This program shall be known as the Educational Dollars for Duty program (EDD).

- 1. Ineligible members include, but are not limited to, any member, commissioned officer, warrant officer, or enlisted person who has obtained a master's degree using the program.
- 2. Courses not authorized include noncredit courses, courses that do not meet degree requirements, courses that do not meet requirements for completion of career training, or other courses as determined by program definitions.
- 3. College-preparatory courses are authorized for the program.
- (c) The Adjutant General shall adopt rules for the overall policy, guidance, administration, implementation, and proper use of the program. Such rules must include, but not be limited to, guidelines for certification by the Adjutant General of a guard

competitive advantage. An unfair competitive advantage exists

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where the vendor competing for award of a contract obtained:

- Access to information that is not available to the public and would assist the vendor in obtaining the contract.
- Source selection information that is relevant to the contract but is not available to all competitors, and such information would assist the vendor in obtaining the contract.

An unfair competitive advantage does not exist as a result of the vendor acquiring expertise and having access to publicly available information as a result of performing the incumbent contract or another similar contract. A person who receives a contract that has not been procured pursuant to subsections (1) through (5) to perform a feasibility study of the potential implementation of a subsequent contract, who participates in the drafting of a solicitation or who develops a program for future implementation, is not eligible to contract with the agency for any other contracts dealing with that specific subject matter and any firm in which such person has any interest is not eligible to receive such contract. However, this prohibition does not prevent a vendor who responds to a request for information from being eligible to contract with an agency.
