Effective Date: July 1, 2011

## **HB 397 by Ray** (Compare SB 264)

Economic Development; Creates Commercialization Credit Transfer Program; provides legislative findings; authorizes DOR to share certain confidential information with OTTED; adds certified credits to list of credits available against state corporate income tax; redefines term "adjusted federal income" in relation to net operating losses transferred & payments received for certified credit; provides for allocation of financial assistance as income in this state; provides purpose, intent, goals, & objectives; provides definitions; requires OTTED to certify eligible companies for transfer of corporate income tax net operating loss amounts as certified credits; provides qualifications & application process & requirements; requires application fee; provides for application deadline; requires OTTED to grant or deny application within specified time after receiving completed application; provides for calculating

certified credit amount; provides maximum amount that may be transferred; provides penalty; requires certified company to file annual report with OTTED; requires OTTED to create annual report; requires OTTED to adopt rules; authorizes DOR to adopt rules; provides appropriations; provides future repeal of program. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

#### HB 399 by Ray

Seaports; Increases funds DOT is required to make available for Florida Seaport Transportation & Economic Development Program; establishes Florida seaport infrastructure bank; provides for revenue bonds & indebtedness to be issued by Florida Ports Financing Commission; provides for certain freight mobility projects; exempts overwater piers, docks, & structures located in deepwater ports from stormwater management system requirements; requires DEP to issue notice of intent for port conceptual permit & related permits within specified time & notify specified entities of certain compliance; provides that notice to issue such permit creates rebuttable presumption of compliance with specified standards & authorization. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

#### HB 401 by Clarke-Reed (Identical SB 164)

**Public Broadcasting Program System;** Includes certain television stations licensed by FCC for which support & funding may be given. Effective Date: July 1, 2011.

# HB 403 by Baxley (Similar SB 608)

**Traffic Offenses;** Provides penalties for person who commits moving violation that causes serious bodily injury to, or causes or contributes to death of, person operating or riding in motor vehicle or operating or riding on motorcycle. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

## HB 405 by Baxley

#### **Employment Liability for Persons with Disabilities**;

Designates act "Employees with Disabilities Opportunity Act"; limits liability of employers of persons with developmental disabilities for acts or omissions of such employees in certain circumstances; provides that not-for-profit supported employment service provider who has provided supported employment services to individual with disability is not liable for actions or conduct of that individual occurring within scope of his or her employment. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 407 by Perry (Similar SB 580)

**Residential Building Permits;** Prohibits local enforcing agencies & building code officials or entities from requiring certain inspections of buildings, structures, or real property as condition of issuance of residential building permits. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 409 by Perry

Pub. Rec./Criminal Intelligence Information or Criminal Investigative Information; Expands exemption from public

records requirements for criminal intelligence information & criminal investigative information to include photographs, videotapes, or images of any part of body of victim of sexual offense of video voyeurism; provides review & repeal of exemption; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**HB 411 by Burgin** (Similar SB 416, Identical HB 163)

Pub. Rec./Photographs and Video and Audio Recordings Depicting or Recording the Killing of a Person; Provides exemption from public records requirements for photographs & video & audio recordings that depict or record killing of person; authorizes access to such photographs or video or audio recordings by specified members of immediate family of deceased subject of photographs or video or audio recordings; provides for access to such records by local governmental entities or state or federal agencies in furtherance of official duties; provides for access pursuant to court order; provides guidelines of court in issuing order authorizing such photographs or video or audio recordings to be viewed, copied, or heard; requires specified notice of court petition to view or copy such records; provides penalties; exempts criminal or administrative proceedings from act; provides for retroactive application; provides for future legislative review & repeal; provides finding of public necessity. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

#### **HB 413 by Ford** (Identical SB 662)

Public Accountancy; Authorizes Board of Accountancy to establish peer review oversight committee; revises licensure renewal requirements for firms engaged in certain aspects of public accounting; requires such firms to enroll in peer review programs & undergo peer reviews; requires firms that fail specified number of peer reviews to submit certain documentation to board; requires board to establish minimum standards for peer review programs; provides for approval of peer review administering organizations; requires such organizations to submit certain information to board; authorizes board to withdraw approval of peer review administering organizations; limits liability of certain persons relating to performance of certain services & duties of peer review administering organizations; provides that proceedings, records, & workpapers of peer review administering organizations are confidential & privileged; prohibits persons involved in peer reviews from testifying; provides additional grounds for discipline of firms engaged in certain aspects of public accounting; revises requirements for reissuance of licenses after compliance with disciplinary final orders. Effective Date: July 1,

# HB 415 by Van Zant

**Abortion;** Creates "Florida for Life Act"; provides legislative findings; prohibits induced abortions; prohibits operation of facility for purpose of providing abortion services; prohibits termination of pregnancy unless specified conditions are met; requires consent; provides exception; provides standard of care if fetus is viable; provides that woman's life is superior to concern for life of fetus; requires that fetal remains be disposed of according to specified standards; provides that provisions do not apply to specified procedures; provides civil cause of action

for violations; repeals provisions relating to termination of pregnancies & abortion referral or counseling agencies; repeals Partial-Birth Abortion Act; requires statewide list of attorneys providing pro bono adoption services for women with unwanted pregnancies who would have selected abortion, if lawful, rather than adoption; provides that all federal moneys received by state as result of efforts made by Office of Adoption & Child Protection shall only be spent by that office; provides certain provisions only take effect if other provisions are declared unconstitutional or had enforcement enjoined; provides that certain repeals & amendments in act may be void in other such circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 417 by Bileca

**Public School Educational Instruction;** Requires district school boards to designate one month of school year to celebrate Founding Fathers of United States of America & principles inherent in country's founding documents; specifies focus of instruction during designated month; provides that instruction may be integrated into existing school curriculum. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 419 by Bileca

**Required Instruction in the Public Schools;** Revises curriculum of character-development program required in kindergarten through grade 12. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 421 by Bembry

Agricultural-related Exemptions to Water Management Requirements; Revises exemption for agricultural-related activities to include certain impacts to surface waters & wetlands & provides retroactive application; provides exclusive authority to DACS to determine whether certain activities qualify for agricultural-related exemption under specified conditions; requires memorandum of agreement between DACS & water management districts; provides exemption from mitigation requirements for converted agricultural lands under certain conditions; revises definition of term "agricultural activities" to include cultivating, fallowing, & leveling & to provide for certain impacts to surface waters & wetlands. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 423 by Nuñez (Identical SB 650)

Mobile Home Park Lot Tenancies; Provides for local enforcement of violations of provisions establishing obligations of mobile home park owners & mobile home owners; prohibits liens, penalties, fines, or other administrative or civil proceedings against one party or that party's property for duty or responsibility of other party; revises provisions relating to grounds & proceedings for eviction; revises procedures for mobile home owners being provided eviction notice due to change in use of land comprising mobile home park or portion thereof from which mobile homes are to be evicted; provides requirements of park owner & requirements & rights of applicable homeowners' association with respect to sale of mobile home park under change in use eviction; deletes provision relating to governmental action affecting removal of mobile home owners. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

# HB 425 by Trujillo (Compare HB 181, HB 295)

**Driving Without a Valid License;** Provides for immobilization or impoundment of motor vehicle driven or owned by person charged with driving without driver's license or while person's driver's license or privilege to drive is canceled, suspended, or revoked. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 427 by Tobia (Identical SB 574)

Preference in Award of State Contracts; Expands provisions that authorize agency, county, municipality, school district, or other political subdivision of state to provide preferential consideration to Florida business in awarding competitively bid contracts to purchase personal property to include purchase of construction services; provides that for specified competitive solicitations authority to grant preference supersedes any local ordinance or regulation which grants preference to specified vendors; requires county, municipality, school district, or other political subdivision to make specified disclosures in competitive solicitation documents; provides construction. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 429 by Jones

**Health Education;** Provides for mandatory one-half credit in health education, independent of physical education credit requirement, for high school students; provides waiver for students who request to take & successfully complete health education assessment developed by DOE; reduces number of credits in elective courses. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 431 by Sands

**Driver's Licenses and Identification Cards;** Requires application form for original, renewal, or replacement driver's license or identification card shall include option to make voluntary contribution to Disabled American Veterans, Department of Florida; provides that such contributions are not income of revenue nature. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 433 by Garcia (Identical SB 496)

**Ocean Lifeguards;** Defines "ocean lifeguard"; provides enhanced penalties for assault or battery on ocean lifeguard; revises provisions relating to arrest without warrant; conforms provisions. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

# HB 435 by Sands

**Excuse from Jury Service;** Expands parental eligibility to be excused from jury service; includes practicing psychologists in list of persons judge is authorized to excuse from jury service. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 437 by Holder (Identical SB 740)

**Motor Vehicle Franchise Agreements;** Revises application of provisions relating to franchise agreements. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HJR 439 by Holder (Identical SJR 592)

**Veteran's Property Tax Discount;** Expands availability of property tax discount on homesteads of veterans who became disabled as result of combat injury to veterans who were not Florida residents when they entered military.

# HB 441 by Bernard (Identical SB 444)

Scrutinized Companies; Prohibits state agency or local governmental entity from contracting for goods & services of more than certain amount with company that is on Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Sudan List or Scrutinized Companies with Activities in Iran Petroleum Energy Sector List; provides exceptions; provides for civil action; provides penalties; provides statute of repose; prohibits private right of action; requires DMS notify U.S. AG; provides for inoperability of act under specified circumstances. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 443 by Boyd (Compare SB 170)

Electronic Filing and Receipt of Court Documents; Provides legislative intent; requires that each state attorney & public defender implement system by which state attorney & public defender can electronically file court documents with clerk of court & receive court documents from clerk of court; defines term "court documents"; requires that Florida Prosecuting Attorneys Association & Florida Public Defender Association report on progress by specified date. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

# HB 445 by Ingram (Compare HB 119)

Wellness or Health Improvement Programs; Authorizes insurers to offer rewards or incentives to health benefit plan members to encourage or reward participation in wellness or health improvement programs; authorizes insurers to require plan members not participating in programs to provide verification that their medical condition warrants nonparticipation; provides application. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 447 by Williams, A.

Green Job Creation; Provides definitions & definitional criteria that qualify jobs for green job corporate tax credits; provides tax credits against corporate income tax for creation of qualifying green jobs; specifies amount of tax credit allowed for each green job created & maximum number of jobs for which taxpayer may claim credit; limits availability of green job tax credits to specified period of tax years; provides for carryover of tax credit; restricts taxpayer from taking more than one tax credit for same job under certain circumstances; disqualifies jobs transferred from one location to another from tax credit eligibility; requires AWI to establish Green Collar Job Council; provides membership & duties & responsibilities of council; provides for annual reports of council. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 449 by Taylor (Identical SB 146, Compare SB 134)

Criminal Justice; Designates act "Jim King Keep Florida Working Act"; requires state agencies & regulatory boards to identify & evaluate restrictions on licensing & employment for ex-offenders; prohibits state agencies from denying certain applications based on person's lack of civil rights; provides exception; requires employer to review results of criminal background investigation & not place employee with criminal record where conduct similar to past criminal conduct would be facilitated; requires employer to determine that criminal background investigation does not demonstrate that employee is unsuitable for particular work or context of employment in general; clarifies when person may legally deny existence of expunged or sealed criminal history record; authorizes disclosure of expunged record upon specified request from record subject; requires clerks of court to post information relating to procedures to seal or expunge criminal history records on website; authorizes sealing criminal history record of person who had prior criminal record sealed or expunged. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

#### HB 451 by Frishe, Hooper (Identical SB 392)

**Commercial Parasailing;** Creates "Alejandra White Act"; provides requirements for persons conducting commercial parasailing operations; requires annual license from FWCC; requires liability insurance. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 453 by Rehwinkel Vasilinda (Identical SB 78)

**Environmental Surcharge on Bottled Water;** Establishes surcharge on bottled water sold at retail in this state; provides exception; requires that moneys collected from surcharge be deposited into Ecosystem Management and Restoration Trust Fund. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

#### HB 455 by Rehwinkel Vasilinda

Streamlined Sales and Use Tax Agreement; Revises definitions; specifies certain facilities that are exempt from transient rentals tax; deletes application of brackets for calculation of sales & use taxes; revises criteria establishing circumstances under which taxes on sale of prepaid calling arrangements are due; deletes application of brackets for calculation of sales & use taxes; limits \$5,000 cap on discretionary sales surtax to sale of motor vehicles, aircraft, boats, manufactured homes, modular homes, & mobile homes; provides criteria to determine situs of certain sales; deletes provisions relating to mail-order sales; requires purchasers of direct mail to use direct-mail forms; provides criteria for determining location of transactions; revises exemptions from sales & use tax for food & medical products; provides for computation of taxes due based on rounding instead of brackets; deletes procedures for refunds of tax paid on mail-order sales; provides amnesty for uncollected or unpaid sales & use taxes for sellers who register under Streamlined Sales & Use Tax Agreement; provides for adoption of emergency rules; repeals provisions pertaining to taxation of mail-order sales. Effective Date: January 1, 2012

# HB 457 by Ingram, Nelson (Identical SB 606)

Fertilizer; Deletes authority for certain counties & municipalities to adopt fertilizer management practices more stringent than standards of specified model ordinance; requires DOACS to regulate sale of fertilizer, including composition, formulation, packaging, use, application, & distribution of fertilizer; preempts such regulation of fertilizer to state & DOACS; specifies that such regulation of fertilizer by counties, municipalities, & other political subdivisions is void. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

#### HB 459 by Caldwell

**Self-Service Storage Space;** Revises notice requirements relating to enforcement of liens; specifies nonapplication of certain provisions to limitations on liability. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 461 by Grant

Tax on Sales, Use, and Other Transactions; Specifies period during which sales of firearms are exempt from such tax; authorizes DOR to adopt rules. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

## HB 463 by Jones (Similar SB 590)

**Public Employment;** Provides that public employer may not use application that inquires about applicant's arrests or convictions or otherwise inquire into or consider criminal record or criminal history of applicant for employment until applicant has been selected for interview; provides exceptions; provides that employer may notify applicants of policies concerning disqualification from employment for applicants with particular criminal history backgrounds. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 465 by Harrell, Metz (Similar SB 520)

**Florida Veterans' Hall of Fame;** Establishes Florida Veterans' Hall of Fame; provides for administration by DVA; designates location; provides procedures for nomination, selection, & induction. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# **HB 467 by Albritton** (Identical SB 472)

Entities Contracting with the Medicaid Program; Exempts certain entities providing services solely to Medicaid recipients under Medicaid contract from premium tax imposed on premiums, contributions, & assessments received by prepaid limited health service organizations; provides for retroactive operation; specifies that act is remedial in nature & not basis for certain refunds of tax, penalty, or interest. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 469 by Stargel

**Individual Retirement Accounts;** Clarifies exemption of inherited individual retirement accounts from legal processes; provides intent; provides for retroactive application. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

# HB 471 by Nuñez (Compare SB 702)

Cord Blood Banking; Requires State Surgeon General to publish specified information relating to cord blood banking on DOH's Internet website; provides for education of pregnant women regarding umbilical cord blood banking; provides immunity from liability for health care facility or health care provider that provides information regarding umbilical cord blood banking. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

#### **HB 473 by Brandes** (Similar SB 716)

Corporate License Plates; Provides for DHSMV to create Corporate License Plate Program; requires that specified minimum fees be paid by applicants & corporate sponsors for such applications; requires that corporate sponsor meet specified eligibility requirements. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

# HB 475 by Taylor

Corporate Income Tax Credits: Establishes Florida Public School Tax Credit Program; provides for credits against corporate income tax for contributions to public schools for specified purposes; authorizes public schools to determine how to use undesignated contributions; requires public schools to report specified information to DOR; limits total annual amount of credits; requires department to apportion dollar amount of tax credits to each school board receiving eligible contributions; provides formula for apportioning dollar amount of tax credits to each school board for allocation by department to taxpayers applying for corporate income tax credits; provides requirements for taxpayers filing consolidated returns; provides procedures & requirements for rescinding credits; provides for use of rescinded credits by other taxpayers; prohibits specified taxpayers from eligibility to receive corporate tax credit; specifies administrative rules for use & application of credit; provides requirements for deposits of eligible contributions; provides criteria for preservation of tax credits. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 477 by Burgin (Identical SB 246)

Human Trafficking; Specifies documents that must be possessed by each person providing or offering to provide massage services in certain circumstances; requires presentation of such documents upon request of law enforcement officer; requires operators of massage establishments to maintain valid work authorization documents on premises for each employee who is not U.S. citizen; requires presentation of such documents upon request of law enforcement officer; prohibits person from providing or offering to provide massage services without possession of license & specified documentation; prohibits use of massage establishment license for purpose of lewdness, assignation, or prostitution. Effective Date: October 1, 2011

# HB 479 by Horner, Renuart

Medical Malpractice; Requires medical boards to issue expert witness certificates to certain physicians licensed outside of state; provides for validity & use of certifications; exempts physicians issued certifications from certain licensure & fee requirements; provides additional grounds for disciplinary

action; provides for patient forms disclosing risks of cataract surgery & executed form creates rebuttable presumption of disclosure; deletes requirement that medical malpractice insurance contracts contain certain information; provides that certain insurance information is not admissible as evidence in civil actions; requires that certain expert witnesses who provide certain expert testimony meet certain licensure or certification requirements; requires claimants for medical malpractice to execute authorization; allows prospective medical malpractice defendants to interview claimant's treating health care provider without certain notice; authorizes prospective defendants to take unsworn statements of claimant's health care provider; requires that presuit notice for medical negligence claims be accompanied by authorization for release of protected health information; requires dismissal of claim if such authorization is not completed in good faith; limits liability of hospitals related to certain medical negligence claims. Effective Date: July 1,

# HB 481 by Kiar (Identical SB 588)

**Student Safety;** Requires district school board policies that specify emergency procedures to identify agency that is responsible for notifying school district of occurrence that threatens safety of students; requires agency to notify private schools in school district. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**HB 483 by Patronis** (Similar CS/SB 312, Compare CS/SB 314, SB 656)

Practice of Dentistry; Requires persons who apply for licensure renewal as dentist or dental hygienist to furnish certain information to DOH in dental workforce survey; requires department to serve as coordinating body for purpose of collecting, disseminating, & updating dental workforce data; requires department to maintain database regarding state's dental workforce; authorizes certain business entities to pay for prescription drugs obtained by practitioners licensed under ch. 466, F.S.; revises membership of board of directors of Florida Healthy Kids Corporation to include member nominated by Florida Dental Association & appointed by Governor. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**HB 485 by Patronis** (Identical CS/SB 314, Compare CS/SB 312)

Pub. Rec./Dental Workforce Surveys; Provides exemption from public records requirements for information contained in dental workforce surveys submitted by dentists or dental hygienists to DOH as condition for license renewal; provides exceptions; provides for future legislative review & repeal; provides statement of public necessity; provides for contingent effect. Effective Date: the same date that House Bill 483 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session, or an extension thereof, and becomes law

# HB 487 by Gonzalez

**Dextromethorphan;** Prohibits obtaining or delivering to individual in retail sale any nonprescription compound, mixture, or preparation containing dextromethorphan or related

compounds in excess of specified amounts; regulates retail display of products containing dextromethorphan or related compounds; requires training of retail employees; requires person who purchases or otherwise acquires nonprescription compound, mixture, or preparation containing any detectable quantity of dextromethorphan or related compounds to meet specified requirements; provides limited civil immunity for release of information to law enforcement officers. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 489 by Bembry

Road Designations; Designates SP4 Thomas Berry Corbin Memorial Highway & U.S. Navy BMC Samuel Calhoun Chavous, Jr. Memorial Highway in Dixie County; designates Marine Lance Corporal Brian R. Buesing Memorial Highway, United States Army Sergeant Karl A. Campbell Memorial Highway, & U.S. Army SPC James A. Page Memorial Highway in Levy County; directs DOT to erect suitable markers. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 491 by Schwartz (Identical SB 586)

Alzheimer's Disease; Directs DEA to develop & implement public education program relating to screening for Alzheimer's disease within existing resources of department; provides criteria for awarding grants; provides that implementation of memory-impairment screening grant program is contingent upon appropriation of state funds or availability of private resources; specifies types of facilities where employee or direct caregiver providing care for persons with Alzheimer's disease may begin employment without repeating certain training requirements; requires direct caregivers to comply with certain continuing education requirements. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

**HB 493 by Brodeur, Patronis, Abruzzo, Tobia** (Similar SB 376)

Tax on Sales, Use & Other Transactions; Provides definitions relating to tourist development tax & tourist impact tax, transient rentals tax & convention development tax, & municipal resort tax; provides separate statement of tax requirements on various documents; revises requirements for charging, collecting, & remitting such taxes; authorizes DOR to compensate county governments for providing specified information; specifies payment amount; provides definitions relating to municipal resort tax; provides separate statement of tax requirements; provides exception; provides construction. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 495 by Rooney

# **Emergency Fire Rescue Services and Facilities Surtax;** Revises & limits authorized uses for which proceeds from

Revises & limits authorized uses for which proceeds from emergency fire rescue services & facilities surtax may be expended; requires that any review required by ordinance or local agreement to determine continued need for imposition of surtax begin within certain time after imposition of surtax or completion of prior review. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 497 by Rooney, Hager

**Pharmacy;** Prohibits ownership, operation, maintenance, opening, establishment, conduct, or having charge of pharmacy at locations within specified radius of certain pain-management clinics; prohibits dispensing practitioners who own, operate, or are employed by certain pain-management clinics from dispensing at certain locations specified controlled substances prescribed for patients at such clinics; provides penalties. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

# HB 499 by Drake, Kreegel, O'Toole

Concealed Weapons or Firearms; Provides that otherwise qualified members & veterans of U.S. Armed Forces be issued concealed weapon or firearm license regardless of age or U.S. residency in certain circumstances; provides additional methods for taking of fingerprints from such license applicants. Effective Date: upon becoming a law

# HB 501 by Baxley (Similar SB 196)

Choose Life License Plates; Provides for annual use fees to be distributed to Choose Life, Inc., rather than counties; provides for Choose Life, Inc., to redistribute portion of such funds to nongovernmental, not-for-profit agencies that assist certain pregnant women; authorizes Choose Life, Inc., to use portion of funds to administer & promote Choose Life license plate program. Effective Date: July 1, 2011

#### HB 503 by Harrison, Baxley
