HB 703 by Goodson (Identical SB 652)

HB 705 by Harrell (Identical SB 1088)

Criminal Conduct; Defines term "mental injury" with respect to offenses of abuse, aggravated abuse, & neglect of child; requires that person acting as expert witness have certain credentials; provides affirmative defenses to offenses of child abuse, aggravated child abuse, & neglect; redefines term "crime" for purposes of crime victims compensation to include additional forms of injury. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Liquefied Petroleum Gas; Prohibits DOACS & other state agencies from requiring compliance with certain national standards for liquefied petroleum gas tanks unless DOACS or agencies require compliance with specified edition of national standards; revises term "propane" for purposes of Florida Propane Gas Education, Safety, & Research Act. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 711 by Rogers

Sexual Offenders and Predators; Clarifies language concerning loitering by certain offenders; defines term "homelessness status" & deletes definition of "transient residence"; conforms provisions to revisions in terminology made by act; requires specified monthly registration by homeless offenders and predators; provides that failure to comply with such registration violates specified provisions. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 713 by Pafford (Identical SB 1120)

Special Districts; Revises provisions relating to certain merger & dissolution procedures for special districts to include referenda; provides for preemption of certain special acts; provides for local governments to assume indebtedness of, & receive title to property owned by, special districts under certain circumstances; revises dissolution procedures for special districts declared inactive by governing body. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 715 by Jones (Identical SB 972)

Public School Attendance; Creates Student Preparedness Pilot Program to include Duval County School District as one of selected school districts; requires that students in pilot program districts who are 16-18 years of age & do not regularly attend school shall be subject to attendance & completion requirements; requires pilot program districts to identify curricula options; requires annual study & report by OPPAGA. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 717 by Ford (Identical SB 1008)

Liens for Recovering, Towing, or Storing Vehicles or Vessels; Revises procedures for notification concerning liens for recovery of certain costs for recovering, towing, or storing vehicle or vessel; removes authority of DHSMV to release information concerning insurance company; establishes fees for lien notification; revises requirements governing contents of notification; revises requirements for locating & notifying persons about impending sale of unclaimed vehicle or vessel or its contents; revises requirements concerning public notice of impending sale. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

HJR 719 by Rehwinkel Vasilinda (Identical SJR 804)

Election of Public Service Commission Members; Proposes creation of s. 14, Art. IV & s. 32 of Art XII of State Constitution to provide for elected, five-member Public Service Commission in executive branch & prohibits candidates for election to commission from accepting contributions from employees, lobbyists, officers, directors, or agents of any utility or entity regulated by commission, affiliates of regulated utilities or entities, business entities, law firms, & trade associations under certain circumstances.

HB 721 by Steinberg (Identical SB 1050)

HB 725 by Perman (Identical SB 872)

Enterprise Zones; Authorizes certain governing bodies to apply to OTTED to amend boundary of enterprise zone that includes rural area of critical economic concern; provides limitation; authorizes OTTED to approve amendment application subject to certain requirements; requires that OTTED establish effective date of certain enterprise zones; authorizes Martin County to

apply to OTTED for designation of enterprise zone; provides application requirements; authorizes OTTED to designate enterprise zone in Martin County; provides responsibilities of OTTED. Effective Date: January 1, 2012

HB 727 by Thurston

Expunging Criminal History Records; Permits automatic expunction of criminal history records in specified circumstances; provides procedures; provides for effect of expunction; provides for treatment of certain statutory cross-references; conforms provisions. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 729 by Gonzalez (Identical SB 922)

Florida Education Finance Program; Requires that DOE enter into contract with entity located outside state to conduct study & review of FEFP & recommend improvements; requires that DOE submit report to Legislature & Governor; provides appropriation & for carryforward of unexpended balance of funds. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HM 731 by Williams, A.

Methylenedioxypyrovalerone (MDVP); Urges Congress to ban sale, distribution, & possession of methylenedioxypyrovalerone (MDVP).

HB 733 by Porter (Similar SB 508)

Tax on Sales, Use, and Other Transactions; Specifies period each year during which sale of clothing, wallets, bags, school supplies, computers & specified computer equipment is exempt from sales tax; provides definitions; provides exceptions. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 735 by Porter (Compare SB 1046)

Division of Forestry; Renames Division of Forestry of DOACS as Florida Forest Service; redesignates director of division as State Forester; clarifies & conforms various provisions. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 743 by Rogers

Special Assessment for Law Enforcement Services;

Authorizes municipality to impose special assessment to fund costs of providing law enforcement services; makes imposition of assessment contingent upon adoption of ordinance approved by governing body of municipality & reduction in municipality's ad valorem millage; limits maximum millage reduction required; specifies rolled-back rate for calculation of future increase in ad valorem millage; provides for construction of act as general law authorizing taxation by municipality. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 745 by Wood

Polk County Historical Commission, Polk County; Revises number of commissioners; provides for membership, meetings, rules of procedure, & staff; provides powers & duties; provides for historical preservation manager; provides for funding & dedicated accounts for county historical museum & genealogical library; deletes provisions relating to Polk County Historical Association; requires board of county commissioners to provide repository for museum & library materials. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 747 by Plakon

Infants Born Alive; Designates act "Born Alive Infant Protection Act"; provides that infant born alive subsequent to abortion is entitled to same rights, powers, & privileges as child born alive in course of birth that is not subsequent to abortion; provides standard of care to be exercised by health care practitioners toward such child; requires health care practitioners to report violations; provides that violations may constitute grounds for discipline of health care practitioners under specified provision. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 749 by Caldwell (Identical SB 986)

Division of Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco of the Department of Business and Professional Regulation; Revises provisions relating to issuance by division of temporary permits to nonprofit civic organizations to sell alcoholic beverages; authorizes issuance of permits to any nonprofit organization; allows sale to include beverages for consumption on or off premises. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 751 by Caldwell, Smith (Identical SB 1106)

Exemption from Hunter Safety Course Requirements; Provides exemption from hunter safety course requirements for persons issued a permit, license, or authorization to take game or fur-bearing animals on private land; directs FWCC to adopt rules. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 753 by Ford

HB 757 by Nehr

Affordable Housing; Provides legislative intent; provides additional purposes for which state apartment incentive loans may be used; specifies percentage of State Apartment Incentive Loan funding to be awarded as subordinate loan financing for new construction of affordable rental housing developments; provides eligibility & application requirements; provides duties of Florida Housing Development Corporation. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 759 by Costello

Stimulating Special Event Tourism and Job Creation;

Provides for transfer of certain sales tax revenues from General Revenue Fund to Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for Counties; authorizes county to designate certain time periods to hold special events designed to enhance tourism; authorizes specified distribution from sales tax proceeds when increase in sales tax collections is realized over preceding year by county during same designated time period; provides for specified adjustment of aggregate amount to be transferred from General Revenue Fund to Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for Counties; provides for distribution from Revenue Sharing Trust Fund for Counties to county eligible for distribution related to holding of special event during designated time period; requires county receiving distribution to distribute funds to certain units of local government within whose jurisdiction special event was held during designated time period. HB 761 by Rooney

Funerals, Burials, and Memorial Services; Prohibits picketing or engaging in other protest activities within specified distance of property line of location of funeral, burial, or memorial service for certain persons. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

HB 763 by Rooney

High School Athletic Trainers; Provides for adoption of rules by Board of Athletic Training within DOH; requires certain continuing education for licensed athletic trainers on prevention & emergency management of concussions & catastrophic spinal cord, neck, & brain injuries; requires school districts to employ at least one full-time certified athletic trainer at each high school in this state; requires athletic trainers at high schools to be certified by National Athletic Trainers' Association; provides rebuttable presumption that school district did not negligently employ athletic trainer for purposes of civil action for negligence by athletic trainer if school district made good faith effort to comply with certification requirements for athletic trainers; provides legislative intent. HB 779 by Reed (Identical SB 1086)

Restraint of Incarcerated Pregnant Women; Prohibits correctional institutions or county or municipal detention facilities from using restraints on prisoner known to be pregnant without individualized determination that prisoner presents extraordinary circumstance requiring restraints; requires removal upon request of health care professional treating prisoner; requires that restraint be in least restrictive manner necessary; requires written findings as to extraordinary circumstance; requires that findings be kept on file for specified period & available for public inspection; authorizes woman restrained in violation of act to file complaint; provides that remedies do not prevent complaint under any other relevant provisions; requires correctional institutions & detention facilities to inform prisoners of rules; requires reports. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

HB 781 by Soto (Identical SB 1010)

Neighborhood Improvement Districts: Provides & revises provisions relating to neighborhood improvement districts, including creation & funding of safe districts, powers & duties of municipalities & counties, requirements, bonds & assessments, governing bodies, board of directors; property owners' associations, state grants, special neighborhood improvement districts, community redevelopment neighborhood improvement districts, powers of local governing bodies, & ad valorem tax on real or personal property; repeals provisions relating to crime prevention through community policing innovations, safe neighborhoods program, duties of Department of Legal Affairs, neighborhood improvement district inside enterprise zone, effect & construction of existing laws, state redevelopment programs, safe neighborhood districts, Neighborhood Preservation & Enhancement Program, & Neighborhood Councils & local government designated agency. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

HB 799 by Young

Nonjudicial Foreclosure of Commercial Real Property;
