 7 Be It Enacted by the Legislature of the State of Florida:

 9 Section 1. Subsection (28) of section 403.703, Florida
 10 Statutes, is amended to read:

11 403.703 Definitions.—As used in this part, the term:
 12 (28) "Recovered materials" means metal, paper, glass,
 13 plastic, textile, ~~or~~ rubber, wood, asphalt, or concrete
 14 materials that have known recycling potential, can be feasibly
 15 recycled, and have been diverted and source separated or have
 16 been removed from the solid waste stream for sale, use, or reuse
 17 as raw materials, whether or not the materials require
 18 subsequent processing or separation from each other, but the
 19 term does not include materials destined for any use that
 20 constitutes disposal. Recovered materials as described in this
 21 subsection are not solid waste. For the purposes of this
 22 definition, "wood" does not include wood treated or coated with
 23 chemicals to resist decomposition or vegetative matter resulting
 24 from landscaping maintenance or land clearing operations that
 25 includes materials such as tree and shrub trimmings, grass
