Amendment (with title amendment)

Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert:

Section 1. Confidentiality of certain donor information related to a publicly owned performing arts center.—

- (1) As used in this section, the term "publicly owned performing arts center" means a facility consisting of at least 200 seats, owned and operated by a county or municipality, which is used and occupied to promote development of any or all of the performing, visual, or fine arts or any or all matters relating thereto and to encourage and cultivate public and professional knowledge and appreciation of the arts.
- (2) If a donor or prospective donor of a donation made for the benefit of a publicly owned performing arts center desires to remain anonymous, information that would identify the name, address, or telephone number of that donor or prospective donor

- is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1), Florida Statutes, and s. 24(a), Article I of the State Constitution.
- (3) This section is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15, Florida Statutes, and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2016, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.
- Section 2. Subsection (7) is added to section 272.136, Florida Statutes, to read:
- 272.136 Direct-support organization.—The Legislative Research Center and Museum at the Historic Capitol and the Capitol Curator may establish a direct-support organization to provide assistance and promotional support through fundraising for the Florida Historic Capitol and the Legislative Research Center and Museum, including, but not limited to, their educational programs and initiatives.
- (7) (a) The identity of a donor or prospective donor to the direct-support organization who desires to remain anonymous and all information identifying such donor or prospective donor is confidential and exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution. Such anonymity shall be maintained in any auditor's report created pursuant to the annual financial audits required under subsection (5).
- (b) This subsection is subject to the Open Government
 Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand
 repealed on October 2, 2016, unless reviewed and saved from
 repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.
- Section 3. The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that information that would identify the name,

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address, or telephone number of a donor or prospective donor of a donation made for the benefit of a publicly owned performing arts center be made confidential and exempt from public-records requirements if such donor or prospective donor desires to remain anonymous. The Legislature further finds that it is a public necessity that information identifying a donor or prospective donor to the direct-support organization for the Florida Historic Capitol and the Legislative Research Center and Museum be made confidential and exempt from public-records requirements if such donor or prospective donor desires to remain anonymous. In order to encourage private support for publicly owned performing arts centers and the direct-support organization, it is a public necessity to promote the giving of gifts to, and the raising of private funds for, the acquisition, renovation, rehabilitation, and operation of publicly owned performing arts centers and the programming and preservation of the Florida Historic Capitol and the Legislative Research Center and Museum. An essential element of an effective plan for promoting the giving of private gifts and the raising of private funds is the need to protect the identity of prospective and actual donors who desire to remain anonymous. If the identity of prospective and actual donors who desire to remain anonymous is subject to disclosure, there is a chilling effect on donations because donors are concerned about disclosure of personal information leading to theft and, in particular, identity theft, including personal safety and security. Therefore, the Legislature finds that it is a public necessity to make confidential and exempt from public-records requirements

information that would identify a donor or prospective donor of a donation made for the benefit of a publicly owned performing arts center or a donor or prospective donor to the direct-support organization for the Florida Historic Capitol and the Legislative Research Center and Museum if such donor or prospective donor wishes to remain anonymous.

Section 4. This act shall take effect October 1, 2011.

Section 2. Subsection (6) of section 327.395, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

327.395 Boating safety identification cards.-

- (6) A person is exempt from subsection (1) if he or she:
- (a) Is licensed by the United States Coast Guard to serve as master of a vessel.
 - (b) Operates a vessel only on a private lake or pond.
- (c) Is accompanied in the vessel by a person who is exempt from this section or who holds an identification card in compliance with this section, is 18 years of age or older, and is attendant to the operation of the vessel and responsible for the safe operation of the vessel and for any violation that occurs during the operation.
- (d) Is a nonresident who has in his or her possession Amendment 2

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proof that he or she has completed a boater education course or equivalency examination in another state which meets or exceeds the requirements of subsection (1).

- (e) Is operating a vessel within 90 days after the purchase of that vessel and has available for inspection aboard that vessel a bill of sale meeting the requirements of s. 328.46(1).
- (f) Is operating a vessel within 90 days after completing the requirements of paragraph (1)(a) or paragraph (1)(b) and has available for inspection photographic identification and his or her boater education certificate as proof that the course was successfully completed. The boater education certificate must provide, at a minimum, the student's first and last name, the student's date of birth, and the date he or she passed the course examination.
 - (g) (f) Is exempted by rule of the commission.
- Section 3. Subsection (2) of section 327.54, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
 - 327.54 Liveries; safety regulations; penalty.-
- (2) A livery may not knowingly lease, hire, or rent any vessel powered by a motor of 10 horsepower or greater to any person who is required to comply with s. 327.395, unless such person presents to the livery a valid boater safety identification card or proof of meeting the temporary exemption provided by s. 327.395(6)(f) to the livery.

Section 1. Section 218.075, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

218.075 Reduction or waiver of permit processing fees.—
Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Department of
Environmental Protection and the water management districts
shall reduce or waive permit processing fees for counties with a
population of 50,000 or fewer less on April 1, 1994, until such
counties exceed a population of 75,000 and municipalities with a
population of 25,000 or fewer; an entity created by special act,
local ordinance, or interlocal agreement of such counties or
municipalities; less, or any county or municipality not included
within a metropolitan statistical area. Fee reductions or
waivers shall be approved on the basis of fiscal hardship or
environmental need for a particular project or activity. The

Amendment No. $\underline{1}$ governing body must certify that the cost of the permit processing fee is a fiscal hardship due to one of the following factors:

- (1) Per capita taxable value is less than the statewide average for the current fiscal year;
- (2) Percentage of assessed property value that is exempt from ad valorem taxation is higher than the statewide average for the current fiscal year;
- (3) Any condition specified in s. 218.503(1) which results in the county or municipality being in a state of financial emergency;
- (4) Ad valorem operating millage rate for the current fiscal year is greater than 8 mills; or
- (5) A financial condition that is documented in annual financial statements at the end of the current fiscal year and indicates an inability to pay the permit processing fee during that fiscal year.

The permit applicant must be the governing body of a county or municipality, or a third party under contract with a county or municipality, or an entity created by special act, local ordinance, or interlocal agreement, and the project for which the fee reduction or waiver is sought must serve a public purpose. If a permit processing fee is reduced, the total fee may shall not exceed \$100.

Section 2. Subsection (6) is added to section 373.118, Florida Statutes, to read:

373.118 General permits; delegation.-

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- (6) By July 1, 2011, the department shall initiate rulemaking to adopt a general permit for stormwater management systems serving airside activities at airports. The general permit applies statewide and shall be administered by any water management district or any delegated local government pursuant to the operating agreements applicable to part IV of this chapter, with no additional rulemaking required. These rules are not subject to any special rulemaking requirements related to small business.
- Section 3. Section 373.4131, Florida Statutes, is created to read:
- 373.4131 Conceptual permits for urban redevelopment projects.—
- (1) A municipality or county that has created a community redevelopment area or an urban infill and redevelopment area pursuant to chapter 163 may adopt a stormwater adaptive management plan that addresses the quantity and quality of stormwater discharges for the redevelopment or infill area and may obtain a conceptual permit from the water management district or the Department of Environmental Protection.
- (2) The conceptual permit established by a water management district in consultation with the department:
- (a) Must allow for the rate and volume of stormwater discharges for stormwater management systems of urban redevelopment projects located within a community redevelopment area created under part III of chapter 163 or an urban infill and redevelopment area designated under s. 163.2517 to continue up to the maximum rate and volume of stormwater discharges

Amendment No. 1 within the area as of the date the stormwater adaptive management plan was adopted.

- (b) Must presume that stormwater discharges for stormwater management systems of urban redevelopment projects located within a community redevelopment area created under part III of chapter 163 or an urban infill and redevelopment area designated under s. 163.2517 that demonstrate a net improvement of the quality of the discharged water that existed as of the date the stormwater adaptive management plan was adopted for any applicable pollutants of concern in the receiving water body do not cause or contribute to violations of water quality criteria.
- (c) May not prescribe additional or more stringent limitations concerning the quantity and quality of stormwater discharges from stormwater management systems than provided in this section.
- (d) Shall be issued for a duration of 20 years, and may be renewed, unless a shorter duration is requested by the applicant.

403.9336 Legislative findings.—The Legislature finds that the implementation of the Model Ordinance for Florida-Friendly Fertilizer Use on Urban Landscapes 2010 (2008), which was developed by the department in conjunction with the Consumer Fertilizer Task Force, the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, and the University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences, will assist in protecting the quality of Florida's surface water and groundwater resources. The Legislature further finds that local conditions, including variations in the types and quality of water bodies, sitespecific soils and geology, and urban or rural densities and characteristics, may necessitate the implementation of

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- additional or more stringent fertilizer management practices at the local government level.
- Section 2. Section 403.9337, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:
- 403.9337 Model Ordinance for Florida-Friendly Fertilizer Use on Urban Landscapes.—Except as otherwise provided in ss. 570.07(41) and 576.181(5):
- (1) All county and municipal governments are encouraged to adopt and enforce the <u>most recent version of the</u> Model Ordinance for Florida-Friendly Fertilizer Use on Urban Landscapes or an equivalent requirement as a mechanism for protecting local surface and groundwater quality.
- (2) <u>Unless exempt pursuant to subsection (4)(a)</u>, each county and municipal government located within the watershed of a water body or water segment that is listed as impaired by nutrients pursuant to s. 403.067, shall, at a minimum, adopt and enforce the most recent version of the department's Model Ordinance for Florida-Friendly Fertilizer Use on Urban Landscapes.
- (3) Notwithstanding subsection (2), a county or municipal A-local government may adopt fertilizer ordinances that establish standards that are in addition to additional or more stringent standards than the model ordinance if each of the following criteria is are met:
- (a) The <u>county or municipal local</u> government has demonstrated, as part of a comprehensive program to address <u>multiple</u> nonpoint sources of nutrient pollution which is science-based, and economically and technically feasible, <u>and</u>

the additional or more stringent standards that additional or more stringent standards than the model ordinance are necessary in order to adequately address urban fertilizer contributions to nonpoint source nutrient loading to a water body;

- that it has considered all relevant scientific information, including input from the department, the institute, the Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services, and the University of Florida Institute of Food and Agricultural Sciences, if provided, on the need for additional or more stringent provisions to address fertilizer use as a contributor to water quality degradation. All documentation must become part of the public record before adoption of the additional or more stringent criteria; and -
- (c) The county or municipal government reports the adoption of its fertilizer ordinances to the department.
- (4) (a) (3) This section and the preemption provisions of ss. 570.07(41) and 576.181(5) do not apply to the fertilizer ordinances of a Any county or municipal government that adopted such ordinances before July 1, 2011 its own fertilizer use ordinance before January 1, 2009, is exempt from this section. Ordinances adopted or amended on or after January 1, 2009, must substantively conform to the most recent version of the model fertilizer ordinance and are subject to subsections (1) and (2), as applicable.
- (b) (4) This section does not apply to the use of fertilizer on farm operations as defined in s. 823.14 or on lands classified as agricultural lands pursuant to s. 193.461.

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- Section 3. Subsection (16) of section 570.07, Florida Statutes, are amended, present subsection (41) is renumbered as subsection (42), and a new subsection is added to that section, to read:

If an agency rejects all bids, or proposals, or replies submitted in response to a competitive solicitation an invitation to bid or request for proposals and the agency concurrently provides notice of its intent to reissue the competitive solicitation invitation to bid or request for proposals, the rejected bids, or proposals, or replies remain exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution until such time as the agency provides notice of an a decision or intended decision pursuant to s. 120.57(3)(a) concerning the reissued competitive solicitation invitation to bid or request for proposals or until the agency withdraws the reissued competitive solicitation invitation to bid or request for proposals. A bid, proposal, or reply is not exempt for longer than 12 months after the initial agency notice rejecting all bids, proposals, or replies. This sub-subparagraph is subject to the Open Government Sunset Review Act in accordance with s. 119.15 and shall stand repealed on October 2, 2011, unless reviewed and saved from repeal through reenactment by the Legislature.

2.a. A competitive sealed reply in response to an invitation to negotiate, as defined in s. 287.012, is exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution until such time as the agency provides notice of a decision or intended decision pursuant to s. 120.57(3)(a) or until 20 days

after the final competitive sealed replies are all opened, whichever occurs earlier.

b. If an agency rejects all competitive sealed replies in response to an invitation to negotiate and concurrently provides notice of its intent to reissue the invitation to negotiate and reissues the invitation to negotiate within 90 days after the notice of intent to reissue the invitation to negotiate, the rejected replies remain exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution.
- 2. Any portion of a team meeting at which negotiation strategies are discussed is exempt from s. 286.011 and s. 24(b), Art. I of the State Constitution.
- (c) (b) 1. A complete recording shall be made of any portion of an exempt meeting made exempt in paragraph (a). No portion of the exempt meeting may be held off the record.
- 2. The recording of, and any records presented at, the exempt meeting are required under subparagraph 1. is exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution until such time as the agency provides notice of an a decision or intended decision pursuant to s. 120.57(3)(a) or until 30 20 days after opening the bids, proposals, or final replies the final competitive sealed replies are all opened, whichever occurs earlier.

If the agency rejects all bids, proposals, or sealed replies and concurrently provides notice of its intent to reissue a competitive solicitation, the recording and any records presented at the exempt meeting remain remains exempt from s. 119.07(1) and s. 24(a), Art. I of the State Constitution

(1) The Legislature finds that it is a public necessity that bids, proposals, or replies submitted to an agency in response to a competitive solicitation be made temporarily exempt from public records requirements. Such records shall be made available when the agency provides notice of an intended decision, or when the agency rejects all bids, proposals, or replies and ultimately withdraws a reissued competitive solicitation. Temporarily protecting such information ensures that the process of responding to a competitive solicitation remains fair and economical for vendors, while still preserving oversight after a competitive solicitation decision is made or withdrawn.
