- (4) The commission shall also promote, develop, and support research activities directed toward the more effective and efficient control of aquatic plants. In the furtherance of this purpose, the commission may is authorized to:

 - 403.088 Water pollution operation permits; conditions.
- (1) No person, Without the written authorization of the department, a person may not shall discharge any waste into the waters of within the state any waste which, by itself or in combination with the wastes of other sources, reduces the quality of the receiving waters below the classification established for such waters them. However, this section does shall not be deemed to prohibit the application of pesticides to such waters in the state for the control of insects, aquatic weeds, or algae, or other pests if provided the application is
