A bill to be entitled

An act relating to childhood immunizations; amending s. 1003.22, F.S.; revising the list of required childhood immunizations; creating s. 1003.221, F.S.; providing a set of recommended vaccination requirements that address the manner and frequency of administration of immunizations for children who are entitled to admittance into kindergarten or any other initial entrance into a public or private school in this state; providing an effective date.

Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 1003.22, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

1003.22 School-entry health examinations; immunization against communicable diseases; exemptions; duties of Department of Health.--

- during this schedule, a parent or guardian may continue with the diphtheria-tetanus-pertussis (DTaP) vaccine or switch to the nothimerosal diphtheria-tetanus (DT) vaccine. If, after any DTaP shot, the child develops a high fever or displays any neurological signs such as seizures or staring spells, strong consideration should be given to discontinuing all further DTaP vaccines and tetanus-diphtheria-pertussis (Tdap) vaccines and switching to DT and tetanus-diphtheria (Td) vaccines.
- (3) In vaccinating his or her child, a parent or guardian, in consultation with his or her pediatrician, may choose between a measles-mumps-rubella combination vaccine, a measles-rubella combination vaccine, or a measles-only vaccine. Because rubella is dangerous to a fetus during pregnancy, only a female who does not contract rubella between 3 years of age and 8 years of age should be given a vaccine for rubella if she has not had rubella by 8 years of age. Similarly, the mumps vaccination need be

  - Section 3. This act shall take effect July 1, 2009.
