BILLS AND JOINT RESOLUTIONS ON THIRD READING

HB 7087 by Jobs & Entrepreneurship Council, Carroll
(Similar CS/SB 2084, Compare HB 441)

Financial Services; Defines term "guaranteed asset protection product"; authorizes certain entities to offer optional guaranteed asset protection products under certain circumstances; includes debt cancellation products under casualty insurance; requires that state-funded endowments be maintained in trust accounts in certain state banks; authorizes financial institutions to offer debt cancellation products, etc. Effective Date: October 1, 2007.

Read second time and amended April 24

HB 7127 by Government Efficiency & Accountability Council, Attkisson (Identical SB 1492)

OGSR/Public Employee Optional Retirement Program/DMS/SBA; Removes scheduled repeal under Open Government Sunset Review Act of exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information of participant in Public Employee Optional Retirement Program contained in FRS records held by SBA or DMS; makes editorial changes; removes unnecessary provisions. Effective Date: October 1, 2007.

HB 7159 by Jobs & Entrepreneurship Council, Reagan, Murzin (Similar CS/SB 630)

Pub. Rec./Lifeline Assistance Plan; Creates exemption from public records requirements for personal identifying information of participant in telecommunications carrier's Lifeline Assistance Plan held by PSC; provides exception; provides penalty for intentional disclosure of confidential & exempt information by officer or employee of telecommunications carrier; provides for review & repeal; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: upon becoming a law.

Read second time and amended April 24

CS/HB 721 by Schools & Learning Council, Proctor, Legg
(Similar CS/SB 2102)

Tax on Sales, Use, and Other Transactions; Exempts payments to postsecondary educational institutions made for bookstore operations. Effective Date: upon becoming a law and

shall operate retroactively to amounts paid on or after January 1, 2006.

CS/HB 1115 by Healthcare Council, Kreegel, Porth
(Compare CS/SB 1882, CS/SB 2354)

Health Care Clinic Act; Revises definition of term "clinic" to exclude entity that provides certain neonatal or pediatric health care services from licensure requirements; provides that pt. X of ch. 400, F.S., does not apply to certain clinical facilities owned by publicly traded corporations. Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

Labor Organizations; Designates act "Florida Highway Patrol Sergeant Nicholas Sottile Act"; requires that officers of certain state law enforcement agencies be in separate bargaining unit. Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

HB 7203 by Economic Expansion & Infrastructure Council, Cannon, Kravitz (Compare CS/CS/HB 985, CS/CS/SB 780, CS/SB 800, CS/CS/SB 1928, SB 2074)

Growth Management; Revises various provisions of law relating to growth management, local government comprehensive plans, transportation concurrency, & amendments to comprehensive plans; authorizes counties & municipalities to create transportation concurrency backlog authorities for specified purposes; provides requirements for transportation concurrency backlog plans; provides for trust funds funded by ad valorem tax revenues; provides for pilot program exempting specified areas from state land planning agency comprehensive plan compliance review requirements; provides for requirements for plan adoption & plan amendments in such areas; extends development-of-regional-impact phase & buildout dates for certain projects under construction; provides that such extensions are not substantial deviations & do not subject such projects to further review. Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

HB 1199 by Nelson, Zapata (Identical SB 1416)

Tax on Sales, Use, and Other Transactions; Expands exemption for electricity used for specified agricultural purposes. Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

Read second time April 25

CS/HB 981 by Environment & Natural Resources Council, Culp (Compare CS/SB 94, CS/CS/CS/SB 2054)

State Parks; Requires certain rule violations of Division of Recreation & Parks of DEP to be punishable as noncriminal infractions & others to be punishable as misdemeanor of second degree; provides penalties; requires fines be deposited in State Park Trust Fund & funds be used for state parks; authorizes charge of half price fees for use of parks by active National Guard members & families; authorizes operation of golf carts on certain state park roads; authorizes use of golf carts & utility vehicles on certain roads. Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

CS/HB 7151 by Policy & Budget Council, Schools & Learning Council, Pickens, Grant, Zapata (Compare CS/HB 7081, CS/HB 7155, CS/SB 1046, CS/SB 1234, CS/SB 1238, SB 2258)

Education; Requires State Board of Education to systematically replace Sunshine State Standards with World Class Education Standards; requires expedited alignment of FCAT to standards; provides for distinguished-honors notation on high school diplomas & proficiency designation for FCAT achievement; requires district plans for world-language curricula & policy for accelerated learning; requires end-of-course exams; requires professional development inservice activities; requires OPPAGA reports on after-school programs, gifted student education, & state-level governance of early learning programs & child care regulation; creates Public-Private Partnering Task Force within DMS; provides appropriation. Effective Date: July 1, 2007 except as otherwise provided

HB 1421 by Brisé (Identical SB 2304)

Digital Divide Council; Recreates Digital Divide Council in DOE; provides membership, terms, objectives, & duties of council. Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

Read second time April 25

CS/HB 287 by Schools & Learning Council, Flores, Bucher, Kiar, Richardson, Roberson, Traviesa, Zapata (Similar CS/SB 848, Identical CS/SB 2140, Compare HB 881)

First Generation Matching Grant Programs; Clarifies provisions relating to eligibility for receipt of grant under program for state universities; revises provisions relating to allocation & reallocation of funds; provides duties of institutions participating in program; creates matching grant programs for community colleges & for certain independent colleges & universities; provides for financial aid to eligible undergraduate students who demonstrate financial need & whose parents have not earned baccalaureate or higher degrees; provides for appropriation, allocation, & distribution of funds; provides eligibility criteria. Effective Date: upon becoming a law.

CS/HB 645 by Policy & Budget Council, Hays, Adams, Carroll, Gibson, H., Harrell, McKeel, Nelson, Precourt, Proctor, Zapata (Compare CS/SB 680)

Growth Management; Revises eligibility criteria for High Growth District Capital Outlay Assistance Grant Program; revises provisions for allocating funds provided by GAA to Public Education Capital Outlay & Debt Service Trust Fund. Effective Date: upon becoming a law.

Read second time and amended April 25

CS/HB 643 by Schools & Learning Council, Gibson, H. (Identical CS/SB 428)

Safety at School Bus Stops; Requires each school district to have plan to improve safety at school bus stops. Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

Read second time April 25

CS/CS/HB 967 by Policy & Budget Council, Schools & Learning Council, Weatherford, Brandenburg, Ford, Galvano, Hasner, Hooper, Kendrick, McKeel, Traviesa (Compare CS/CS/SB 2746)

Physical Education; Requires Commissioner of Education to dedicate resources to provide professional development to physical education teachers & curricula developers; requires district school boards to provide specified physical education for certain students; requires State Board of Education to review & revise Sunshine State Standards related to physical education. Effective Date: upon becoming a law.

Read second time and amended April 25

CS/HB 1575 by Healthcare Council, Coley (Compare CS/SB 424)

Health Care; Revises purpose & functions of Rural Health Office in DOH; requires Secretary of Health & Secretary of AHCA to appoint advisory council to advise said office; revises legislative findings & intent regarding rural health networks; specifies purposes of capital improvement grants for rural hospitals; provides for DOH to award grants to rural hospitals; creates Office of Minority Health in DOH; requires Legislative Committee on Intergovernmental Relations to award contract for study concerning replacing or changing use of certain rural hospitals. Effective Date: July 1, 2007, only if specific appropriations are made in the General Appropriations Act for fiscal year 2007-2008 to the Department of Health to fund rural health network infrastructure implementation and the rural hospital capital improvement grant program.

CS/CS/HB 1309 by Policy & Budget Council, Healthcare Council, Galvano, Culp (Compare CS/CS/SB 1388, SB 2030, SB 2876)

Adoption and Child Protection; Renames Office of Child Abuse Prevention as Office of Adoption and Child Protection; provides for Chief Child Advocate; provides duties & responsibilities of office & advocate; provides for promotion of adoption & support of adoptive families in office's state plan; authorizes office to establish direct-support organization; provides adoption assistance program for children within child welfare system; provides adoption assistance in form of maintenance subsidies, subject to specific appropriations; provides appropriations. Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

CS/HB 177 by Jobs & Entrepreneurship Council, Cretul (Compare CS/SB 2094)

Health Insurance; Revises definition of "bone marrow transplant"; requires identification card containing specified information be given insureds under health benefit plans & group health insurance policies & persons having health care services through health maintenance contracts. Effective Date: January 1, 2008, and shall apply to identification cards issued for policies or certificates issued or renewed on or after that date.

Read second time and amended April 25

CS/HB 397 by Healthcare Council, Anderson, Legg, Nehr, Richardson, Sachs, Zapata (Similar CS/SB 434)

Caregivers for Adults; Authorizes DEA to create pilot program in Pasco & Pinellas Counties to train persons to act as companions & provide certain services to frail adults in community; specifies additional purposes of pilot program; requires evaluation & report to Legislature; provides appropriation. Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

Read second time April 25

CS/CS/HB 1477 by Policy & Budget Council, Healthcare Council, Ausley, Bucher, Chestnut, Galvano, Harrell, Hooper, Jenne, Patronis, Roberson, Williams, Zapata (Compare CS/CS/HB 665, CS/CS/SB 542)

Forensic Mental Health; Creates Criminal Justice, Mental Health, & Substance Abuse Reinvestment Grant Program in DCFS; authorizes counties to apply for planning, implementation, or expansion grant; requires that all records & meetings be open to public; prohibits county from using grant funds to supplant existing funding; expands ex officio membership of Substance Abuse and Mental Health Corporation; creates Criminal Justice, Mental Health, & Substance Abuse Technical Assistance Center; limits administrative costs county may charge to grant funds; redefines "qualified practitioner." Effective Date: July 1, 2007, only if a specific appropriation to fund the provisions of the act is made in the General Appropriations Act for fiscal year 2007-2008.

CS/HB 1269 by Healthcare Council, Reed, Harrell, Richardson, Zapata (Similar SB 2120)

Infant Mortality; Provides legislative intent relating to black infant health practice initiative; provides for administration of initiative; requires local community to develop team to serve as part of statewide practice collaborative; requires healthy start coalitions to conduct case reviews; requires certain public universities or colleges to provide technical assistance, assist in determining certain criteria, & present findings & recommendations; requires DOH to distribute funding to coalitions; provides duties of coalitions; requires DOH to award grants & annually evaluate initiative; requires coalitions to submit reports to Governor, Legislature, & DOH; provides immunity from liability to participating coalitions; provides appropriation. Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

Read second time April 25

HB 413 by Garcia, L. (Identical SB 658)

Theft of Property; Provides that threatening to use weapon or firearm during course of robbery is first-degree felony. Effective Date: October 1, 2007.

Read second time April 25

CS/HB 55 by Jobs & Entrepreneurship Council, Porth, Ford, Gibbons, Heller, Richardson, Scionti (Identical CS/CS/SB 188, Compare CS/CS/SB 186)

Domestic Violence; Requires employer to allow employee to take leave from work to undertake activities resulting from act of domestic violence; specifies activities for which employee may take leave; requires employee to notify employer of leave; requires private employer to keep information relating to employee's leave confidential; requires governmental agency to keep such information confidential & exempt to extent authorized by statute; prohibits employer from taking certain actions against employee for exercising rights specified in act; provides recourse for violating act. Effective Date: July 1, 2007.

Read second time April 25

HB 63 by Porth, Gibbons, Richardson (Similar CS/CS/SB 186, Compare CS/CS/SB 188)

Public Records; Exempts from public records requirements certain records & time sheets submitted to agency, as defined in ch. 119, F.S., by employee who is victim of domestic violence; provides for future legislative review and repeal; provides statement of public necessity. Effective Date: on the same date that House Bill 55 or similar legislation takes effect, if such legislation is adopted in the same legislative session, or an extension thereof, and becomes law.

HB 1589 by Mayfield

Indian River County Urban Service Boundary; Grants board of county commissioners authority over adoption of comprehensive land use plans for those areas in county outside specified urban service boundary area; limits circumstances under which urban service boundary area may be modified; provides for transfer of power; provides for referendum subject to extraordinary vote; provides ballot statement. Effective Date: only upon its approval by 60 percent of those qualified electors of the county voting in a referendum held in accordance with section 6, except that this section and section 6 shall take effect upon becoming a law.

CS/CS/HB 1283 by Policy & Budget Council, Economic Expansion & Infrastructure Council, Carroll, Bullard, Gibbons (Similar CS/CS/CS/SB 2860)

Black Business Investment; Revises Florida Black Business Investment Board, Inc. (BBIB) provisions; requires BBIB to contract with OTTED; provides for new appointments; revises powers & duties of board; specifies eligibility of black business investment corporations to participate in Black Business Loan Program; requires OTTED to administer program, certify eligibility, & disburse funds; requires OTTED to adopt

competitive application process; provides loan recipient eligibility requirements; provides black business enterprise eligibility requirements for receiving funds for loans, loan guarantees, or investments; specifies forms in which funds received can be used; revises guarantor program; requires BBIB to adopt policies & procedures & OTTED to adopt rules; establishes a prohibited act & provides for civil action & fine plus attorney and court fees; requires recipients to provide certain reports on use of state funds; requires annual report by BBIB to Governor & Legislature; requires EFI to collaborate with BBIB & OTTED for certain purposes; requires OPPAGA status report to Governor & Legislature on implementation of Florida Black Business Investment Act by OTTED, BBIB & recipients & requires OPPAGA program review.
