Section 1. Subsections (3) and (19) of section 943.10, Florida Statutes, are amended to read:

- 943.10 Definitions; ss. 943.085-943.255.—The following words and phrases as used in ss. 943.085-943.255 are defined as follows:
- (3) "Correctional probation officer" means a person who is employed full time by the state, or by any private entity which has contracted with the state pursuant to proviso in PCB APC 11-01, Section 4, in the Department of Corrections budget directing the department procure the provision comprehensive correctional services, and whose primary responsibility is the supervised custody, surveillance, and control of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or community controllees within

institutions of the Department of Corrections or within the community. The term includes supervisory personnel whose duties include, in whole or in part, the supervision, training, and guidance of correctional probation officers, but excludes management and administrative personnel above, but not including, the probation and parole regional administrator level.

- (19) "Part-time correctional probation officer" means a person who is employed less than full time by the state, or by any private entity which has contracted with the state pursuant to proviso in PCB APC 11-01, Section 4, in the Department of Corrections budget directing the department procure the provision comprehensive correctional services, and whose primary responsibility is the supervised custody, surveillance, and control of assigned inmates, probationers, parolees, or community controllees within institutions of the Department of Corrections or in the community.
- Section 2. Subsection (4) of section 944.02, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 944.02 Definitions.—The following words and phrases used in this chapter shall, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise, have the following meanings:
- (4) "Elderly offender" means a prisoner age 50 or older in a state correctional institution or <u>a private correctional</u> facility operated by the Department of Corrections or the Department of Management Services.
- Section 3. Section 944.1051, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

944.1051 Contractual arrangements with private entities for the supervision of offenders on community supervision.—

- (1) Pursuant to proviso in PCB APC 11-01, Section 4, in the Department of Corrections budget directing the department procure the provision comprehensive correctional services, the Department of Corrections is authorized to enter into contracts with a private entity for the provision of the supervision of offenders on community supervision in Broward and Miami-Dade counties. A contract entered into pursuant to this section must:
- (a) Offer a cost savings to the state of at least 7 percent, as determined by the department. In determining the cost savings, the department shall calculate all the cost components that contribute to the offender per diem, including all administrative costs associated with central, regional, and circuit office administration. Services which are provided to the department by other government agencies without any direct cost to the department shall be assigned an equivalent cost and included in the per diem;
- (b) Require that the private entity comply with all statutes relating to the supervision of offenders on community supervision, all rules of the department, all court orders relating to offenders on community supervision, and all American Correctional Association standards;
- (c) Require the department, in consultation with the private vendor, to establish high, reasonable, and achievable performance standards that the private entity must meet.

- (d) Require the private entity to report to the department whether the private entity has met the established performance standards.
- (e) Require the private entity to provide at least the same quality of services as that offered by the department;
- (f) Require that correctional probation officers employed by a private entity be certified under 943.1395, at the private entity's expense; and
- (g) Require the private entity to give first consideration for employment to employees of the department located in Broward and Miami-Dade counties.
- (2) The private entity entering into a contract with the department pursuant to this section shall be liable in tort with respect to the supervision of offenders under its supervision and for any breach of contract with the department.
- (3) The provisions of ss. 216.311 and 287.057 shall apply to all contracts between the department and any private entity providing community supervision services. The department shall promulgate rules pursuant to chapter 120 specifying criteria for such contractual arrangements.

- (b) "Employee" means an employee of the department or a private vendor in a contractual relationship with the department either the Department of Corrections or the Department of Management Services, and includes persons such as contractors, volunteers, or law enforcement officers who are within a state correctional facility to perform a professional service.
- Section 5. Subsection (1) of section 944.72, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 944.72 Privately Operated Institutions Inmate Welfare Trust Fund.—
- (1) There is hereby created in the Department of Corrections the Privately Operated Institutions Inmate Welfare Trust Fund. The purpose of the trust fund shall be the benefit and welfare of inmates incarcerated in private correctional facilities under contract with the department pursuant to this chapter or the Department of Management Services pursuant to chapter 957. 948.001 Definitions.—As used in this chapter, the term:

(14) "Department" or "Department of Corrections" includes a private entity who has contracted with the Department of Corrections pursuant to s. 944.1051.

Section 10. Subsection (5) of section 948.01, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

948.01 When court may place defendant on probation or into community control.—

(5) The imposition of sentence may not be suspended and the defendant thereupon placed on probation or into community control unless the defendant is placed under the custody of the department or another public or private entity. Except as

provided in s. 944.1051, a $\mbox{\cite{A}}$ private entity may not provide probationary or supervision services to felony or misdemeanor offenders sentenced or placed on probation or other supervision by the circuit court.

Section 11. Effective July 1, 2011, the statutory powers, duties, and functions, and the records, personnel, property, and unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations, or other funds related to the requirements of chapter 957 that are currently under the Department of Management Services are hereby transferred to the Department of Corrections by a type two transfer, pursuant to s. 20.06. The secretary of the Department of Corrections is authorized to establish units or subunits and to assign administrative authority for the responsibilities and functions transferred pursuant to this section.

957.04 Contract requirements.-

- (1) A contract entered into under this chapter for the operation of private correctional facilities shall maximize the cost savings of such facilities and shall:
- (a) Be negotiated with the firm found most qualified. However, a contract for private correctional services may not be entered into by the <u>department Department of Management Services</u> unless the <u>department Department of Management Services</u> determines that the contractor has demonstrated that it has:

- 1. The qualifications, experience, and management personnel necessary to carry out the terms of the contract.
- 2. The ability to expedite the siting, design, and construction of correctional facilities.
- 3. The ability to comply with applicable laws, court orders, and national correctional standards.
- (b) Indemnify the state and the department, including their officials and agents, against any and all liability, including, but not limited to, civil rights liability. Proof of satisfactory insurance is required in an amount to be determined by the department Department of Management Services.
- (e) Establish operations standards for correctional facilities subject to the contract. However, if the department and the contractor disagree with an operations standard, the contractor may propose to waive any rule, policy, or procedure of the department related to the operations standards of correctional facilities which is inconsistent with the mission of the contractor to establish cost-effective, privately operated correctional facilities. The department Department of Management Services shall be responsible for considering all proposals from the contractor to waive any rule, policy, or procedure and shall render a final decision granting or denying such request.
- (g) Require the selection and appointment of a full-time contract monitor. The contract monitor shall be appointed and supervised by the <u>department Department of Management Services</u>. The contractor is required to reimburse the <u>department</u>

 Department of Management Services for the salary and expenses of

the contract monitor. It is the obligation of the contractor to provide suitable office space for the contract monitor at the correctional facility. The contract monitor shall have unlimited access to the correctional facility.

- (2) Each contract entered into for the design and construction of a private correctional facility or juvenile commitment facility must include:
- (c) A specific provision requiring the contractor, and not the <u>department</u> Department of Management Services, to obtain the financing required to design and construct the private correctional facility or juvenile commitment facility built under this chapter.
- (5) Each contract entered into by the <u>department</u>

 Department of Management Services must include substantial minority participation unless demonstrated by evidence, after a good faith effort, as impractical and must also include any other requirements the <u>department</u> Department of Management Services considers necessary and appropriate for carrying out the purposes of this chapter.
- (6) Notwithstanding s. 253.025(7), the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund need not approve a lease-purchase agreement negotiated by the <u>department Department of Management Services</u> if the <u>department Department of Management Services</u> finds that there is a need to expedite the lease-purchase.
- (7) (a) Notwithstanding s. 253.025 or s. 287.057, whenever the <u>department Department of Management Services</u> finds it to be in the best interest of timely site acquisition, it may contract

without the need for competitive selection with one or more appraisers whose names are contained on the list of approved appraisers maintained by the Division of State Lands of the Department of Environmental Protection in accordance with s. 253.025(6)(b). In those instances when the <u>department Department of Management Services</u> directly contracts for appraisal services, it shall also contract with an approved appraiser who is not employed by the same appraisal firm for review services.

(b) Notwithstanding s. 253.025(6), the <u>department</u>

Department of Management Services may negotiate and enter into lease-purchase agreements before an appraisal is obtained. Any such agreement must state that the final purchase price cannot exceed the maximum value allowed by law.

957.06 Powers and duties not delegable to contractor.—A contract entered into under this chapter does not authorize, allow, or imply a delegation of authority to the contractor to:

The contractor may request, in writing, that an inmate be transferred to a facility operated by the department. The Department of Management Services, the contractor, and the department shall develop and implement a cooperative agreement for transferring inmates between a correctional facility operated by the department and a private correctional facility. The department, the Department of Management Services, and the contractor must comply with the cooperative agreement.

Such cost savings as determined by the department Department of Management Services must be based upon the actual costs associated with the construction and operation of similar facilities or services as determined by the department Department of Corrections and certified by the Auditor General. The department Department of Corrections shall calculate all of the cost components that determine the inmate per diem in correctional facilities of a substantially similar size, type, and location that are operated by the department Department of Corrections, including administrative costs associated with central administration. Services that are provided to the department Department of Corrections by other governmental agencies at no direct cost to the department shall be assigned an equivalent cost and included in the per diem.
- (4) The <u>department</u> Department of Corrections shall provide a report detailing the state cost to design, finance, acquire, lease, construct, and operate a facility similar to the private correctional facility on a per diem basis. This report shall be provided to the Auditor General in sufficient time that it may

be certified to the Department of Management Services to be included in the request for proposals.

(5)

(d) If a private vendor chooses not to renew the contract at the appropriated level, the <u>department Department of Management Services</u> shall terminate the contract as provided in s. 957.14.

Section 15. Section 957.08, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

957.08 Capacity requirements.—The <u>department</u> Department of Corrections shall transfer and assign prisoners to each private correctional facility opened pursuant to this chapter in an amount not less than 90 percent or more than 100 percent of the capacity of the facility pursuant to the contract with the <u>department Department of Management Services</u>. The prisoners transferred by the <u>department Department of Corrections</u> shall represent a cross-section of the general inmate population, based on the grade of custody or the offense of conviction, at the most comparable facility operated by the department.

Section 16. Section 957.14, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

957.14 Contract termination and control of a correctional facility by the department.—A detailed plan shall be provided by a private vendor under which the department shall assume temporary control of a private correctional facility upon termination of the contract. The <u>department Department of Management Services</u> may terminate the contract with cause after written notice of material deficiencies and after 60 workdays in

order to correct the material deficiencies. If any event occurs that involves the noncompliance with or violation of contract terms and that presents a serious threat to the safety, health, or security of the inmates, employees, or the public, the department may temporarily assume control of the private correctional facility, with the approval of the Department of Management Services. A plan shall also be provided by a private vendor for the purchase and temporary assumption of operations of a correctional facility by the department in the event of bankruptcy or the financial insolvency of the private vendor. The private vendor shall provide an emergency plan to address inmate disturbances, employee work stoppages, strikes, or other serious events in accordance with standards of the American Correctional Association.

957.15 Funding of contracts for operation, maintenance, and lease-purchase of private correctional facilities.—The request for appropriation of funds to make payments pursuant to contracts entered into by the department Department of Management Services for the operation, maintenance, and lease-purchase of the private correctional facilities authorized by this chapter shall be made by the Department of Management Services in a request to the department. The department shall include such request in its budget request to the Legislature as a separately identified item and shall forward the request of the Department of Management Services without change. nonrecurring general revenue, \$250,000 shall be for the Holocaust Documentation and Education Center in Hollywood.

Line item amendments are accepted as part of the amendatory process. However, due to the necessity of using computerized systems this may entail a different placement within a budget entity or the renumbering of the specific appropriation items.
