Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert:

Section 1. The Department of Environmental Protection is directed to publish a notice of proposed rulemaking no later than May 31, 2012, to revise the dissolved oxygen criteria applicable to Florida waterbodies to take into account the variability occurring in nature.

Section 2. Section 403.0675, Florida Statutes, is created to read:

403.0675 Numeric nutrient water quality criteria.-

(1) (a) The department, water management districts, and all other state, regional, and local governmental entities may not implement or give any effect to the United States Environmental Protection Agency's nutrient water quality criteria rules for the state's lakes and flowing waters, finalized on December 6, 2010, and published in Volume 75, No. 233 of the Federal

- Register, in any regulatory program administered by the department, water management district, or governmental entity where the criteria are more stringent than necessary to protect the biological community and the designated use.
- (b) The prohibition in paragraph (a) does not limit the ability of any water management district or any other state, regional, or local governmental entity from applying for any pollution discharge permit or complying with the conditions of such permits, including those issued under the Federal National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System, or from implementing best management practices, source control, or pollution abatement measures for water quality improvement programs as provided by law.
- (2) This section does not derogate or limit county and municipal home rule authority.
- (3) (a) Notwithstanding subsection (1), the department may adopt numeric nutrient water quality criteria for a particular surface water or group of surface waters pursuant to s. 403.061, which may be expressed in terms of concentration, mass loading, waste load allocation, and surrogate standards, such as chlorophyll-a, and may be supplemented by narrative statements.
- (b) The standards established pursuant to this subsection shall be based on objective and credible data, scientific studies and analysis. The department's implementation of the standard shall only require nutrient reductions where necessary to protect the biological community and the designated use.
- (4) Numeric nutrient total maximum daily loads developed by the department and approved by the United States

- which shall be composed of each governing board member residing in the basin or appointed by the governing board chair and other members which the Governor may choose to appoint who reside in the basin. The basin board shall have at least not less than three members, including one or more representatives but shall include one representative from each of the counties included in the basin.
- (3) Except for members of the district governing board serving on a basin board pursuant to subsection (2) and (6), each member of a the various basin board boards shall be appointed serve for a period of 3 years or until a successor is appointed, but not more than 180 days after the end of the term. The board membership of each new basin board

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shall be divided into three groups as equally as possible, with members in such groups to be appointed for 1, 2, and 3 years, respectively. Each basin board shall choose a vice chair and a secretary to serve for a period of 1 year. The term of office of a basin board member shall be construed to commence on March 2 preceding the date of appointment and to terminate March 1 of the year of the end of a term or may continue until a successor is appointed, but not more than 180 days after the end of the expired term. Members of the district governing board serving on a basin board pursuant to subsection (2) and (6) shall serve for a period commensurate with his or her term on the governing board.

- (4)Except for a member of the district governing board serving on a basin board pursuant to subsection (2) and (6), members of a basin board boards shall be appointed by the Governor, subject to confirmation by the Senate at the next regular session of the Legislature.; and The refusal or failure of the Senate to confirm an appointment shall create a vacancy in the office to which the appointment was made.
- Basin board members shall serve without receive no compensation for services as such; but are entitled to reimbursement for per diem and travel expenses as provided in s. 112.061, while officially on work for the district, they shall receive their actual travel expenses between their respective places of residence and the place where official district business is conducted, subsistence, lodging, and other expenses in the amount actually incurred. These expenses may not exceed the statutory amount allowed state officers and employees. This

Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 202.16, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

202.16 Payment.—The taxes imposed or administered under this chapter and chapter 203 shall be collected from all dealers of taxable communications services on the sale at retail in this state of communications services taxable under this chapter and chapter 203. The full amount of the taxes on a credit sale, installment sale, or sale made on any kind of deferred payment plan is due at the moment of the transaction in the same manner as a cash sale.

(3) (a) A dealer must compute the tax due on the sale of communications services imposed pursuant to this chapter and chapter 203 based on a rounding algorithm that meets the following criteria:

- 1. The computation of the tax must be carried to the third decimal place.
 - 2. The tax must be rounded to a whole cent using a method that rounds up to the next cent whenever the third decimal place is greater than four.
 - (b) The rounding algorithm must be applied to the local communications services tax imposed pursuant to this chapter separately from its application to the communications services taxes imposed pursuant to s. 202.12 and the gross receipts taxes imposed pursuant to s. 203.01.
 - (c) A dealer may apply the rounding algorithm to the taxes imposed pursuant to ss. 202.12 and 203.01 in one of the following ways:
 - 1. Apply the rounding algorithm to the combined taxes imposed pursuant to ss. 202.12 and 203.01.
 - 2. Apply the rounding algorithm to the communications services taxes imposed pursuant to s. 202.12(1) and apply the rounding algorithm separately to the combined gross receipts taxes imposed pursuant to ss. 203.01(1)(b)2. and 203.01(1)(b)3.
 - 3. Apply the rounding algorithm to the combined taxes imposed pursuant to ss. 202.12(1) and 203.01(1)(b)3., as allowed by ss. 202.12001 and 203.001, and apply the rounding algorithm separately to the gross receipts tax imposed pursuant to s. 203.01(1)(b)2.
 - (d) Under paragraph (b) or paragraph (c), a dealer may apply the rounding algorithm to the aggregate tax amount that is computed on all taxable items on an invoice or to each tax amount that is computed on one or more, but less than all,

- (1) The Legislature finds that the competitive provision of local exchange service requires appropriate continued regulatory oversight of carrier-to-carrier relationships in order to provide for the development of fair and effective competition.
- (2) It is the intent of the Legislature that in resolving disputes, the commission treat all providers of telecommunications services fairly by preventing anticompetitive behavior, including, but not limited to, predatory pricing.
- (3) The commission shall, upon request, arbitrate and enforce interconnection agreements pursuant to 47 U.S.C. ss. 251

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and 252 and the Federal Communications Commission's orders and regulations implementing those sections. The commission has the authority to resolve disputes among carriers concerning violations of this chapter and under the authority conferred by federal law to resolve such disputes, including, but not limited to, federal law addressing resale of services, local interconnection, unbundling, number portability, dialing parity, access to rights-of-way, access to poles and conduits, and reciprocal compensation. However, this section does not confer jurisdiction on the commission for services that are exempt from commission jurisdiction under ss. 364.011 or 364.013. Additionally, a competitive local exchange telecommunications company is entitled to interconnection with a local exchange telecommunications company to transmit and route voice traffic between both the competitive local exchange telecommunications company and the local exchange telecommunications company regardless of the technology by which the voice traffic is originated by and terminated to an end user. The commission shall afford the competitive local exchange telecommunications company all substantive and procedural rights available to such companies regarding interconnection under the law.

(4) A telecommunications company may not knowingly deliver traffic, for which terminating access service charges would otherwise apply, through a local interconnection arrangement without paying the appropriate charges for such terminating access service. Any party having a substantial interest may petition the commission for an investigation of any suspected violation of this subsection. If a telecommunications company

The commission may by rule establish 29 criteria for payment of the regulatory assessment fee on an 30 annual basis rather than on a semiannual basis.

- (2) By August 1, 2011, the commission must begin rulemaking to reduce the regulatory assessment fee for telecommunications companies under s. 350.113 and this section, as required to reflect the reduction in regulation resulting from the amendments to ch. 364 that take effect on July 1, 2011. The reduced fee shall be applied beginning with payments due in January 2012 on revenues for the preceding 6-month period. The commission's consideration of the required amount of the reduction to the regulatory assessment fee must include, but is not limited to:
- (a) The regulatory activities that are no longer required, and the number of staff currently assigned to such activities.
- (b) The number of staff necessary to carry out the reduced level of regulatory responsibilities, based on reductions in workload for the staff in the Division of Regulatory Analysis, the Office of Auditing and Performance Analysis, and the Division of Service, Safety and Consumer Assistance.

The presidential preference primary shall be held in each year the number of which is a multiple of four.

- (b) Each political party other than a minor political party shall, on the date selected by the Presidential Preference Primary Date Selection Committee last Tuesday in January in each year the number of which is a multiple of 4, elect one person to be the candidate for nomination of such party for President of the United States or select delegates to the national nominating convention, as provided by party rule.
- (2) (a) There shall be a Presidential Candidate Selection Committee composed of the Secretary of State, who shall be a nonvoting chair; the Speaker of the House of Representatives; the President of the Senate; and the minority leader of each house of the Legislature; and the chair of each political party required to have a presidential preference primary under this section.

(b) By October 31 of the year preceding the presidential preference primary, each political party shall submit to the Secretary of State a list of its presidential candidates to be placed on the presidential preference primary ballot or candidates entitled to have delegates appear on the presidential preference primary ballot. The Secretary of State shall prepare and publish a list of the names of the presidential candidates submitted not later than on the first Tuesday after the first
