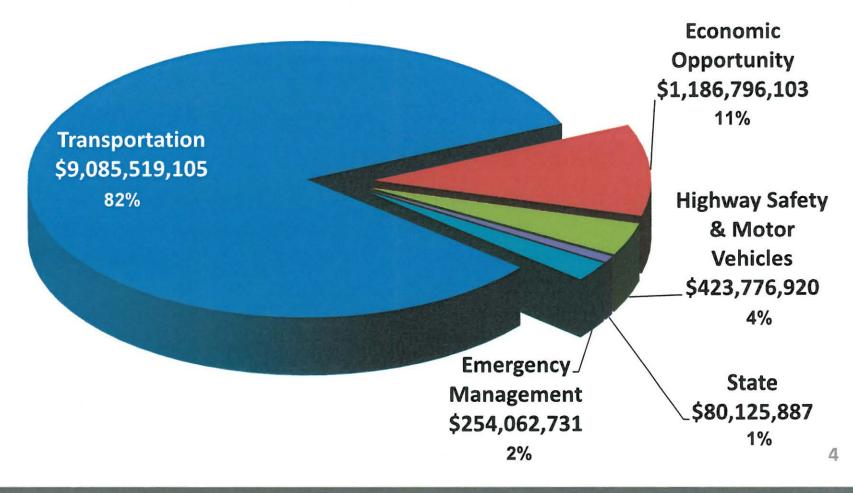

Total Budget - \$11.0 Billion

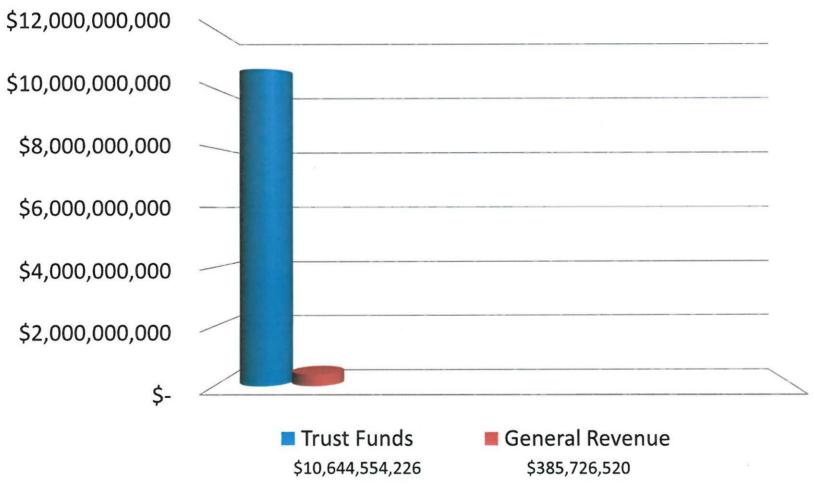
Fiscal Year 2013-14





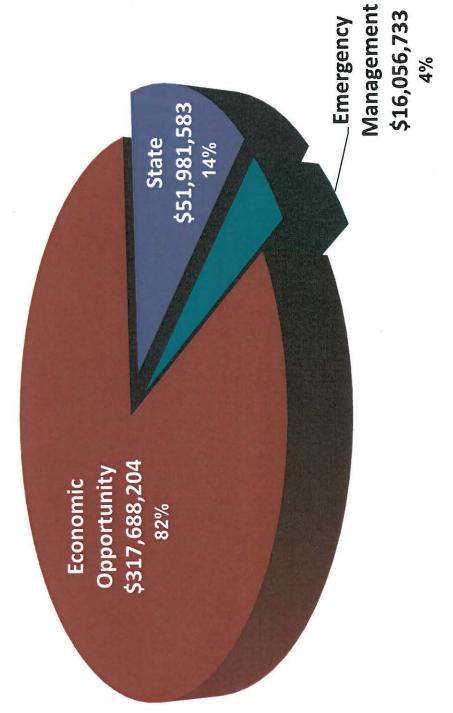
Transportation and Economic Development General Revenue/Trust Fund

- \$31.5 Million Increase in VISIT Florida Funding Level (\$75 Million Total)
- \$16 Million Increase Space Florida Funding Level (\$20 Million Total)
- \$3 Million Establish and Market a Florida Statewide Business Brand
- \$6 Million– Increase Quick Response Training Funding Level (\$12.0 Million Total)
- \$48 Million Small Cities Community Development and Weatherization Programs
- \$50 Million Affordable Housing / State Housing Initiatives Partnership Program



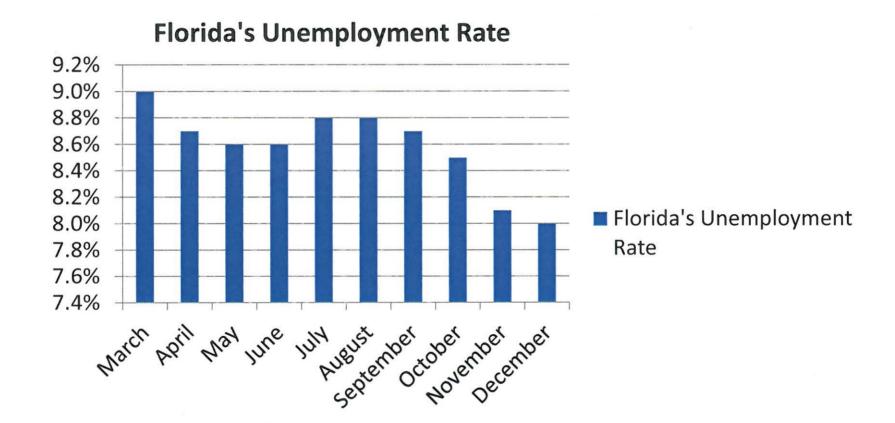
Focus on Job Growth and Retention

Change how we use existing programs that attract new businesses.

- Consolidate funding for incentive programs to provide the flexibility to tailor state incentives to the needs of new and existing businesses that create jobs and grow our economy - \$105 Million
- Reserve \$173.7 Million in flexible funds to allow the state to react to economic opportunities
- Increase incentive funding from \$111.1 Million in FY 2012–13 to \$278.7 Million in FY 2013–14
- Retain the existing requirements that govern the use of the incentives Enterprise Florida, Inc., required to submit each year a detailed Incentive Performance Report.
- Implementation of the Economic Development Incentives Portal

\$423.8 Million

- \$11.3 Million Florida Highway Patrol Pursuit Vehicles
- \$15 Million Replace Computer Aided Dispatch and Records Management Systems in the Florida Highway Patrol
- \$787,275 Replace Regional Communication Center Telephone Systems
- \$4.9 Million Motorist Services Programs Modernization
- \$3.8 Million Critical Safety Repairs Statewide



Department of State

\$80.1 Million

- \$20.2 Million State Aid to Libraries
- \$1 Million Library Cooperative Grants
- \$3.9 Million Cultural, Museum and Historic Preservation Grants
- \$2 Million Support for Federal Elections
- \$2.75 Million Maintenance and Repairs to the Grove
- \$500,000 Department–wide Litigation Expenses
- \$350,000 Florida Humanities Council



Department of Transportation

\$9.1 Billion

- \$8.3 Billion Transportation Work Program
 - → Funds Maintenance, Enhancement and Expansion of the State's Transportation System
 - → Includes Funding for Seaports, Airports, Transit Systems, railways, roadways, etc.
- \$773 Million Operations, Administration and Support Services
- \$112.4 Million Transportation Disadvantaged Services
- \$4.8 Million Fixed Capital Outlay Maintenance and Repairs
- (\$8.9 Million, 204 FTE) Department-wide Savings Due to Efficiencies and Restructuring; Includes Reduction of 204 Vacant Positions



Department of Military Affairs

\$76.7 Million

- \$15 Million Repair National Guard Armories
- \$2.0 Million for About Face and Forward March Program
- \$1.3 Million for Camp Blanding and Youth Challenge Program Equipment
- \$1.0 Million Design of Automated Infantry Squad Battle Course and Fire Range
