Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of section 1001.43, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

9 1001.43 Supplemental powers and duties of district school 10 board.--The district school board may exercise the following 11 supplemental powers and duties as authorized by this code or 12 State Board of Education rule.

(1) STUDENT MANAGEMENT. -- The district school board may adopt programs and policies to ensure the safety and welfare of individuals, the student body, and school personnel, which programs and policies may:

(b) Require uniforms to be worn by the student body, or impose other dress-related requirements, if the district school board finds that those requirements are necessary for the safety or welfare of the student body or school personnel. However, students may wear sunglasses, hats, or other sun-protective wear while outdoors during school hours, such as when students are at

8 1006.07 District school board duties relating to student 9 discipline and school safety.—The district school board shall 10 provide for the proper accounting for all students, for the 11 attendance and control of students at school, and for proper 12 attention to health, safety, and other matters relating to the 13 welfare of students, including:

(2) CODE OF STUDENT CONDUCT.-Adopt a code of student 14 15 conduct for elementary schools and a code of student conduct for 16 middle and high schools and distribute the appropriate code to all teachers, school personnel, students, and parents, at the 17 beginning of every school year. Each code shall be organized and 18 written in language that is understandable to students and 19 20 parents and shall be discussed at the beginning of every school year in student classes, school advisory council meetings, and 21 22 parent and teacher association or organization meetings. 23 code shall be based on the rules governing student conduct and 24 discipline adopted by the district school board and shall be 25 made available in the student handbook or similar publication. 26 Each code shall include, but is not limited to:

27 (m) A prohibition against a student wearing and exposing 28 below-waist underwear while on the grounds of a public school in 29 a manner that exposes or exhibits the student's covered or 30 uncovered sexual organs in a vulgar and indecent manner. A student found in violation of this prohibition is subject to the 31 following penalties: for a first offense, a student shall be 32 33 given a verbal warning, and the school principal, or principal's 34 designee, shall call the student's parents; for a second 35 offense, a student shall be suspended from school pursuant to s. 1003.01(5)(b), for 3 days, and the school principal, or 36 37 principal's designee, shall call the student's parents and send them a written letter regarding the student's suspension; for a 38 third offense, the student shall be suspended from school 39 pursuant to s. 1003.01(5)(b), for 10 days, and the school 40 principal, or principal's designee, shall meet with the 41 42 student's parents; and for a fourth or subsequent violation, the student shall be suspended from school pursuant to s. 43 44 1003.01(5)(a). 45 Section 2. This act shall take effect on July 1, 2008. 46
