employers to permit specified employees to use seats during business hours, for purposes of necessary rest, when such use will not interfere with requirements of employment; deletes penalty. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**CS/HB 387 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Steube (Identical CS/SB 504)**

**Child Visitation;** Revises legislative intent; requires probable cause of sexual abuse in order to create presumption of detriment; provides that persons meeting specified criteria may not visit or have contact with child without hearing & court order; revises requirements for hearing seeking to rebut presumption of detriment; revises provisions relating to hearings on whether to prohibit or restrict visitation or other contact with person who is alleged to have influenced child's testimony. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**CS/CS/CS/HB 1111 by Judiciary Committee, Health & Human Services Committee, Civil Justice Subcommittee, Mayfield (Similar CS/SB 1622)**

**Uniform Interstate Family Support Act;** Designates Department of Revenue as support enforcement agency of this state; revises provisions relating to remedies provided by act; provides for applicability of provisions to residents of foreign counties & foreign support proceedings; provides that specified bases of personal jurisdiction may not be used to acquire personal jurisdiction for certain purposes unless specified requirements are met; provides for duration of personal



jurisdiction; deletes provisions relating to procedure when exercising jurisdiction over nonresident, etc. Effective Date: upon the earlier of 90 days following Congress amending 42 U.S.C. s. 666(f) to allow or require states to adopt the 2008 version of the Uniform Interstate Family Support Act, or 90 days following the state obtaining a waiver of its state plan requirement under Title IV-D of the Social Security Act

**CS/HB 1005 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Artiles, Julien, Nuñez, Trujillo** (Similar SB 1536)

**Murder of a Child 17 Years Of Age or Younger;** Reclassifies specified murder offenses if committed upon child 17 years of age or younger; prohibits court from suspending, deferring, or withholding adjudication of guilt or imposition of sentence. Effective Date: October 1, 2011
