7 Section 1. Section 403.7145, Florida Statutes, is amended  
8 to read:

9 403.7145 Recycling.--

10 (1) The Capitol and the House and Senate office buildings  
 11 constitute the Capitol recycling area. The Florida House of  
 12 Representatives, the Florida Senate, and the Office of the  
 13 Governor, the Secretary of State, and each Cabinet officer who  
 14 heads a department that occupies office space in the Capitol,  
 15 shall institute a recycling program for their respective offices  
 16 in the House and Senate office buildings and the Capitol.

17 Provisions shall be made to collect and sell wastepaper and  
 18 empty aluminum beverage cans generated by employee activities in  
 19 these offices. The collection and sale of such materials shall  
 20 be coordinated with Department of Management Services recycling  
 21 activities to maximize the efficiency and economy of this

22 program. The Governor, the Speaker of the House of  
23 Representatives, the President of the Senate, the Secretary of  
24 State, and the Cabinet officers may authorize the use of  
25 proceeds from recyclable material sales for employee benefits  
26 and other purposes, in order to provide incentives to their  
27 respective employees for participation in the recycling program.  
28 Such proceeds may also be used to offset any costs of the  
29 recycling program.

30 (2) Each state agency, the judicial branch of state  
31 government, and the State University System shall collect and  
32 sell, to the greatest extent practicable, aluminum, glass, and  
33 plastic beverage containers, and other recyclable materials and  
34 products used during the operation of facilities and offices and  
35 may use the proceeds of the sale of such materials and products  
36 for employee benefits and other purposes and thereby provide  
37 incentives for employees to participate in the recycling  
38 program. Such proceeds may also be used to offset any recycling  
39 program costs.

40 (3) Each organization, association, business, or  
41 institution operating in the state and receiving state funds  
42 shall, to the greatest extent practicable, collect aluminum  
43 beverage cans and recyclable plastic and glass at all locations  
44 where the organization, association, business, or institution  
45 operates or does business, and shall offer such materials for  
46 recycling. Each organization, association, business, or  
47 institution may retain and use any proceeds received from the  
48 sale of these materials for recycling to offset the cost  
49 associated with collecting and recycling such materials.

50 (4) Each public airport operating in this state shall, to  
51 the greatest extent practicable, collect aluminum beverage cans

52 and recyclable plastic and glass from the airlines and other  
53 entities doing business at the airport and offer such materials  
54 for recycling. Each airport may retain and use any proceeds  
55 received from the sale of these materials for recycling to  
56 offset the costs associated with collecting and recycling such  
57 materials. Airport administration offices, airport vendors, and  
58 airlines are encouraged to coordinate the collection of  
59 recyclable waste to the greatest extent practicable. The  
60 provisions of this subsection are not intended to interfere with  
61 any already established recycling activity.

62 Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2008.
