The maximum scholarship granted for an eligible student with disabilities shall be equivalent to the base student allocation in the Florida Education Finance Program multiplied by the appropriate cost factor for the educational program that would have been provided for the student in the district school to which he or she was assigned, multiplied by the district cost differential.

152 2. In addition, a share of the guaranteed allocation for 153 exceptional students shall be determined and added to the amount 154 in subparagraph 1. The calculation shall be based on the 155 methodology and the data used to calculate the guaranteed 156 allocation for exceptional students for each district in chapter 157 2000-166, Laws of Florida. Except as provided in subparagraphs 158 3. and 4., the calculation shall be based on the student's 159 grade, matrix level of services, and the difference between the

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160 2000-2001 basic program and the appropriate level of services 161 cost factor, multiplied by the 2000-2001 base student allocation 162 and the 2000-2001 district cost differential for the sending 163 district. The calculated amount shall include the per-student 164 share of supplemental academic instruction funds, instructional 165 materials funds, technology funds, and other categorical funds 166 as provided in the General Appropriations Act.

3. The scholarship amount for a student who is eligible under sub-subparagraph (2)(a)2.b. shall be calculated as provided in subparagraphs 1. and 2. However, the calculation shall be based on the school district in which the parent resides at the time of the scholarship request.

4. Until the school district completes the matrix required by paragraph (5)(b), the calculation shall be based on the matrix that assigns the student to support level I of service as it existed prior to the 2000-2001 school year. When the school district completes the matrix, the amount of the payment shall be adjusted as needed.
