37 principal's designee, shall call the student's parents and send  
38 them a written letter regarding the student's suspension; for a  
39 third offense, the student shall be suspended from school  
40 pursuant to s. 1003.01(5)(b), for 10 days, and the school  
41 principal, or principal's designee, shall meet with the  
42 student's parents; and for a fourth or subsequent violation, the  
43 student shall be suspended from school pursuant to s.  
44 1003.01(5)(a).
