It was a pleasure working with you and FASCO Lobbyist Ben Poitevent on issues of mutual concern during the last legislative session. It gave me an opportunity to gain a better understanding of the Security Industry's role in Homeland Security and Hurricane Recovery.

HB 707 A PUBLIC SAFETY BILL

The Florida Association of Security Companies employs more than 100,000 Licensed Security Officers. Florida's Security Industry plays a major role in Florida's Public Safety, Homeland Security, Hurricane Recovery, and works closely with Law Enforcement throughout the State.

Florida has twice as many Licensed Security Officers as Law Enforcement Officers, and Security Officers protect some of Florida's most critical infrastructure, such as Nuclear Power Plants, Fuel Storage Facilities, Sea Ports, Depots, Transportation Centers, Factories, and Residential Communities, and they are frequently the first responders to crimes in progress, medical emergencies, fires, natural and man made disasters. The Security Officer's role is to immediately call Law Enforcement and/or appropriate public emergency services, then stabilize and preserve the area and assist as directed by responding Law Enforcement or other Public Officials.

During many emergency situations, especially during the 2004-5 Hurricane Season which saw lengthy power outages, Law Enforcement Officers responding to emergency calls from Security Officers were unable to locate the Security Officer among the sea of amber and white lights used by the multitude of power company vehicles, wreckers and utility services trucks. The unique combination of 50%Green/50%Amber on Security Agency Owned/Leased Vehicles will clearly stand out allowing responding Law Enforcement Officers and other Emergency Personnel to locate the Security Officer.
