- (b) If the law enforcement agency first obtains a search warrant signed by a judge authorizing the use of a drone.
- (c) If the law enforcement agency possesses reasonable suspicion that, under particular circumstances, swift action is needed to prevent imminent danger to life or serious damage to property, to forestall the imminent escape of a suspect or the destruction of evidence, or to achieve purposes including, but not limited to, facilitating the search for a missing person.
  - (5) REMEDIES FOR VIOLATION. -
- $\underline{(a)}$  An aggrieved party may initiate a civil action against a law enforcement agency to obtain all appropriate relief in order to prevent or remedy a violation of paragraph  $\underline{(3)(a)}$  this act.
- (b)1. The owner, tenant, or occupant of privately owned or occupied real property may initiate a civil action for compensatory damages for violations of paragraph (3)(b) and may seek injunctive relief to prevent future violations of paragraph (3)(b) against a person, state agency, or political subdivision that violates paragraph (3)(b). In such action, the prevailing party is entitled to recover reasonable attorney fees from the nonprevailing party based on the actual and reasonable time expended by his or her attorney billed at an appropriate hourly rate and, in cases in which the payment of such a fee is contingent on the outcome, without a multiplier, unless the action is tried to verdict, in which case a multiplier of up to

If the child is acquitted of all charged offenses or lesser included offenses contained in the original case transferred to adult court, any felony cases that were transferred to adult court under this subsection shall be subject to the same penalties such cases were subject to before being transferred to adult court.

If the court receives such a notice from the state attorney, or if the grand jury fails to act within the 21-day period, the court may proceed as otherwise authorized under this part.
