Section 1. Section 20.055, Florida Statutes, is amended to
read:

20.055 Agency inspectors general.--

(1) For the purposes of this section:

(a) "State agency" means each department created pursuant
to this chapter, and also includes the Executive Office of the
Governor, the Department of Military Affairs, the Fish and
Wildlife Conservation Commission, the Office of Insurance
Regulation of the Financial Services Commission, the Office of
Financial Regulation of the Financial Services Commission, the
Public Service Commission, and the state courts system.

(b) "Agency head" means a public official that includes
the Governor, a Cabinet officer, a secretary as defined in s.

23 20.03(5), or an executive director as defined in s. 20.03(6). It
24 also includes the chair of the Public Service Commission, the

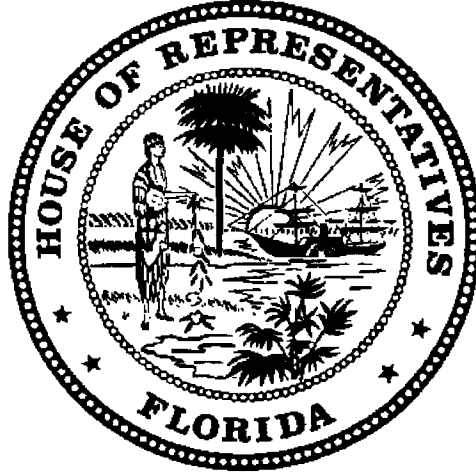

94 notice requiring service by certified or registered mail, a form
95 of notice that is substantially identical in form to that
96 required by law may be lawfully provided via a public notice
97 website to be established by the Department of Management
98 Services. The Department of Management Services shall establish
99 requirements for the website. The website shall be freely
100 accessible to the public and shall be operated by the website
101 provider at no cost to the state. The website provider may
102 charge a reasonable fee for the posting of notice not to exceed
103 \$10, but shall not charge for public access to or use of any of
104 the website's browsing features. The website shall remit to the
105 clerks of court an amount equal to 15 percent of the revenues
106 that would have been generated through the posting of notice by
107 traditional means in the courts within the state.

108 Section 4. If any provision of this act or the application
109 thereof to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the
110 invalidity shall not affect other provisions or applications of
111 the act which can be given effect without the invalid provision
112 or application, and to this end the provisions of this act are
113 declared severable.

114 Section 5. This act shall take effect July 1, 2007.
