Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Section 768.81, Florida Statutes, is amended to read:

768.81 Comparative fault.-

- (1) <u>DEFINITIONS</u> <u>DEFINITION</u>.—As used in this section, <u>the</u> term:
- (a) "Accident" means the events and actions that relate to the incident as well as those events and actions that relate to the alleged defect or injuries, including enhanced injuries.
- (b) "Economic damages" means past lost income and future lost income reduced to present value; medical and funeral expenses; lost support and services; replacement value of lost personal property; loss of appraised fair market value of real property; costs of construction repairs, including labor, overhead, and profit; and any other economic loss that which

Amendment No. 1 would not have occurred but for the injury giving rise to the cause of action.

- (c) "Negligence action" means, without limitation, a civil action for damages based upon a theory of negligence, strict liability, products liability, professional malpractice whether couched in terms of contract or tort, or breach of warranty and like theories. The substance of an action, not conclusory terms used by a party, determines whether an action is a negligence action.
- (d) "Products liability action" means a civil action based upon a theory of strict liability, negligence, breach of warranty, nuisance, or similar theories for damages caused by the manufacture, construction, design, formulation, installation, preparation, or assembly of a product. The term includes an action alleging that injuries received by a claimant in an accident were greater than the injuries the claimant would have received but for a defective product. The substance of an action, not the conclusory terms used by a party, determines whether an action is a products liability action.
- (2) EFFECT OF CONTRIBUTORY FAULT.—In a negligence an action to which this section applies, any contributory fault chargeable to the claimant diminishes proportionately the amount awarded as economic and noneconomic damages for an injury attributable to the claimant's contributory fault, but does not bar recovery.
- (3) APPORTIONMENT OF DAMAGES.—In <u>a negligence action</u> cases to which this section applies, the court shall enter judgment against each party liable on the basis of such party's

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percentage of fault and not on the basis of the doctrine of joint and several liability.

- In order to allocate any or all fault to a nonparty, (a)1. a defendant must affirmatively plead the fault of a nonparty and, absent a showing of good cause, identify the nonparty, if known, or describe the nonparty as specifically as practicable, either by motion or in the initial responsive pleading when defenses are first presented, subject to amendment any time before trial in accordance with the Florida Rules of Civil Procedure.
- 2.(b) In order to allocate any or all fault to a nonparty and include the named or unnamed nonparty on the verdict form for purposes of apportioning damages, a defendant must prove at trial, by a preponderance of the evidence, the fault of the nonparty in causing the plaintiff's injuries.
- (b) In a products liability action alleging that injuries received by a claimant in an accident were enhanced by a defective product, the trier of fact shall consider the fault of all persons who contributed to the accident when apportioning fault between or among them. The jury shall be appropriately instructed by the trial judge on the apportionment of fault in products liability actions where there are allegations that the injuries received by the claimant in an accident were enhanced by a defective product. The rules of evidence apply to these actions.
 - (4)APPLICABILITY.-
- (a) This section applies to negligence cases. For purposes of this section, "negligence cases" includes, but is not limited

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to, civil actions for damages based upon theories of negligence, strict liability, products liability, professional malpractice whether couched in terms of contract or tort, or breach of warranty and like theories. In determining whether a case falls within the term "negligence cases," the court shall look to the substance of the action and not the conclusory terms used by the parties.

This section does not apply to any action brought by any person to recover actual economic damages resulting from pollution, to any action based upon an intentional tort, or to any cause of action as to which application of the doctrine of joint and several liability is specifically provided by chapter 403, chapter 498, chapter 517, chapter 542, or chapter 895.

MEDICAL MALPRACTICE.—Notwithstanding anything in law to the contrary, in an action for damages for personal injury or wrongful death arising out of medical malpractice, whether in contract or tort, if when an apportionment of damages pursuant to this section is attributed to a teaching hospital as defined in s. 408.07, the court shall enter judgment against the teaching hospital on the basis of such party's percentage of fault and not on the basis of the doctrine of joint and several liability.

Section 2. The Legislature intends that this act be applied retroactively and overrule D'Amario v. Ford Motor Co., 806 So. 2d 424 (Fla. 2001), which adopted what the Florida Supreme Court acknowledged to be a minority view. That minority view fails to apportion fault for damages consistent with Florida's statutory comparative fault system, codified in s.

Bill No. CS/HB 201 (2011)

Amendment No. 1

768.81, Florida Statutes, and leads to inequitable and unfair results, regardless of the damages sought in the litigation. The Legislature finds that, in a products liability action as defined in this act, fault should be apportioned among all responsible persons.

Section 3. This act is remedial in nature and applies retroactively. The Legislature finds that the retroactive application of this act does not unconstitutionally impair vested rights. Rather, the law affects only remedies, permitting recovery against all tortfeasors while lessening the ultimate liability of each consistent with this state's statutory comparative fault system, codified in s. 768.81, Florida Statutes. In all cases, the Legislature intends that this act be construed consistent with the due process provisions of the State Constitution and the Constitution of the United States.

Section 4. This act shall take effect upon becoming a law.

Remove everything after the enacting clause and insert: Section 1. Eyewitness identification.-

- (1) SHORT TITLE.—This section may be cited as the "2011 Eyewitness Identification Policies Act."
- (2) The Legislature believes that it is critical to establish appropriate standards for the effective administration of live lineups and photo arrays in an effort to promote accurate and reliable eyewitness identification and to minimize the possibility of erroneous eyewitness identifications.
- (3) Each state and local law enforcement agency in Florida shall establish and implement written policies and procedures addressing eyewitness identification. The policies and procedures must include, at a minimum, the following:

- (a) A description of how live lineups and photo lineups will be created and conducted to maintain the neutrality and impartiality of the lineup process.
- (b) A standard set of instructions that the witness must be given before reviewing the live lineup or photo array that includes the following:
- 1. The person of interest might or might not be in the lineup or photo array;
 - 2. The witness does not have to make an identification;
- 3. It is as important to exclude innocent persons as it is to identify the perpetrators; and
- 4. The investigation will continue with or without an identification.
- (c) A description of how an eyewitness will indicate that a positive identification has been made.
- (d) A description of how an eyewitness will acknowledge receipt of the instructions outlined in paragraph (b).
- (e) A description of any other documentation requirements deemed necessary by the agency to conduct live lineups or photo arrays.
- (4) Each state and local law enforcement agency must submit such policies and procedures to its respective State Attorney by November 1, 2011. Every State Attorney shall maintain the policies and procedures submitted to them.
- (5) By July 1, 2011, the Florida Prosecuting Attorneys

 Association shall develop draft jury instructions regarding

 evaluating eyewitness identification testimony in criminal cases

Amendment No. 1 and forward such jury instructions to the Supreme Court Committee for consideration.

(6) The Criminal Justice Standards and Training Commission, in consultation with the Florida Department of Law Enforcement, shall create educational materials and make available to state and local law enforcement agencies training programs regarding the minimum standards for eyewitness identification procedures and practices described in subsection (3). Each state and local law enforcement agency shall provide eyewitness identification procedures training to its law enforcement personnel.

Section 2. This act shall take effect July 1, 2011.
