19 (b) COUNTIES; COUNTY SEATS; MUNICIPALITIES; DISTRICTS.
 20 The status of the following items as they exist on the date this
 21 article becomes effective is recognized and shall be continued
 22 until changed in accordance with law: the counties of the state;

23 their status with respect to the legality of the sale of
24 intoxicating liquors, wines and beers; the method of selection
25 of county officers; the performance of municipal functions by
26 county officers; the county seats; and the municipalities and
27 special districts of the state, their powers, jurisdiction and
28 government.

29 (c) OFFICERS TO CONTINUE IN OFFICE. Every person holding
30 office when this article becomes effective shall continue in
31 office for the remainder of the term if that office is not
32 abolished. If the office is abolished the incumbent shall be
33 paid adequate compensation, to be fixed by law, for the loss of
34 emoluments for the remainder of the term.

35 (d) ORDINANCES. Local laws relating only to
36 unincorporated areas of a county on the effective date of this
37 article may be amended or repealed by county ordinance.

38 (e) CONSOLIDATION AND HOME RULE. Article VIII, Sections
39 9, 10, 11 and 24, of the Constitution of 1885, as amended, shall
40 remain in full force and effect as to each county affected, as
41 if this article had not been adopted, until that county shall
42 expressly adopt a charter or home rule plan pursuant to this
43 article. All provisions of the Miami-Dade Metropolitan Dade
44 County Home Rule Charter, heretofore or hereafter adopted by the
45 electors of Miami-Dade Dade County pursuant to Article VIII,
46 Section 11, of the Constitution of 1885, as amended, shall be
47 valid, and any amendments to such charter shall be valid;
48 provided that the said provisions of such charter and the said
49 amendments thereto are authorized under said Article VIII,
50 Section 11, of the Constitution of 1885, as amended. However,
51 notwithstanding any provision of Article VIII, Section 11, of
52 the Constitution of 1885, as amended, or any limitations under
53 this subsection, the Miami-Dade County Home Rule Charter may be

55 Miami-Dade County and, if approved, shall be deemed an amendment

59 member of that delegation.

60 (f) DADE COUNTY; POWERS CONFERRED UPON MUNICIPALITIES. To
61 the extent not inconsistent with the powers of existing
62 municipalities or general law, the Metropolitan Government of
63 Miami-Dade ~~Da~~de County may exercise all the powers conferred now
64 or hereafter by general law upon municipalities.

65 (g) DELETION OF OBSOLETE SCHEDULE ITEMS. The legislature
66 shall have power, by joint resolution, to delete from this

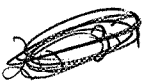

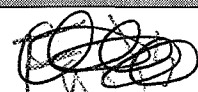
