Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles

Our Mission: "Providing Highway Safety and Security Through Excellence in Service, Education, and Enforcement".

Composed of Four Divisions: Florida Highway Patrol, Motorist Services, Administrative Services, and Information Systems Administration.

4,414 Full Time Employees, includes 1974 sworn Law Enforcement Officers.



What We Do

- License more than 15 million drivers and issue ID cards to over 2 million Floridians.
- Register 19 million vehicle & vessels annually.
- Patrol more than 85,000 miles of highways daily to keep residents and visitors safe on the roads (31 million miles annually).
- Provide traffic data and statistics to law enforcement entities, other state and local agencies and academic institutions.






Fiscal Year 2014-15 Budget

Highlights from 2014 Legislative Session

- Motor vehicles registration fee reduction
- Re-design of license plates for military veterans
- Increased penalty for drivers who leave the scene of an accident "Aaron Cohen Life Protection Act"
- "Move Over" law revised to include utility and sanitation vehicles
- "Sexual Predator" printed on DL/ID for individuals designated as sexual predators.
- Child Restraint Law revised to increase age children required to be in booster seat.
- Added four new Specialty License Plates





Managing Florida's Waterways



- State law assigns responsibility to the State/FWC for:
 - Waterway management
 - Boating safety program
- Limited authority is granted to local governments:
 - Boating safety speed zones
 - Derelict vessel/debris removal






Oversight of Florida's Boating Advisory Council

- Created in statute to advise FWC on boating related matters
- 18 members, Governor appoints 11; Speaker and Senate President appoint 1 each
 - Representatives from boating public, scuba diving, canoe/kayak, commercial fishing, commercial vessel operators, marine manufacturers, marine industries, marine special events, environmental groups, manatee protection, Inland Navigation Districts, US Coast Guard Auxiliary, US Power Squadrons, DEP and FWC





Anchoring and Mooring Pilot Program

 Allows 5 local governments to test options for managing anchored/moored boats

St. Augustine, Stuart/Martin County, Monroe County, Sarasota, and
 St. Petersburg

FWC is working with boating

and local government interests to find solutions to various anchoring issues
