Faith and Character Programs

History

In November of 1999 the Department and Horizon opened Florida's first Faith-Based Dormitory Program at Tomoka Correctional Institution. The program started with 64 inmates.

It was based on the following premises:

- Religious programs attract inmate participation
 Religion assists inmate with institutional adjustment
 Faith based programs help develop new value systems

39,470 inmates have participated in the program as of 6/30/13.








Gadsden Re-Entry Center
