**CS/HB 1053 by Transportation & Economic Development Appropriations Subcommittee, Dorworth, Costello** (Similar SB 1564, Compare CS/CS/SJR 658, CS/SB 1722)

**Special Election;** Provides for special election to be held on date of presidential preference primary in 2012, pursuant to s. 5, Art. XI of State Constitution, for approval or rejection by electors of state of amendments to State Constitution, proposed by joint resolution, to prohibit increases in assessed value of homestead property if fair market value of property decreases, reduce limitation on annual assessment increases applicable to nonhomestead real property, provide additional homestead exemption for owners of homestead property who have not owned homestead property for specified time before purchase of current homestead property, & application & limitations with respect thereto, & effective date if such amendments are adopted; provides for publication of notice & for procedures; provides appropriation. Effective Date: upon becoming a law if enacted by a vote of at least three-fourths of the membership of each house of the Legislature and if Senate Joint Resolution 658 or House Joint Resolution 381 is adopted by both houses of the Legislature

**CS/CS/HB 121 by State Affairs Committee, Government Operations Subcommittee, Thurston** (Similar CS/SB 106)

**Pub. Rec./Donor Information/Performing Arts Centers/Legislative Research Center and Museum at the Historic Capitol;** Creates exemption from public records requirements for information that identifies donor or prospective donor of donation made for benefit of publicly owned performing arts center if donor desires to remain anonymous; creates exemption from public records requirements for information identifying donor or prospective donor to direct-support organization of Legislative Research Center & Museum at Historic Capitol; provides for legislative review & repeal of exemptions; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

**CS/HB 545 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Abruzzo**  
(Compare SB 18)

**Relief/Estrada/USF Board of Trustees;** Provides for relief of Daniel & Amara Estrada; provides appropriation to compensate Daniel & Amara Estrada, parents & guardians of Caleb Estrada, for wrongful birth of Caleb Estrada & for damages sustained by Daniel & Amara Estrada as result of negligence by employees of USF Board of Trustees; provides limitation on payment of fees & costs. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**CS/HB 569 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Cruz** (Compare SB 64)

**Relief/Ronald Miller/City of Hollywood;** Provides for relief of Ronald Miller by City of Hollywood; provides for appropriation to compensate him for injuries sustained as result of negligence of city; provides limitation on payment of attorneys' & lobbyists' fees & costs. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**CS/CS/CS/HB 713 by Economic Affairs Committee, Finance & Tax Committee, Community & Military Affairs Subcommittee, Pafford, Berman, Caldwell, Dorworth**  
(Similar CS/SB 1120)

**Special Districts;** Revises provisions relating to merger & dissolution procedures for special districts; provides for certain merger & dissolution procedures to include referenda; provides that such provisions preempt certain special acts; provides for local governments to assume indebtedness of, & receive title to property owned by, special districts under certain circumstances; deletes provision relating to conditions under which merger of independent special districts or dependent fire control districts with other special districts is effective & conditions under which merged district is authorized to increase ad valorem taxes; revises criteria by which special districts are declared inactive by governing body. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**CS/HB 779 by Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Reed**  
(Similar CS/CS/SB 1086)

**Restraint of Incarcerated Pregnant Women;** Prohibits use of restraints on prisoner known to be pregnant during labor, delivery, & postpartum recovery unless corrections official makes individualized determination that prisoner presents extraordinary circumstance requiring restraints; provides that doctor, nurse, or other health care professional treating prisoner may request that restraints not be used, in which case corrections officer or other official accompanying prisoner shall remove all restraints; requires that any restraint applied must be done in least restrictive manner; requires corrections official to make written findings within 10 days as to extraordinary circumstance; provides that use of restraints at any time after it is known that prisoner is pregnant must be by least restrictive manner necessary; requires findings be kept on file; authorizes woman restrained in violation of act to file grievance within specified period; provides that these remedies do not prevent complaint under any other law; requires facilities to inform female prisoners of rules; requires reports. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**CS/CS/HB 821 by Judiciary Committee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Thurston, Campbell** (Compare CS/CS/SB 1206)

**Eyewitness Identification;** Requires state & county law enforcement agencies to establish & implement written policies & procedures addressing eyewitness identification; specifies requirements of policies & procedures; requires state & county agencies to submit such policies & procedures to local state attorney by specified date; requires Florida Prosecuting Attorneys Association to develop draft jury instructions to be submitted to Supreme Court for consideration by specified date; requires Criminal Justice Standards & Training Commission to develop & make available to state & county agencies educational materials & training programs regarding standards for eyewitness identification procedures & practices in compliance with act; requires state & local law enforcement agencies to provide eyewitness identification procedures training to their law enforcement personnel. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**CS/CS/HB 823 by Government Operations Appropriations Subcommittee, Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Workman** (Similar CS/CS/SB 1316)

**Loan Processing;** Creates & revises definitions; specifies rulemaking powers of FSC; includes in-house loan processors in disciplinary provisions; provides that specified provisions do not

apply to licensed contract loan processor who has on file with OFR declaration of intent to act solely as contract loan processor; provides restrictions on employment of persons acting as in-house loan processors; clarifies provisions concerning operation of mortgage brokers; revises provisions relating to disclosure of settlement charges & loan terms; revises agency reference in mortgage broker agreement; provides borrower may contact OFR rather than DFS regarding any complaints against loan originator; requires that in order to renew mortgage lender license mortgage lender must authorize Nationwide Mortgage Licensing System & Registry to obtain independent credit report on each of lender's control persons; requires each mortgage lender to submit certain reports to registry. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**HB 855 by Thurston** (Identical SB 40, SB 306)

**Relief/Brown/North Broward Hospital District;** Provides for relief of Denise Gordon Brown & David Brown by North Broward Hospital District; provides for appropriation to compensate them for injuries & damages sustained by their daughter, Darian Brown, as result of negligence of Broward General Medical Center; limits payment of fees & costs. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**CS/HB 885 by Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Wood** (Compare CS/CS/CS/SB 408)

**Residential Property Insurance;** Revises costs to be included in rate filing; revises overall premium increase for rate filing; revises information that must be included in rate filing relating to reinsurance; deletes provision prohibiting insurer from implementing rate increase within 6 months before it makes certain rate filings; deletes provision prohibiting insurer from filing for rate increase within 6 months after it makes certain rate filings. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

**CS/HB 1151 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Grant** (Compare HB 57, HB 525, CS/SB 42)

**Relief/Eric Brody/Broward County Sheriff's Office;** Provides for relief of Eric Brody by Broward County Sheriff's Office; provides for appropriation to compensate Eric Brody for injuries sustained as result of negligence of BCSO; authorizes Sheriff of Broward County, in lieu of payment, to execute to Eric Brody & his legal guardians assignment of all claims that BCSO has against its insurer arising out of insurer's handling of claim against sheriff's office; clarifies that such assignment does not impair ability or right of assignees to pursue final judgment & cost judgment against insurer; provides limitation on payment of fees & costs related to claim against BCSO & exception to that limitation as to any assigned claims brought against insurer. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**CS/CS/HB 1243 by Economic Affairs Committee, Insurance & Banking Subcommittee, Boyd, Albritton, Van Zant** (Compare CS/SB 1714)

**Citizens Property Insurance Corporation;** Revises legislative intent; provides certain residential structures are not eligible for coverage by corporation after certain date; prohibits corporation from levying assessments until surcharge is levied; requires corporation to commission consultant to prepare report on outsourcing; revises wind coverage provisions; specifies that corporation's insurance policies must provide that surplus lines insurer's offer to cover risks makes policy ineligible for renewal; requires policyholders acknowledge assessment of surcharges; provides for termination of agent for rebate violation; provides policies do not cover screen enclosures & limits coverage for sinkhole damage; requires members of board to abstain from voting on issues of interest; requires members to disclose interest; provides corporation is residual market mechanism; revises provisions relating to corporation rates; provides surplus lines insurers may participate in depopulation, take-out, or keep-out programs; provides requirements surplus lines insurer must meet to participate; clarifies corporation immunity; authorizes release of confidential files to insurer; deletes requirement for annual report on wind-only losses; requires property owners in Special Flood Areas maintain separate insurance. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**CS/CS/HB 1245 by State Affairs Committee, Government Operations Subcommittee, Nehr** (Similar SB 1602, Compare HB 535, HB 893, HB 7247, SB 510, SB 2156)

**Division of Emergency Management;** Transfers division to EOG & renames it "Office of Emergency Management"; extends expiration date of Hurricane Loss Mitigation Program; revises membership of program's advisory group; deletes provisions authorizing use of funds for specified hurricane shelters for 2010-2011 fiscal year. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

State Affairs Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

**CS/CS/CS/HB 1309 by Economic Affairs Committee, Finance & Tax Committee, Economic Development & Tourism Subcommittee, Coley, Ford, Ingram, Gaetz, Bembry, Broxson, Drake, Patronis** (Compare CS/CS/CS/SB 248)

**Economic Recovery from the Deepwater Horizon Disaster;** Defines term "disproportionally affected county"; provides conditions under which Governor & OTTED may waive specified job, wage, & local financial support eligibility requirements; provides limitation; provides for qualified target industry business that relocates from another state to disproportionately affected county to receive certain tax refund payments; provides appropriation; requires OTTED to consult with certain entities to create framework & strategy for use of funds to promote research & development, commercialization of research, economic diversification, & job creation in counties of Bay, Escambia, Franklin, Gulf, Okaloosa, Santa Rosa, Wakulla, & Walton; requires Board of Trustees of Internal Improvement



Trust Fund to provide specified recommendations to Legislature.  
Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**CS/HB 1315 by Civil Justice Subcommittee, Diaz** (Similar CS/SB 54)

**Relief/Melvin and Alma Colindres/City of Miami;** Provides for relief of Melvin & Alma Colindres by City of Miami; provides for appropriation to compensate them for wrongful death of their son, Kevin Colindres, sustained as result of negligence of police officers of City of Miami; provides limitation on payment of fees & costs. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

**CS/HJR 1321 by Economic Affairs Committee, Lopez-Cantera** (Similar CS/CS/SJR 1954)

**Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter;** Proposes amendment to s. 6, Art. VIII of State Constitution to authorize amendments of revisions to Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter by special law approved by vote of electors of county; requires that such special law be proposed & approved at meeting of local legislative delegation & filed by member of that delegation; conforms references to reflect county's current name.

Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute; State Affairs Committee: Favorable

**CS/CS/HJR 1359 by Education Committee, K-20 Innovation Subcommittee, Williams, A., Corcoran** (Compare SJR 1706)

**Board of Governors/Student Body President;** Proposes amendment to s. 7, Art. IX of State Constitution to remove president of Florida Student Association, or equivalent, as member of Board of Governors of State University System & to require that Governor appoint state university student body president to Board of Governors; requires that state university student body president shall be one of 15 citizen members appointed to Board of Governors by Governor, except that state university student body president is not subject to confirmation by Senate & term of appointment is 1 year; provides that student body president of state university is ineligible for appointment if student body president appointed to Board of Governors in previous year was from same state university.

Education Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

**CS/CS/HB 1379 by Judiciary Committee, Criminal Justice Subcommittee, Dorworth, Corcoran, Tobia** (Similar CS/HB 7023, Compare CS/HB 7199, SB 372, SB 1398)

**Judiciary;** Repeals provisions relating to regular terms of Supreme Court; repeals provisions relating to terms of circuit courts; allows Supreme Court to set terms of court for Supreme Court, district courts of appeal, & circuit courts; provides that appellate courts may withdraw mandate within 120 days after issuance; provides state policy & legislative intent concerning

government-funded pretrial release programs; requires each pretrial release program established by ordinance of county commission, by administrative order of court, or by any other means in order to assist in release of defendant from pretrial custody to conform to specified eligibility criteria; preempts conflicting local ordinances, orders, or practices; requires that defendant satisfy certain eligibility criteria in order to be assigned to pretrial release program; provides that act does not prohibit court from releasing defendant on defendant's own recognizance or imposing any other reasonable condition of release on defendant; limits applicability of income eligibility limitations applicable to government-funded pretrial release programs to certain counties; authorizes county to reimburse licensed surety agent for premium costs of bail bond for pretrial release of indigent defendant. Effective Date: January 1, 2012

**CS/CS/HB 1409 by Health & Human Services Committee, Health & Human Services Access Subcommittee, Hudson** (Similar CS/SB 1480)

**Public Swimming Pools and Spas;** Extends deadline for owners & operators of certain public swimming pools & spas to install specified safety feature. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Health & Human Services Committee: Favorable With Committee Substitute

**HB 4011 by Gaetz** (Compare CS/HB 5005)

**Dance Studios;** Repeals Dance Studio Act. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

**HB 4015 by Gaetz** (Identical SB 1424)

**Telemarketing;** Deletes restrictions on business-to-business sales exemption of Florida Telemarketing Act. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Economic Affairs Committee: Favorable

**HB 4153 by Stargel** (Compare CS/HB 7151, CS/CS/SB 1732)

**Florida Business and Education Collaborative;** Repeals provisions which establish & provide responsibilities of Florida Business & Education Collaborative. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Education Committee: Favorable

**Vulnerable Children and Adults;** Authorizes certified homeless youth or minor who has had disabilities of nonage removed to obtain birth certificate; prohibits monitoring requirements that mandate pornographic materials be available in residential facilities that serve APD clients; requires court to order person involuntarily admitted to residential services to be released to agency for appropriate residential services; prohibits court from ordering that such person be released directly to residential service provider; authorizes agency to transfer person from one residential setting to another; requires agency to notify committing court & person's counsel of transfer within specified time; authorizes agency to issue final order; decreases limits of liability and requisite insurance coverage for lead community-based providers & subcontractors; provides immunity from liability for DCFS for acts or omissions of community-based provider or subcontractor, or officers, agents, or employees thereof; requires sufficient community-based placements for defendants charged with sex offenses; requires that court order person involuntarily admitted to residential services after criminal charges have been dismissed to be released to agency for appropriate residential services; creates task force to develop input for creation of certain guidelines & procedures for providers of residential services; requires agency to provide administrative support to task force; requires report to Legislature.
