HB 101 by Cruz, Bernard, Berman, Campbell, Julien, Pilon, Schwartz, Watson (Identical SB 240)

Violations of Injunctions for Protection; Adds circumstances that violate injunction for protection against repeat violence, sexual violence, or dating violence. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

CS/SJR 2 by Budget, Haridopolos, Lynn, Wise, Gaetz, Dean, Benacquisto, Hays, Fasano, Bennett, Diaz de la Portilla, Oelrich, Negron, Storms, Evers, Flores, Simmons, Jones, Gardiner, Garcia, Alexander, Latvala, Altman, Thrasher, Detert, Norman, Richter, Dockery, Bogdanoff (Identical CS/CS/HJR 1)

Health Care Services; Proposes an amendment to the State Constitution to prohibit laws or rules from compelling any person or employer to purchase, obtain, or otherwise provide for health care coverage; permits a person or an employer to purchase lawful health care services directly from a health care provider; permits a health care provider to accept direct payment from a person or an employer for lawful health care services; etc. Read second time April 27

CS/CS/HB 7219 by Appropriations Committee, Education Committee, State Affairs Committee, McKeel, Stargel (Similar CS/CS/SB 1312)

School Food Service and Nutrition Programs; Cites act as "Healthy Schools for Healthy Lives Act"; transfers Food & Nutrition Services Trust Fund from DOE to DACS; transfers & reassigns functions & responsibilities for administration of school food service & nutrition programs from DOE to DACS; requires DACS to conduct & administer programs & cooperate with governmental agencies; conforms provisions; provides for contingent effect based upon federal approval of request for waiver. Effective Date: January 1, 2012

CS/HB 387 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Steube (Identical CS/SB 504)

Child Visitation; Revises legislative intent; requires probable cause of sexual abuse in order to create presumption of detriment; provides that persons meeting specified criteria may not visit or have contact with child without hearing & court order; revises requirements for hearing seeking to rebut presumption of detriment; revises provisions relating to hearings on whether to prohibit or restrict visitation or other contact with person who is alleged to have influenced child's testimony. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

CS/CS/HB 1227 by Finance & Tax Committee, Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Hager (Similar CS/CS/CS/SB 1816)

Surplus Lines Insurance: Requires surplus lines agent to file quarterly affidavit stating all surplus lines insurance transacted during preceding quarter has been submitted to Florida Surplus Lines Service Office (FSLSO); requires premium tax due on surplus lines policy to be computed on gross premium; provides limit on tax; revises payment dates for service fee; requires service fee to be computed on gross premium; authorizes DFS & OIR to enter into agreement with other states for collection & allocation of nonadmitted insurance taxes; provides terms for agreement; requires FSLSO to implement agreement; authorizes department to adopt rules; provides for application; requires DFS to submit initial report to Legislature by specified date if agreement has been entered into; repeals section effective on that specified date, if no agreement has been entered into before that date; repeals section effective on specified date if Legislature has not ratified any agreement before that date; requires annual reports; requires certain insureds or self-insurers engaging in specified insurance transactions with foreign or alien insurer to compute premium tax & service fees based on gross premium; provides limit on tax; requires such insureds or self-insurers to pay applicable premium tax to department & service fee to FSLSO on or before specified time. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

CS/CS/HB 1303 by Economic Affairs Committee, Business & Consumer Affairs Subcommittee, Eisnaugle (Similar CS/SB 1884)

Consumer Protection; Prohibits certain third-party sellers from engaging in certain transactions over Internet with consumers engaged in transactions with certain merchants except under certain circumstances; requires certain disclosures to consumers; requires consumer's express informed consent for charges; authorizes consumers to cancel goods & services & avoid charges; provides that violations are unfair or deceptive trade practices; provides penalties & remedies for violations. Effective Date: October 1, 2011 Read second time and amended April 29

CS/HB 1053 by Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations Subcommittee, Dorworth, Costello (Similar SB 1564, Compare CS/CS/SJR 658, CS/SB 1722)

Special Election; Provides for special election to be held on date of presidential preference primary in 2012, pursuant to s. 5, Art. XI of State Constitution, for approval or rejection by electors of state of amendments to State Constitution, proposed by joint resolution, to prohibit increases in assessed value of homestead property if fair market value of property decreases, reduce limitation on annual assessment increases applicable to nonhomestead real property, provide additional homestead exemption for owners of homestead property who have not owned homestead property for specified time before purchase of current homestead property, & application & limitations with respect thereto, & effective date if such amendments are adopted; provides for publication of notice & for procedures; provides appropriation. Effective Date: upon becoming a law if enacted by a vote of at least three-fourths of the membership of each house of the Legislature and if Senate Joint Resolution 658 or House Joint Resolution 381 is adopted by both houses of the Legislature

CS/HJR 439 by Community & Military Affairs Subcommittee, Holder, Ford, Gaetz, Slosberg, Smith (Similar CS/SJR 592)

Veterans Disabled Due to Combat Injury; Homestead Property Tax Discount; Proposes amendment to Section 6 of Article VII & creation of Section 32 of Article XII of State Constitution to expand availability of homestead property tax discount for veterans who became disabled as result of combat injury to include those who were not Florida residents when they entered military service & provide an effective date.

HB 7029 by Federal Affairs Subcommittee, Plakon (Compare SB 898)

Office of State-Federal Relations; Requires Office of State-Federal Relations to submit annual report to Governor & legislative leadership. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

CS/HB 107 by Government Operations Subcommittee, Smith, Campbell, Costello, Mayfield, Rehwinkel Vasilinda (Similar CS/SB 224)

Local Government Accountability; Revises provisions relating to procedures for declaring special districts inactive; specifies level of detail required for local governmental entity's proposed budget; revises provisions for local governmental entity's audit & annual financial reports; requires local governmental entity's budget to be posted online; revises budgetary guidelines for district school boards. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

CS/SB 84 by Higher Education, Lynn, Gaetz, Thrasher, Wise, Simmons, Oelrich (Identical CS/HB 35)

Community Colleges; Renames Gulf Coast Community College as "Gulf Coast State College." Renames Pensacola Junior College as "Pensacola State College." Renames St. Johns River Community College as "St. Johns River State College." Renames Valencia Community College as "Valencia College." Amends provisions relating to linkage institutes, the Florida School of the Arts, and the consolidation of certain training schools. Conforms provisions. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

CS/CS/CS/SB 1546 by Budget, Higher Education, Education Pre-K - 12, Thrasher (Compare CS/CS/HB 7195, CS/CS/HB 7197, CS/SB 1620)

Charter Schools; Requires that the Department of Education provide or arrange for training and technical assistance for charter schools. Authorizes a sponsor to require certain governing board members to reside in the school district. Provides for the designation of charter schools as highperforming if certain requirements are met. Requires that the Office of Program Policy Analysis and Government Accountability conduct a study comparing the funding of charter schools to the funding of public schools. Provides requirements for the study, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

SB 228 by Siplin (Similar HB 61)

Code of Student Conduct; Requires the district school board to include in the code of student conduct adopted by the board an explanation of the responsibilities of each student with regard to appropriate dress and respect for self and others and the role that appropriate dress and respect for self and others has on an orderly learning environment, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

CS/SM 1654 by Higher Education, **Wise** (Identical CS/CS/HM 1445)

Educational Programs Beyond the Secondary Level; Notifies the Federal Government of colleges and universities in this state which are authorized to operate educational programs beyond the secondary level.

SM 218 by Gaetz, Latvala, Sobel, Bullard (Identical HM 363)

Deepwater Horizon Oil Disaster/Penalties; Urges the Congress of the United States to dedicate penalties collected from parties responsible for the Deepwater Horizon oil disaster to repairing the environmental and economic damage caused by the disaster.

III. Consideration of the following bills:

SB 652 by Simmons, Altman (Identical CS/HB 703)

Liability of Spaceflight Entities; Revises the definition of the term "spaceflight entity" to include certain manufacturers and suppliers for purposes of specified provisions for immunity from liability. Saves a provision from future repeal which provides spaceflight entities with immunity from liability for the loss, damage, or death of a participant resulting from the inherent risks of spaceflight activities. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

CS/CS/CS/SB 408 by Rules, Budget Subcommittee on General Government Appropriations, Banking and Insurance, Richter, Hays (Compare CS/HB 707, CS/CS/HB 803, CS/HB 885, CS/HB 1007, CS/HB 1087, HB 4115, HB 7181, HB 7247, CS/SB 858, SB 1462, CS/CS/SB 1568, SB 1900)

Property and Casualty Insurance; Revises the definition of "losses," relating to the Florida Hurricane Catastrophe Fund, to exclude certain losses. Authorizes an insurer to renegotiate the terms a surplus note issued before a certain date. Revises the amount of surplus funds required for domestic insurers applying for a certificate of authority after a certain date. Authorizes the OIR to reduce the surplus requirement under specified circumstances. Deletes an exception relating to the examination of managing general agents, etc. Effective Date: June 1, 2011, except as otherwise provided

IV. Consideration of the following bills:

CS/SB 142 by Commerce and Tourism, Richter, Gaetz, Hays (Compare CS/HB 201)

Negligence; Defines the terms "accident," "negligence action," and "products liability action." Requires the trier of fact to consider the fault of all persons who contributed to an accident when apportioning damages in a products liability action alleging an enhanced injury. Requires the jury instructions to apportion certain fault in a products liability action. Provides legislative intent to overrule a judicial opinion. Provides a legislative finding that fault should be apportioned among all responsible persons in a products liability action, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

CS/SB 670 by Judiciary, Joyner (Similar CS/CS/HB 815)

Powers of Attorney; Provides for a durable power of attorney. Specifies the qualifications for an agent. Provides requirements for the execution of a power of attorney. Provides for the validity of powers of attorney created by a certain date or in another jurisdiction. Provides for the validity of a military power of attorney. Provides for the validity of a photocopy or electronic copy of a power of attorney. Provides for the meaning and effectiveness of a power of attorney, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

CS/SB 926 by Commerce and Tourism, **Storms** (Similar CS/HB 405)

Liability/Employers of Developmentally Disabled;

Provides that an employer, under certain circumstances, is not liable for the acts or omissions of an employee who is a person with a developmental disability. Provides that a supported employment service provider that provides or has provided supported employment services to a person with a developmental disability is not liable for the actions or conduct of the person occurring within the scope of the person's employment. Defines the terms "developmental disability" and "supported employment service provider." Provides for application of the act. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

CS/SB 650 by Regulated Industries, Jones, Latvala (Identical CS/HB 423)

Mobile Home Park Lot Tenancies; Provides for local code and ordinance violations to be cited to the responsible party. Prohibits liens, penalties, fines, or other administrative or civil proceedings against one party or that party's property for a duty or responsibility of the other party. Revises procedures for mobile home owners being provided eviction notice due to a change in use of the land comprising the mobile home park or the portion thereof from which mobile homes are to be evicted, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

CS/CS/SB 170 by Budget Subcommittee on Criminal and Civil Justice Appropriations, Judiciary, Bennett (Identical CS/CS/HB 443, Compare CS/HB 7199)

Electronic Filing and Receipt of Court Documents; Requires each state attorney and public defender to electronically file court documents with the clerk of the court and receive court documents from the clerk of the court. Requires the Florida Prosecuting Attorneys Association and the Florida Public Defender Association report to the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Representatives by a specified date on the progress made to use the Florida Courts E-Portal system or the clerks' offices portals to electronically file and receive court documents, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

CS/CS/SB 1196 by Commerce and Tourism, Regulated Industries, Bogdanoff (Similar CS/CS/HB 941)

Construction Liens; Specifies that a lessor's interest in property is not subject to a construction lien for improvements made by a lessee if certain documents containing specific information and meeting certain criteria are recorded in the official records of the county before the recording of a notice of commencement. Authorizes certain contractors and lienors to demand that a lessor serve verified copies of a lease prohibiting liability for improvements made by a lessee, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

SB 1142 by Dockery (Identical HB 927, SB 918)

Adverse Possession; Specifies that occupation and maintenance of property satisfies the requirements for possession for purposes of gaining title to property via adverse possession without color of title. Requires that the property appraiser add certain information related to the adverse possession claim to the parcel information on the tax roll and prescribing conditions for removal of that information. Excludes property subject to adverse possession claims without color of title from provisions authorizing the tax collector not to send a tax notice for minimum tax bills, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011

CS/SB 844 by Budget, Benacquisto, Richter, Gaetz, Fasano, Norman, Diaz de la Portilla, Hays, Lynn, Altman, Bennett, Montford, Bogdanoff, Thrasher, Detert, Latvala, Bullard, Storms (Similar CS/HB 575)

Violations/Probation/Community Control/Widman Act; Creates the "Officer Andrew Widman Act." Authorizes a judge, after making a certain finding, to issue a warrant for the arrest of a probationer or offender who has violated the terms of probation or community control. Authorizes the court to commit or release the probationer or offender under certain circumstances. Authorizing the court, in determining whether to require or set the amount of bail, to consider the likelihood that the person will be imprisoned for the violation of probation or community control, etc. Effective Date: 10/01/2011 Calendar without reference

CS/CS/SB 234 by Rules, Criminal Justice, Evers, Dockery, Lynn, Hays, Norman, Negron, Garcia, Altman (Similar CS/CS/HB 517, Compare CS/HB 4069, CS/SB 956)

Firearms; Provides that a person who is licensed to carry a concealed firearm is not in violation of law if the firearm is briefly and openly displayed under certain circumstances. Allows the Division of Licensing of the DOACS to take fingerprints from concealed carry license applicants. Provides that a person may not openly carry a weapon or firearm or carry a concealed weapon or firearm into specified locations. Provides that concealed carry licensees shall not be prohibited from carrying or storing a firearm in a vehicle for lawful purposes, etc. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

SB 344 by Rich (Similar CS/HB 125)

Animal Cruelty; Provides definitions. Prohibits specified activities with an animal. Prohibits specified related activities. Provides penalties. Provides that the act does not apply to certain husbandry, conformation judging, and veterinary practices. Effective Date: 10/01/2011

Juvenile Justice; Repeals provisions relating to legislative intent for serious or habitual juvenile offenders in the juvenile justice system, definitions of terms for a training school and the serious or habitual juvenile offender program, the serious or habitual juvenile offender program in the juvenile justice system, the intensive residential treatment program for offenders less than 13 year of age, and the designation of persons holding law enforcement certification within the Office of the Inspector General to act as law enforcement officers, etc. Effective Date: 07/01/2011
