Senators Deutch and Rich moved the following amendment:

Senate Amendment (with title amendment)

Delete lines 17 through 44 and insert:

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Section 1. (1) This section may be cited as the "Evolution and Healthy Teens Academic Freedom Act."

- (2) As used in this section, the term:
- (a) "Comprehensive sexual education" means information that:
- 1. Helps young people gain knowledge about the physical, biological, and hormonal changes of adolescence and subsequent stages of human maturation;
- 2. Develops healthy attitudes and values concerning growth, development, and body image;
- 3. Teaches that abstinence is the only certain way to avoid pregnancy or sexually transmitted diseases; and

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- 18 4. Commencing in the 6th grade:
 - a. Emphasizes the value of abstinence while not ignoring those adolescents who may or may not be sexually active;
 - b. Provides information about the health benefits and side effects of all contraceptives and as a means of preventing pregnancy and reducing the risk of contracting sexually transmitted infections, including HIV and AIDS; and
 - c. Encourages family communication about sexuality among parents, their children, and other adult household members.
 - (b) "Factual information" includes, but is not limited to, medical, psychiatric, psychological, empirical, and statistical statements.
 - (c) "Medically accurate information" means information supported by the weight of research conducted in compliance with generally accepted scientific methods and recognized as accurate and objective by leading professional organizations and agencies having relevant expertise in the field.
 - (d) "Scientific information" means germane current facts, data, and peer-reviewed research specific to the topic of chemical and biological evolution as prescribed in Florida's Science Standards.
 - (3) The Legislature finds that current law does not expressly protect the right of teachers to objectively present scientific information relevant to the full range of scientific views regarding chemical and biological evolution and medically accurate information regarding family planning, pregnancy or sexually transmitted infections, including HIV and AIDS. The Legislature finds that in many instances educators have experienced or feared discipline, discrimination, or other adverse consequences as a result of presenting the full range of

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scientific views regarding chemical and biological evolution and medically accurate information regarding family planning, pregnancy or sexually transmitted infections, including HIV and AIDS. The Legislature further finds that existing law does not expressly protect students from discrimination due to their positions or views regarding biological or chemical evolution and their questioning regarding medically accurate information regarding family planning, pregnancy or sexually transmitted infections, including HIV and AIDS. The Legislature finds that the topic of biological and chemical evolution and comprehensive sexual education have generated intense controversy about the rights of teachers and students to hold differing views on those subjects. It is therefore the intent of the Legislature that this section expressly protect those rights.

- (4) Every public school teacher in the state's K-12 school system shall have the affirmative right and freedom to objectively present:
- (a) Scientific information relevant to the full range of scientific views regarding biological and chemical evolution in connection with teaching any prescribed curriculum regarding chemical or biological evolution; and
- (b) Comprehensive sexual education that is medically accurate, factual, and age appropriate in connection with teaching any prescribed abstinence-only curriculum regarding human sexuality.

Section 2. This act shall take effect October 1, 2008.

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An act relating to the teaching of chemical and biological evolution and human sexuality; providing a short title; providing legislative intent; defining the terms "scientific information", "medically accurate information", "comprehensive sexual education", and "factual information"; providing public school teachers with a right to present scientific information relevant to the full range of views on biological and chemical evolution and to provide certain information to students concerning human sexuality to provide information that meets specific criteria; providing an effective date.
