Amendment (with title amendment)

Remove lines 58-76 and insert:

- (4) (a) On or after July 1, 2011, a unit of government that enters into a contract or employment agreement, or renewal or renegotiation of an existing contract or employment agreement, that contains a provision for severance pay with an officer, agent, employee, or contractor must include the following provisions in the contract:
- 1. A requirement that severance pay provided may not exceed an amount greater than 20 weeks of compensation, unless the unit of government approves the contract or employment agreement, or renewal or renegotiation of a contract or employment agreement, by a two-thirds vote of the membership of the approving body of the unit of government.
 - 2. A prohibition of provision of severance pay when the

- officer, agent, employee, or contractor has been fired for misconduct, as defined in s. 443.036(29), by the unit of government.
 - (b) Notwithstanding paragraph (a), on or after July 1, 2011, an officer, agent, employee, or contractor may receive severance pay if:
 - 1. The severance pay is paid from wholly private funds, the payment and receipt of which do not otherwise violate part III of chapter 112;
 - 2. The severance pay is administered under part II of chapter 112 on behalf of an agency outside this state and would be permitted under that agency's personnel system.

Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Subsection (3) of section 175.032, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

175.032 Definitions.—For any municipality, special fire control district, chapter plan, local law municipality, local law special fire control district, or local law plan under this chapter, the following words and phrases have the following meanings:

(3) "Compensation" or "salary" means, for noncollectively bargained service earned before July 1, 2011, or for service earned under collective bargaining agreements in place before July 1, 2011, the fixed monthly remuneration paid a firefighter.

Amendment to Amendment (Strike-All Amendment) by Representatives Patronis and Mayfield

Between lines 285 and 286 and between lines 553 and 554, insert:

(e) Each plan sponsor must establish a defined contribution supplemental plan by October 1, 2011. However, the plan sponsor of any plan established by special act of the Legislature has until July 1, 2012, to create a defined contribution supplemental plan. The defined contribution supplemental plan shall be funded as provided in paragraph (d), subject to the provisions of any collective bargaining agreement in effect on July 1, 2011.
