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As you are aware, the St. Lucie County Fire District is pursuing a change to its Charter (HB 785) and has garnered the support of our Local Legislative delegation and each Committee of the Legislature that has heard it. The merits of the proposal are both reasonable and sound, but I have provided a summary of actions that address the concerns raised in our conference call.

- The District's borrowing power has not been addressed in 20 years. An adjustment is long overdue to proportional recognize the cost of equipment and capital items as compared to the current budget. The \$1.5 million value established in 1996 was approximately 10 percent of the District's \$17 million budget. The proposed Charter change keeps the same ratio 10 percent of the District's operating budget (or \$6.5 million of our \$65 million budget). As a measure of control, the 10 percent ratio is established in the proposed language as a maximum cap. Additional control measures include requiring a supermajority vote of the Fire Board of Commissioners to use that borrowing power and a restriction that prohibits borrowing for operational expenses (salaries, benefits, staffing, etc.).
- The costs for fire engines have nearly doubled in the past 20 years. The District is currently working to re-implement a viable Vehicle Replacement Plan and Capital Improvement Plan that the increased borrowing authority would facilitate. This bill is specifically about planning for the needs of our community to provide for:
 - o The replacement of 42 pieces of frontline apparatus including fire engines and rescue trucks over the next 5 years. Those replacement costs total \$13 million.
 - The replacement of 2 existing fire stations built in the 1970's that have exceeded their useful service life. Those replacement costs total \$5 million. One of those stations is situated on the busiest 6 lane roadway in Port St. Lucie and stopping east and west bound traffic to back into the station is unsafe for our firefighters and residents.
 - Because the District is at its current millage cap, any debt service from the use of the increased borrowing authority would be allocated from current Ad Valorem revenues.

The attached vehicle replacement plan provides the year of manufacture of the vehicles needing replacement. Some are nearly 20 years old and must be replaced for the safety of our residents and visitors. Yet under the current Charter we have insufficient borrowing authority to replace more than 2 fire engines. In addition to being detrimental to the community in terms of emergency response, the inability to provide for equipment replacement could substantial effect the fire insurance premium rates of St. Lucie County taxpayers.

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- The District's current Insurance Services Office (ISO)/ Public Protection Classification rating is a 3 on a 10 scale (1 being the best and 10 being the worst). The District was last graded in 2010 and received a score of 70.99 a score below 70 would drops the PPC rating. The inability to replace one or more of our frontline engines or quints could cost the average taxpayer between \$200 and \$2000 annually depending on the value of their home a reversal of what we achieved in 2010.
- o The District will be re-evaluated by ISO in late August of 2016.
- The need to address our borrowing authority has been created by increased demand for Fire and Emergency Services over the last 20 years. Our calls for service (48,022 in 2015) have been increasing at an annual average of 4.8 percent per year for the last 24 years. During that same span, our population has gone from roughly 180,000 residents to 290,000.

In short, the proposed changes represent a reasonable approach to address the Fire District's need for realistic and proportionate borrowing authority, in order to maintain quality fire and emergency medical services to our residents and visitors. Sufficient controls have been included to protect the taxpayers interests and fulfill our local government's fiduciary obligations. We are not asking for an open checkbook or rampant spending increases. We are asking for prudent assistance in our planning efforts to meet our community's needs. Based on the above, the Fire District would genuinely appreciate your support and assistance in this matter.
